Topic Wise Current Affairs in Short



1: Important Days



World Lung Cancer Day: 01 August:

World Lung Cancer Day is observed annually on August 1st to raise global awareness about lung cancer, its risk factors, prevention strategies, and the importance of early diagnosis and treatment. The day was first initiated in 2012 by the Forum of International Respiratory Societies (FIRS), in collaboration with the International Association for the Study of Lung Cancer (IASLC) and the American College of Chest Physicians. Lung cancer remains the leading cause of cancer-related deaths worldwide, often detected at an advanced stage due to minimal early symptoms. The theme for World Lung Cancer Day 2025 as "Breaking Barriers: Championing Early Detection and Equal Care".



World Wide Web Day: 01 August:

World Wide Web Day is celebrated on August 1st each year to recognize the transformative impact of the internet on communication, education, commerce, and society at large. This day marks the anniversary of the first-ever website going live on August 1, 1991, created by British computer scientist Sir Tim Berners-Lee at CERN (European Organization for Nuclear Research). He had

earlier proposed the idea of the World Wide Web in 1989, envisioning it as a system for sharing information globally through hyperlinks. World Wide Web Day celebrates this digital revolution, reflecting on how the web has democratized knowledge, fueled innovation, and transformed social interactions.



Hiroshima Day: 06 August:-

Hiroshima Day is observed annually on August 6 to commemorate the atomic bombing of the Japanese city of Hiroshima by the United States during World War II in 1945. On this day, the first-ever nuclear weapon used in warfare, nicknamed "Little Boy," was dropped on Hiroshima, instantly killing tens of thousands and leaving many more to suffer from radiation-related illnesses in the aftermath. The bombing marked a turning point in global military history and highlighted the devastating impact of nuclear weapons.



National Handloom Day: 07 August:


National Handloom Day is celebrated annually on August 7 to honor the handloom weavers of India and promote the country's rich textile heritage. The date commemorates the Swadeshi Movement launched on 7

August 1905, which encouraged the use of indigenous goods, especially handwoven fabrics, as a form of resistance to British colonial rule. Instituted in 2015 by the Government of India, the day recognizes the contribution of the handloom sector, which plays a key role in rural employment, sustainable fashion, and preserving traditional crafts. "Weaving Innovation into Tradition" Is the theme for the National Handloom Day 2025.



Quit India Movement Day: 08 August:-

Quit India Movement Day is observed every year on August 8 to commemorate the launch of the historic Quit India Movement in 1942. Initiated by Mahatma Gandhi during the struggle for India's independence, the movement called for the British to "Quit India" and marked a decisive shift in the freedom fight. Gandhi's clarion call of "Do or Die" resonated with millions of Indians, leading to mass protests, arrests, and demonstrations across the country. Despite heavy suppression by the British, the movement intensified nationalistic fervor and strengthened India's resolve to attain complete independence.



World Sanskrit Day 2025: 09 August:-

World Sanskrit Day 2025 will be observed on August 9, coinciding with Shraavan Purnima as per the Hindu calendar. This annual observance is dedicated to promoting the Sanskrit language, one of the oldest known languages in human civilization and the root of many modern Indian languages. It is celebrated with cultural programs, recitations, and seminars across India. The day recognizes Sanskrit's immense contribution to India's spiritual, philosophical, and literary heritage.



International Day of the World's Indigenous Peoples: 09 August:-

Observed on August 9 every year, the International Day of the World's Indigenous Peoples commemorates the first meeting of the UN Working Group on Indigenous Populations in 1982. The day raises awareness about the rights, cultures, and struggles of indigenous communities worldwide. It highlights issues such as land rights, discrimination, linguistic preservation, and environmental challenges disproportionately affecting indigenous groups. Events such as cultural exhibits, policy discussions, and educational programs are organized globally to honor the resilience and diversity of these communities.



Nagasaki Day: 09 August:-

Nagasaki Day is observed on August 9 to remember the devastating atomic bombing of Nagasaki, Japan, by the United States in 1945 during World War II. This act, which followed the bombing of Hiroshima three days earlier, led to the deaths of over 74,000 people and caused long-term radiation-related suffering. The day serves as a somber reminder of the destructive power of nuclear weapons and reinforces the global call for disarmament. Memorial services are held in Japan and around the world.



