- → The aim is to encompass all major stations and Metro stations, ensuring every passenger, regardless of their destination can enjoy safe and healthy food options throughout their journey.




International Big Cat Alliance:

- → Named Melanochlamys droupadi, this distinctive species bears a ruby red spot and has unique characteristics that distinguish it from other sea slugs.

- → Larsen & Toubro (L&T) has achieved a major milestone in clean energy by commissioning its first domestically manufactured electrolyser at the Green Hydrogen Plant in Hazira, Gujarat.
- → This marks the entry of L&T Electrolysers Limited into domestic electrolyser manufacturing, showcasing the company's dedication to advancing sustainable energy solutions.



Institute of Advanced Study in Science and Technology:

- → In a groundbreaking initiative, researchers at the Institute of Advanced Study in Science and Technology (IASST), an autonomous institute affiliated with the Department of Science and Technology, have successfully converted banana pseudo stems—commonly regarded as agricultural waste—into an environmentally friendly wound dressing material.
- → The research team, led by Prof. Devasish Chowdhury and Prof. (Retd) Rajlakshmi Devi, combined banana fibers with biopolymers like chitosan and guar gum to create a multifunctional patch with excellent mechanical strength and antioxidant properties.



Leopard population estimation:

- → Shri Bhupender Yadav, in collaboration with the National Tiger Conservation Authority (NTCA) and Wildlife Institute of India, unveiled the fifth cycle of leopard population estimation in India.
- → The report sheds light on the status and trends of leopard populations across various landscapes amidst escalating threats.
- → India's leopard population is estimated at 13,874, showcasing stability compared to the previous estimate. However, this represents only 70% of leopard habitat, with the Himalayas and semi-arid regions not sampled.






World Seagrass Day:




Exercise Samudra Laksamana:

- → The event featured a rich display of Mizo community traditions and culture, highlighted by traditional songs and captivating cultural dance performances, making it a day-long celebration to remember.




Ministry of Information & Broadcasting:

- → She recently completed eight-week sniper course at Central School of Weapons and Tactics(CSWT) in Indore and achieved 'instructor grade'.




Chettimedu Pathur village:



-> Part A caters to the incentives to the eligible units (₹9,737 crore), and Part B is for implementation and institutional arrangements for the scheme (₹300 crore).





Samudrayaan:

- -> India's Samudrayaan set to explore ocean bed by 2025 end. Samudrayaan, or the deep ocean mission, was initiated in 2021.
- -> The mission entails undertaking a crewed expedition to reach a depth of 6,000 metres to the ocean bed in the central Indian Ocean using Matsya6000, designed to accommodate a crew of three members.





'One Station One Product':

-> Mr. Modi inaugurated 'One Station One Product' stalls in 205 railway stations and a rail coach restaurant at the Central station.

-> The "One Station One Product" initiative by the Indian Railways, which provides uniquely designed sale outlets for locals to sell indigenous products, is now operational at 1,037 stations nationwide.

Gyanesh Kumar and Sukhbir Singh Sandhu:






Human Development Report 2023-2024:

No Smoking Day:



- → The Sangeet Natak Akademi is the apex body in the field of performing arts in India. Established in 1953, it plays a crucial role in the preservation and promotion of the country's vast intangible cultural heritage expressed through music, dance, and drama.





World Consumer Rights Day:

- → World Consumer Rights Day is celebrated annually on March 15 across the globe. This day aims to raise awareness about the rights and responsibilities of consumers in the marketplace.


Electric Mobility Promotion Scheme 2024:

- → The Heavy Industries Ministry has announced the Electric Mobility Promotion Scheme 2024 to accelerate the adoption of Electronic Vehicles (EVs) in India. A total outlay of 500 crore rupees will be implemented for four months under the scheme.
- → It will run from 1st of the next month until July. Under the scheme, electric 2-wheelers will be provided a financial support measure of ₹10,000 per vehicle to support around 3.3 lakh 2-wheelers.