World Lion Day: 10 August:-

World Lion Day is observed every year on August 10 to raise awareness about the conservation of lions and their dwindling population across the globe. The day aims to highlight the importance of preserving this majestic species, which plays a vital role in maintaining the balance of ecosystems. It was first launched in 2013 by wildlife filmmakers Dereck and Beverly Joubert, who are also co-founders of the Big Cat Initiative with National Geographic. The celebration sheds light on the threats lions face, including habitat loss, human-wildlife conflict, poaching, and climate change, urging individuals and governments to work towards their protection.



World Biofuel Day: 10 August:-

World Biofuel Day is observed annually on August 10 to promote the use of non-fossil fuels as an alternative to conventional energy sources, highlighting the role of biofuels in achieving sustainable energy goals. The date commemorates Sir Rudolf Diesel, who on August 10, 1893, successfully ran an engine using peanut oil, demonstrating the potential of bio-based fuels. The day emphasizes the environmental, economic, and energy security benefits of biofuels, such as reducing greenhouse gas emissions, decreasing dependence on imported crude oil, and providing new income sources for farmers. The theme for this year's World Biofuel Day is "Biofuels: a sustainable pathway to net zero."



World Elephant Day: 12 August:

World Elephant Day is observed every year on August 12 to raise awareness about the urgent need to protect elephants and their habitats. It was first celebrated in 2012, founded by Canadian filmmaker Patricia Sims in collaboration with Thailand's Elephant Reintroduction Foundation, and has since gained support from over 100 wildlife conservation organizations worldwide. The day highlights threats such as poaching for ivory, habitat destruction, and human—elephant conflict, which endanger both Asian and African elephant populations.



International Youth Day: 12 August:

International Youth Day is marked annually on August 12 to celebrate the potential of young people as partners in shaping a better future. The observance was proposed at the 1998 World Conference of Ministers Responsible for Youth in Lisbon and officially declared by the United Nations General Assembly in 1999, with the first celebration held in 2000. This day focuses on the challenges faced by youth worldwide, including unemployment, education gaps, mental health issues, and inequality, while promoting initiatives that empower and engage them in decision-making. The theme for 2025 International Youth Day is "Local Youth Actions for the SDGs and Beyond".




World Organ Donation Day: 13 August:-

World Organ Donation Day is observed every year on August 13 to promote awareness about the life-saving potential of organ donation and encourage more people to pledge their organs for transplantation. The day's history traces back to initiatives led by various health advocacy groups and medical organizations, with the World Health Organization (WHO) playing a key role in promoting organ donation awareness on a global scale. The concept gained momentum in the early 2000s as part of worldwide campaigns to bridge the gap between organ demand and availability. The theme for World Organ Donation Day 2025 is "Answering the Call".



Independence Day 2025: 15 August:-

India will celebrate its 79th Independence Day on 15 August 2025, marking the nation's liberation from British colonial rule in 1947. The day commemorates the historic moment when India's first Prime Minister, Jawaharlal Nehru, hoisted the tricolour at the Red Fort, symbolising the country's hard-fought freedom after decades of struggle. It serves as a reminder of the sacrifices made by countless freedom fighters and is celebrated with flag hoisting ceremonies, cultural programmes, and patriotic events across the nation. The 79th Independence Day celebrations is themed 'Naya Bharat.'



World Photography Day: 19 August:

World Photography Day is celebrated every year on August 19 to honor the art, craft, and impact of photography. The day marks the invention of the daguerreotype process, the first practical photographic method announced in 1839 by the French government, which gifted it to the world. Photography has since evolved from black-and-white prints to digital imaging, becoming a powerful medium of storytelling,

documentation, and cultural preservation. The official theme for World Photography Day 2025 is "My Favorite Photo."



World Humanitarian Day: 19 August:


World Humanitarian Day is observed on August 19 each year to pay tribute to humanitarian workers who risk their lives to provide aid in crisis situations. The day was designated in memory of the 2003 bombing of the United Nations headquarters in Baghdad, where several UN staff members, including Sergio Vieira de Mello, lost their lives. Its history is deeply tied to acknowledging the dangers faced by aid workers and recognizing their role in saving lives during natural disasters, armed conflicts, and emergencies. The theme for World Humanitarian Day 2025 is Strengthening Global Solidarity and Empowering Local Communities.



Akshay Urja Diwas: 20 August:-

Akshay Urja Diwas, observed every year on August 20, is dedicated to promoting the use of renewable energy sources in India. The day was first celebrated in 2004 to create awareness about sustainable energy and reduce dependence on fossil fuels. The Government of India initiated this observance to highlight the importance of solar, wind, hydro, and other renewable energy options

as an alternative to conventional sources. The day is also used to educate the public about energy conservation and to encourage individuals, institutions, and industries to adopt cleaner technologies.



Sadbhavana Diwas: 20 August:-

Sadbhavana Diwas is observed annually on August 20 to commemorate the birth anniversary of former Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi. The day was established to promote national integration, peace, and communal harmony among all citizens of India, regardless of caste, creed, or religion. Rajiv Gandhi is remembered for his vision of a united and progressive India, with emphasis on youth empowerment, science, and technology. On this day, people take a pledge to work towards harmony and goodwill in society, and various cultural and educational programs are organized across the country.



World Mosquito Day: 20 August:

World Mosquito Day is observed every year on August 20 to commemorate the discovery by British doctor Sir Ronald Ross in 1897 that female Anopheles mosquitoes transmit malaria. This breakthrough laid the foundation for malaria prevention and control measures globally. The day is marked to raise awareness about the dangers mosquitoes pose, as they are vectors for several deadly

diseases such as malaria, dengue, chikungunya, Zika, and yellow fever. The theme for World Mosquito Day 2025 as "Accelerating the Fight Against Malaria for a More Equitable World."



International Day for the Remembrance of the Slave Trade and its Abolition: 23 August:-

The International Day for the Remembrance of the Slave Trade and its Abolition is observed on August 23 every year. It marks the anniversary of the 1791 uprising in Santo Domingo (present-day Haiti and the Dominican Republic), which was a decisive turning point in the abolition of the transatlantic slave trade. The United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) established this observance in 1998 to honor the memory of the millions of men, women, and children who suffered due to slavery, while also celebrating the struggle and resilience of enslaved people. The day highlights the importance of teaching about the legacy of slavery and racism.



National Space Day: 23 August:-

National Space Day in India is celebrated every year on August 23, a date chosen to commemorate the success of ISRO's Chandrayaan-3 mission in 2023, when the Vikram lander made a historic soft landing near the Moon's south pole. This achievement marked India as the first country to successfully reach that region of the Moon and the fourth nation overall to achieve a lunar landing. Following this milestone, Prime Minister Narendra Modi declared August 23 as National Space Day to honor India's advancements in space science and technology. The theme is 'Leveraging Space Technology for Viksit Bharat 2047' to celebrate ISRO's role in national growth.



National Small Industry Day (India): 30 August:-

National Small Industry Day is observed in India every year on 30 August to recognize the vital role of the Small-Scale Industries (SSIs) and Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) sector in strengthening the Indian economy. The observance began in 2001, when the Government of India decided to dedicate a day to appreciate and promote small industries that generate large-scale employment opportunities, support rural and semi-urban development, and contribute significantly to exports.

2: Agreements



India and Morocco Sign Agreement to Enhance Judicial Cooperation:-

India and Morocco have signed a Mutual Legal Assistance
Treaty and a Memorandum of Understanding to
strengthen judicial and legal cooperation. These
agreements focus on civil and commercial matters,
facilitating legal modernization and knowledge
exchange. The partnership aims to enhance institutional
linkages and contribute to the rule of law, reflecting a
commitment to international collaboration. This
development marks a significant step in deepening
bilateral relations and fostering mutual understanding in
the judicial sphere.



FSSAI and Ministry of Ayush Release Ayurveda Aahara Product List:-

The FSSAI, in collaboration with the Ministry of Ayush, unveiled a comprehensive list of Ayurvedic food preparations under the Food Safety and Standards (Ayurveda Aahara) Regulations, 2022. This initiative integrates ancient dietary wisdom into modern regulations, promoting traditional Ayurvedic nutrition.

The list ensures authenticity and serves as a reference for manufacturers, enhancing public trust. This move aligns with India's cultural heritage and aims to improve public health through the adoption of Ayurveda Aahara as part of preventive healthcare.



India-Philippines Strengthen Scientific Ties with New Cooperation Programme:-

India and the Philippines signed a Programme of Cooperation to enhance bilateral scientific collaboration, focusing on geo-spatial technologies and the blue economy. The agreement fosters joint research and capacity-building in areas like disaster management and biotechnology. This initiative reflects a commitment to advancing science and technology partnerships in the region.