Election Commission of India:

- → The Election Commission of India on its official website on March 14 published the electoral bonds data as ordered by the Supreme Court of India (SC).
- → The publication of the electoral bond data came almost a month after the Supreme Court struck down the 2018 scheme calling it "unconstitutional."
- → In the data on electoral bonds, the only information available about donors is the name of their company or individual. The SBI confirmed in an affidavit that 22,217 electoral bonds were purchased and 22,030 redeemed by political parties between April 1, 2019, and February 15, 2024.



UK's Ministry of Defence:

- → The UK's Ministry of Defence (MoD) has conducted successful tests of its first-ever laser weapon, named "DragonFire". The high-powered laser is designed to target and neutralize drones, offering a potentially low-cost alternative to traditional missiles.
- → The DragonFire laser weapon is expected to significantly reduce the reliance on expensive ammunition, offering a cost-effective solution for air defense.



- EAEU:
 - → India is "seriously considering" starting talks for a free trade agreement with the Eurasian Economic Union. EAEU (Eurasian Economic Union) is an economic union comprising five post Sovian States located in Eurasia.
 - → It was established to promote economic integration. Member states: The EAEU consists of Armenia, Belarus, Kazakhstan, Kyrgystan and Russia.



TRAFFIC and WWF-India:

- → Tamil Nadu has led in the illegal trade of shark body parts, accounting for nearly 65% of seizures between 2010 and 2022, according to TRAFFIC and WWF-India.
- → Approximately 16,000 kg of shark fins, constituting about 80% of the shark derived products seized, have been documented in the analysis.



BJP:


→ The Election Commission has uploaded electoral bond data from SBI, detailing buyers and transactions with Political Parties. Top 5 buyers, from sectors like lottery and construction, have spent over Rs.3,445 crore(April 2019-February 2024).

→ The data has not specified which entity has donated to which political party. The top receiver of the bonds was BJP, followed by Trinamool Congress Party.



Human Development Index:

- → India ranks 134 out of 193 countries on the global Human Development Index, according to the United Nations Development Programme's latest report.
- → China and Sri Lanka ranked at 75 and 78. India also ranks below Bhutan(125) and Bangladesh(129).



FSSAI:

- → 100 jails certified as Eat RIght Campus by FSSAI across India. According to the Ministry of Health and Family welfare, the highest number of jails certified were from Uttar Pradesh followed by Punjab, Bihar and Madhya Pradesh.
- → By extending the Eat Right Campus Certification to prisons and correctional facilities, FSSAI focuses on ensuring access to safe and nutritious food for all, including inmates and prison staff.

- → The report underscores the deterioration of democratic principles, particularly in the areas of freedom of expression, media independence, and civil liberties.
- → India's status as one of the top standalone autocracies further accentuates the gravity of its democratic decline.
- → With its substantial population and democratic history, India's descent into electoral autocracy signifies a significant challenge to democratic norms and institutions.
- → The V-Dem Institute focuses on studying the qualities of government, offering high-profile datasets publicly available for free. V-Dem report has ranked India 104th among 179 countries.

- → It is an award of recognition for individuals who have demonstrated exceptional dedication to social welfare and humanitarian causes.




Date of Lok Sabha elections:

Kashmir:



- → Minister of Petroleum and Natural Gas, Hardeep Singh Puri has launched Ethanol100, an alternate auto fuel in New Delhi.
- → Ethanol100, a cleaner and greener alternative to gasoline, is a blend of 92 to 94 percent ethanol, 4 to 5 percent motor spirit to provide colour to flame and 1.5 percent Co-solvent higher saturated alcohol.
 - The fuel produces lower emissions of greenhouse gases, a reduction by around 63% on well to wheel basis.



India and Singapore:

- → India and Singapore have signed a MoU on cooperation in the sphere of law and dispute resolution. This agreement will further enhance the cooperation between the two countries in areas of common interest such as international commercial dispute resolution.
- → The agreement was signed in a virtual meeting of the Minister of State for Law and Justice Arjun Ram Meghwal and Singapore Minister for Culture, Community and Youth Mr. Edwin Tong.