India, Russia Sign Protocol to Enhance Industrial Cooperation:-

India and Russia have signed a protocol to boost industrial cooperation in sectors such as aluminium, fertilizers, and railways. The agreement, reached during

the 11th session of the India-Russia Working Group on Modernization and Industrial Cooperation, reflects the countries' commitment to deepening their strategic partnership. The discussions focused on modernization, mining technology, and emerging areas like aerospace and additive manufacturing. This collaboration highlights the potential for technological exchange and joint development projects between the two nations.



NLCIL signs MoU with Bhabha Atomic Research Centre for extraction of rare earth elements from fly ash:

Public sector enterprise NLC India Limited (NLCIL) has signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the Bhabha Atomic Research Centre (BARC) to develop a process for extracting valuable rare earth elements from fly ash generated in thermal power plants. Rare earth elements are critical for manufacturing advanced technologies, including electronics, renewable energy equipment, and defense systems. The collaboration aims to not only utilize industrial waste productively but also boost India's self-reliance in critical minerals.



IIT Bombay, Rolls-Royce Sign MoU for Innovation :-

The Indian Institute of Technology Bombay has entered into a Memorandum of Understanding with Rolls-Royce to foster innovation and research in engineering and technology. The collaboration will focus on developing advanced solutions in areas such as clean energy, propulsion systems, artificial intelligence, and sustainable manufacturing. By combining IIT Bombay's academic and research expertise with Rolls-Royce's industrial experience, the partnership aims to nurture future technologies that can have a global impact. The MoU also includes provisions for student internships, joint projects, and technology incubation initiatives.



Tamil Nadu inks MoU with Hikoki Power Tools for ₹700 crore investment in Mahindra World City:-

Tamil Nadu has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Hikoki Power Tools India Private Limited, paving the way for an investment of ₹700 crore in Mahindra World City, Chengalpattu. This collaboration aims to boost the state's manufacturing sector, create job opportunities, and enhance industrial growth in the region. The investment is expected to strengthen Tamil Nadu's position as a preferred destination for high-quality industrial production and encourage further foreign and domestic investments in the state's emerging industrial hubs.



IOB Signs MoU with Mumbai Metro One for Ticketing Solutions:-

Indian Overseas Bank (IOB) has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Mumbai Metro One to provide innovative ticketing solutions for metro commuters. Under this collaboration, IOB will offer digital payment systems that simplify ticket purchases and recharge options, integrating banking services with public transportation. This initiative reflects a push towards enhancing urban mobility by promoting cashless transactions and improving passenger convenience. The tie-up also highlights IOB's efforts to expand its digital footprint while supporting smart city infrastructure.



IIT Bhubaneswar, Tata Steels signs MoU to launch TomorrowLAB Accelerator Programme for startups:-

In a major boost to innovation and entrepreneurship, IIT Bhubaneswar has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Tata Steel to jointly launch the "TomorrowLAB Accelerator Programme." This initiative is aimed at nurturing startups and providing them with the resources, mentorship, and industrial support needed to scale their ideas. The program will act as a bridge between academic research and industry needs, fostering technological advancement and sustainable business models. UP inks MoU with CEL for smart industrial infra:-

The Government of Uttar Pradesh has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Central Electronics Limited (CEL) to develop smart industrial infrastructure across the state. This partnership aims to integrate advanced technology-driven solutions such as smart energy systems, modern surveillance, and digital connectivity into upcoming industrial areas. The initiative is expected to boost ease of doing business, attract investments, and provide industries with modern facilities for sustainable growth. By collaborating with CEL, the state envisions enhancing productivity and building globally competitive industrial hubs.



South Southeast Asian Nations Forge Health Research Collaboration:-

Countries agreed to collaborate on medical technology innovation, training, ethics, and quality assurance, setting up structured mechanisms for joint capacity-building programmes.

Payment aggregators—platforms like Razorpay, PhonePe, and others that process online payments for merchants—will now be required to pay a fee for transactions conducted via UPI using ICICI Bank's systems. While this fee will not directly affect consumers, it may influence how these platforms manage their pricing and operations.