Indian Army:

- → The Indian Army has raised its first squadron of Apache attack helicopters in Rajasthan's Jodhpur with the aim of supporting ground operations near the Pakistan border. Developed by the US aviation giant Boeing, Apache choppers are known as the 'tanks in the air'.
- → They are advanced multi-mission helicopters with the latest technology and have come to be known the best attack helicopters in the world.



Trinetra app 2.0:

→ The Uttar Pradesh Police has integrated Trinetra app 2.0, revolutionizing crime prevention. The advanced platform offers swift suspect identification, voice sample analysis for cybercrime cases and QR code generation for seized goods, enhancing operational efficiency.

→ With over 9.32 lakh criminal records now digitized within Trinetra's database police can swiftly identify suspects during security checks.



"Mission 414"

- → The Election Commission has initiated "Mission 414" in Himachal Pradesh, trageting a higher voter turnout at 414 polling stations that had registered under 60% turnout in the previous Lok Sabha elections.
- → The Compaign efforts have been aimed at enhancing democracy, coinciding with by-polls for 6 assembly seats and 4 Lok sabha seats on June 1.



Vladimir Putin:

- → Vladimir Putin claimed landslide victory in Russian Presidential polls. Putin has won Russia's presidential election with a record 87.8% of the vote, the highest in modern Russian history.
- → His victory has set him on a path to surpass Stalin as Russia's longest serving leader in over 200 years. Putin is a former KGB lieutenant colonel who first rose to power in 1999.



Oil palm processing unit:

- → India's first oil palm processing unit commenced in Arunachal Pradesh. It is aimed at boosting farmer income in the Northeast.
- → It represents a significant step in achieving Atmanirbharta in edible oils.



Election Commission:

- → The Election Commission has ordered the removal of 6 Home Secretaries from Gujarat, Bihar, Uttar Pradesh, Jharkhand, Himachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand ahead of Lok Sabha pols.
- → The reshuffle is aimed at ensuring fair elections, highlighting EC's proactive measures.



10% reservation:

- → Jammu and Kashmir LG Manoj Sinha has given green light to amend the Jammu and Kashmir reservation rules, 2005.
- → The amendment includes a provision for 10% reservation for newly included tribes such as Paharis in the Schedule Tribe Category.




IQAir:

- → The city of Begusarai in Bihar is the most polluted city in the world, according to the World Air Quality Report 2023 released by IQAir, a Switzerland-based organization. The report states that out of the top 100 most polluted places globally, 83 are from India.
- → After Begusarai, Guwahati is the second most polluted, followed by Delhi at third place and Mullanpur (Punjab) at fourth.
- → At a national level, India ranks third behind Bangladesh and Pakistan among the five most polluted countries in the list of 134 nations. In this report, New Delhi is ranked the world's most polluted capital city for the fourth consecutive year since 2018.



World Happiness Report:

- → The World Happiness Report is an annual survey conducted by the United Nations. It ranks countries based on factors like life satisfaction, GDP per capita, social support, healthy life expectancy, freedom, generosity, and corruption.
- For the seventh year in a row, Finland has been named the happiest country in the world. Other Nordic countries like Denmark, Iceland, and Sweden also ranked among the top 10 happiest nations.
- At the bottom of the list is Afghanistan, which has been plagued by a humanitarian crisis since the Taliban regained control in 2020. India ranked 126 in the happiness index, the same as the previous year.



- → Researchers have uncovered a monumental discovery on Mars—a colossal volcano named Noctis Volcano. Standing at an impressive 29,600 feet tall and stretching approximately 450 kilometers in width, this massive volcano lies just south of Mars' equator within the Eastern Noctis Labyrinthus region.
- → The finding, made possible by data from a suite of missions including NASA's Mariner 9, Viking Orbiter 1 and 2, Mars Global Surveyor, Mars Odyssey, Mars Reconnaissance Orbiter, and the ESA's Mars Express, unveils a hidden geological marvel.


SAKHI:




LEX-02 landing experiment at the Aeronautical Test Range in Chitradurga on March 22, 2024.

- → The theme for 2024 is "A Decade of Recognition, Justice, and Development: Implementation of the International Decade for People of African Descent".




Indian Army:


Beijing:

- → This monumental achievement reflects Mumbai's burgeoning economic landscape and underscores India's rising prominence in global wealth distribution.




Deep-sea isopod:

Archaeological Survey of India:

- → The goal of these excavations is to uncover what could potentially be the oldest temple in India.
- → The excavation sites are situated just 30 meters away from two ancient temples a Gupta-era Parvati temple and the Chaumukh Nath temple built by the Kalachuri dynasty.
- → These temples, known as the Nachna Hindu temples, are among the earliest surviving stone temples in central India, alongside those found in Bhumara and Deogarh.



New Zealand government:

- → The New Zealand government will ban the sale of disposable e-cigarettes, increase fines on retailers that sell to those younger than 18 years old and better regulate retailers.
- → The New Zealand government has received significant criticism for rolling back a world-first law banning tobacco sales for future generations.
- → It is committed to reducing smoking but is just taking a different approach, including further regulations around vaping.




North East Games 2024:

Canada:

- → Canada is the only country in the world that officially recognizes March 26th as Purple Day of Epilepsy through the Purple Day Act implemented on June 28, 2012.
- → Purple Day is an international grassroots effort dedicated to increasing awareness about epilepsy worldwide. The first Purple Day event was held on March 26, 2008. Epilepsy is a disorder of the brain characterized by repeated seizures.



'Op Sankalp':

- → In response to the Israeli-Hamas conflict, the Indian Navy's 'Op Sankalp' has been vital in the Indian Ocean.
- → The navy has been at the forefront addressing 18 incidents including the action against the hijacking of MV Ruen.


Tiger Triumph:

- → International Cricket Council is the global cricket administrative body. Headquarters: Dubai, UAE. It is founded in 1909.



- → Thailand has taken a historic step closer to marriage equality after the lower house passed a bill giving legal recognition to same-sex marriage,
- → It still needs approval from the Senate and royal endorsement to become law. Thailand will become the only South East Asian country to recognize same-sex unions.

- → India's first Artificial Intelligence based Film "IRAH". The trailer and song of the launch of the first Bollywood Hindi film on this subject, "IRAH", took place in Mumbai.
- → Monica: An AI story is a film that is said to be the first of its kind in India, made by Malayalam Film Industry.

- → IIT Madras is set to host the prestigious '6th Shaastra Rapid FIDE Rated Chess Tournament' on March 30 and 31, 2024.
- → The tournament, sanctioned by the International Chess Federation (FIDE), will draw the participation of esteemed players from across the globe, including Grandmasters, International Masters, and Women Grandmasters.



'Meghayan-24':

- → The METOC seminar 'Meghayan-24' was conducted by the School of Naval Oceanology & Meteorology (SNOM) and the Indian Naval Meteorological Analysis Centre (INMAC) at the Southern Naval Command on March 28, 2024.
- → It was organized in commemoration of World Meteorological Day, with the theme 'At the Frontline of Climate Action' set by the World Meteorological Organization (WMO) for 2024.



SatCom Industry Association of India (SIA-India) and ABRASAT:

- → The SatCom Industry Association of India (SIA-India) and ABRASAT, the Brazilian Satellite Communications Association, have joined forces to propel advancements in the space sector.
- → This strategic partnership aims to foster collaboration and drive innovative ventures and technological cooperation between India and Brazil.
- → The MoU facilitates collaboration in satellite communication, rocket and satellite launches, payload development, satellite platforms, and ground instrumentation.
- → It aims to strengthen business expansion and cooperation between India and Brazil in various sectors, enabling seamless regional and global connectivity.



IIM Mumbai:

- → In a significant move poised to reshape India's Aerospace, New Space, and Defence (ASD) industry, the Indian Institute of Management Mumbai (IIM Mumbai) partners with Starburst, a prominent European Aerospace, New Space, and Defence (ASD) accelerator.
- → This collaboration aims to bolster the ASD startup ecosystem in India, leveraging the resources and expertise of both entities.



International Day of Zero Waste:

- → On December 14, 2022, the United Nations General Assembly passed a resolution to have an International Day of Zero Waste celebrated every year on March 30th.
- → This day aims to raise awareness about reducing waste and promoting zero-waste initiatives to achieve sustainable development.