Rs 2,000 notes worth Rs 6,017 cr still in circulation: RBI

According to the Reserve Bank of India (RBI), ₹2,000 denomination currency notes amounting to ₹6,017 crore are still in public circulation, despite being withdrawn from active usage. The RBI had earlier initiated the withdrawal of ₹2,000 notes as part of its currency management strategy, encouraging people to deposit or exchange them. The recent update reflects the remaining unreturned notes even after extended deadlines. This figure highlights how a segment of the population continues to hold onto high-denomination notes, possibly due to delay, ignorance, or deliberate choice amid regulatory transitions.



RBI Approves Merger of New India Co-operative Bank with Saraswat Bank:-

The Reserve Bank of India has granted approval for the merger of New India Co-operative Bank Ltd. with Saraswat Co-operative Bank Ltd., marking a significant move in the consolidation of India's cooperative banking sector. This strategic merger aims to enhance financial stability and expand services for customers of both institutions. Saraswat Bank, being one of India's largest urban cooperative banks, is expected to bring greater technological integration and operational efficiency to New India Co-operative Bank's existing customer base. The decision aligns with RBI's broader push for strengthening governance and viability in the cooperative banking ecosystem.



Bank of Baroda launches digital foreign exchange platform bob FxOne for instant transactions:-

Bank of Baroda has launched a new digital platform named 'bob FxOne' to streamline and digitize foreign exchange transactions for its customers. This platform is designed to offer real-time, seamless forex services including rate booking, trade settlements, and instant currency conversion. Targeting corporate clients, exporters, and importers, FxOne aims to improve transaction speed, transparency, and user convenience. The platform integrates advanced analytics and risk management tools, enabling businesses to manage their international trade and currency exposure more efficiently.



HDFC Bank issues urgent alert on new Android malware targeting customers:-

HDFC Bank has issued a serious cybersecurity warning to its customers about a new Android malware that is attempting to steal sensitive banking credentials. This malware, often disguised as legitimate apps or updates, can take control of users' devices and extract information such as passwords, SMS-based OTPs, and banking login details. The bank has urged customers not to download apps from unknown sources, avoid clicking on suspicious links, and always verify the authenticity of messages claiming to be from the bank.



AU Small Finance Bank gets RBI's 'in-principle' approval to become a universal bank :-

AU Small Finance Bank has received 'in-principle' approval from the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) to transition into a universal bank. This marks a significant development for the Jaipur-based financial institution,

which started as a non-banking finance company before becoming a small finance bank in 2017. With this approval, the bank can now explore offering a full range of banking services similar to other universal banks, such as corporate banking, treasury services, and broader loan and deposit products.



ICICI Bank raises minimum balance for savings accounts from ₹10,000 to 50,000 :-

ICICI Bank has sharply increased the monthly minimum average balance (MAB) required for new urban/metro savings accounts. The requirement has gone up from ₹10,000 to ₹50,000—a five-fold rise. This change came into effect on August 1, 2025 and only applies to newly opened accounts; existing account holders remain unaffected. This steep hike has sparked criticism, especially as many public sector banks are moving toward eliminating minimum balance requirements to promote financial inclusion. ICICI's move stands in contrast and may affect accessibility for middle- and lower-income customers.



Equirus Group receives RBI approval to launch NBFC:-

Financial services firm Equirus Group has received approval from India's central bank, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI), to launch its non-deposit-taking Non-Banking Financial Company (NBFC), named Equirus Finance. The

new NBFC plans to offer a variety of secured lending solutions, including Loan Against Securities (LAS), ESOP financing, Market-Linked Debentures (MLDs), structured finance, and other customized lending products. The group aims to build a loan book of approximately ₹3,000 crore.

Karur Vysya Bank has recently strengthened its presence in western and southern India by opening new branches in Maharashtra and Andhra Pradesh. RBI issues payment aggregator licence to Paytm Payments Services:-


The Reserve Bank of India has granted a payment aggregator licence to Paytm Payments Services, allowing

The move had sparked criticism for potentially excluding middle-income customers and small savers. By reversing this decision, the bank aims to address customer concerns, retain loyalty, and ensure accessibility of its banking services to a wider demographic. The episode also reflects the increasing influence of public feedback on major financial policy changes in the banking sector.