Sadanand Vasant Date:

- → Maharashtra Anti-Terrorism Squad chief Sadanand Vasant Date has been appointed as the Director General of the National Investigation Agency (NIA). He will succeed Dinkar Gupta, who is due to superannuate on March 31.
- → The Appointments Committee of the Cabinet (ACC) has approved the appointment of Date as the Director General (DG) of the NIA for a tenure up to his superannuation on December 31, 2026.



World's largest single-location copper manufacturing plant:

- → Billionaire Gautam Adani-led group has started of the first phase of the world's largest single-location copper manufacturing plant at Mundra in Gujarat, which will help cut India's dependence on imports and aid energy transition.
- → The 1st phase of the facility will produce 0.5 million tonnes a year of refined copper. India joins China and other nations that are rapidly expanding production of copper. India's per capita copper consumption is around 0.6 kg and the global average is 3.2 kg.




Rajasthan Diwas:

- → Rajasthan Diwas is celebrated every year on 30 March. This year Rajasthan celebrates its 75th anniversary. On this day in 1949, 19 princely states and 3 states were merged to form the state of Rajasthan after a process that took eight and a half years.
- → On January 14, 1949, Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel announced the merger of the princely states of Jaipur, Bikaner, Jodhpur, and Jaisalmer in a public meeting in Udaipur.
- → To implement this announcement, Patel inaugurated Greater Rajasthan in a ceremony in Jaipur on March 30, 1949. Before independence, the region was known as 'Rajputana'.
- → After the integration of the princely states was completed in seven phases, the name of the region was changed to 'Rajasthan'. Today, Rajasthan is the largest state in India in terms of area and is known for its rich history.




India's plastic Waste Management (Amendment) Rules, 2024:

- → The recent amendments to India's plastic Waste Management(Amendment) Rules, 2024 have introduced stricter criteria for labelling plastic products as "biodegradable".
- → The rules now require that biodegradabale plastics must not leave any microplastics behind during the degradation process. Microplastics are tiny plastic particles that have a diameter of less than 5 millimeteres(0.2 inches).



"Multiple Myeloma Awareness"

- → March is "Multiple Myeloma Awareness" month. Multiple myeloma is a type of cancer that begins in plasma cells.
- → There are white blood cells that are important to a healthy immune system. Multiple Myloma is one of the specific cancer types that show the largest racial disparities in incidence and mortality.



New satellite-based toll collection system:

- → Union Transport Minister Nitin Gadkari announced the end of tolls, introducing a new satellite-based toll collection system.
- → Money will be deducted directly from bank accounts based on road usage, saving time and money for travellers.
- → He emphasized the Bharatmala Pariyojana's importance in enhancing freight traffic handling and its aim to elevate India's road network to US standards.






UNESCO Global Geoparks;

- → UNESCO's Executive Board has endorsed the addition of 18 sites to the UNESCO Global Geoparks network.
- → This brings the total number of geoparks to 213 in 48 countries. The new geoparks are situated in Brazil, China, Croatia, Denmark, Finland, France, Greece, Hungary, Poland, Portugal and Spain. India does not have single geopark registered under UNESCO.



National Doctors day;

- → National Doctors day is observed on 30thMarch. This day is celebrated to recognize the contributions of physicians to individual lives and communities.
- → The first doctors Day observance was on March 30, 1933 in the United States. The red carnation is commonly used as the symbolic flower for National Doctors Day.



Sunil Chhetri:

- → Sunil Chhetri became the 8th player in the world and the first Indian football player to play 150+ international matches.
- → He is the only third among active players behind Cristiano Ronaldo and Lionel Messi. He became captain of the Indian Team in 2011.



IIT Guwahati:

- → First ever India-made swine fever vaccine by IIT Guwahati. This vaccine marks the 1st recombinant virus-based solution for classical swine fever developed in India, offering a swift and cost effective method for pig vaccination.
- → States like Punjab, Haryana, Bihar, Gujarat and Kerala are among the states with frequently observed instances of swine fever.