Bank of Baroda Introduces Global UPI Services via bob 통 Pay App :-




ITBP and NDRF Rescue 413 Pilgrims from Kinnaur Kailash Trek Amid Heavy Rains :-

Unidentified Object Explosion in Poland Raises Security Concerns :-

An unidentified object exploded in a cornfield in Osiny, eastern Poland, near the Ukraine border, causing property damage but no injuries. The incident prompted air raid alerts in Ukraine's Volyn and Lviv regions, although no attacks were reported. Authorities are investigating the cause of the explosion, with police and firefighters at the scene. This event highlights ongoing regional tensions and the need for heightened security measures. It underscores the importance of cross-border cooperation in addressing potential threats, as both countries remain vigilant amid geopolitical uncertainties.



Trump Hints at US Air Support in Ukraine Peace Deal :-

President Donald Trump has indicated the possibility of US air support in a Ukraine peace deal, excluding ground troops. Following a White House summit with Ukrainian President Zelenskiy, Trump emphasized security guarantees for Ukraine, exploring options for military aid. These developments come amid ongoing tensions and air assaults by Russia on Ukraine. The potential US involvement underscores the complexities international diplomacy in conflict resolution, highlighting the strategic balance between military support and peace negotiations.



HAL Secures ₹62,000 Crore Order for Tejas Fighter Jets .

Hindustan Aeronautics Ltd (HAL) announced a ₹62,000 crore order for 97 LCA Mk-1A fighter jets from the Indian Air Force, with deliveries starting this year. Approved by the Cabinet Committee on Security, the order is a significant boost for indigenous defence manufacturing, phasing out older MiG-21 jets. The LCA Mk-1A features upgraded combat capabilities. This marks HAL's second major order for Tejas, supporting the government's push for 'Make in India' in defence.



DRDO's Successful Test of Indigenous Air Defence System:-

The Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) successfully conducted maiden flight-tests of the Integrated Air Defence Weapon System (IADWS) off the Odisha coast. The fully indigenous system demonstrated its capability to counter aerial threats, marking a India's significant advancement in defence infrastructure. The IADWS integrates Quick Reaction Surface-to-Air Missiles, Very Short Range Air Defence System missiles, and a high-power laser-based Directed Energy Weapon. Defence Minister Rajnath Singh lauded the achievement as a testament to India's growing selfreliance in advanced defence technologies.



Indian Navy Commissions Stealth Frigates INS Udaygiri and INS Himgiri :-

The Indian Navy has commissioned two state-of-the-art stealth frigates, INS Udaygiri and INS Himgiri, at Visakhapatnam. These warships, built with over 75% indigenous content, are part of India's push towards self-reliance in defence manufacturing. The commissioning of these frigates marks a significant milestone in enhancing India's maritime capabilities and underscores the

strategic importance of the eastern seaboard. Equipped with advanced weapons and sensors, the frigates are designed to execute a wide range of maritime missions, boosting the Navy's operational readiness.



Indian Army Aviation Conducts High-Risk Rescue in Flood-Hit Punjab:-

In a daring operation, Indian Army Aviation rescued civilians and CRPF personnel stranded in a flood-affected building in Punjab. The mission, executed under challenging weather conditions, highlighted the Army's readiness and precision. Rising waters from the Ravi River necessitated the urgent evacuation, showcasing the Army's commitment to safety and disaster response.



India to Deploy Over 700 Troops to Exercise Bright Star 2025 in Egypt :-

India has announced the deployment of over 700 soldiers to participate in Exercise Bright Star 2025, one of the world's largest multinational military exercises, held in Egypt. This participation underscores India's commitment to strengthening international military cooperation and interoperability with partner nations. It also provides the Indian Armed Forces an opportunity to practice large-scale operations, counter-terrorism

strategies, and disaster response mechanisms alongside global counterparts. The move reflects India's increasing willingness to engage in strategic defense diplomacy, positioning itself as a responsible regional power capable of contributing to global security frameworks.



Mission Sudarshan Chakra Missile Defence Programme to Begin Trials in 2026:-

India has announced that the Mission Sudarshan Chakra missile defense programme will commence trials in 2026, with the objective of achieving a multi-layered, Alenabled missile defense system by 2035. The mission envisions an advanced shield capable of intercepting ballistic missiles, cruise missiles, and hypersonic weapons. This project reflects India's growing focus on indigenous defense technologies and self-reliance in strategic security systems. Once operational, the system is expected to significantly enhance India's deterrence capabilities against regional threats



India Successfully Test-Fires Agni-5 Ballistic Missile:-

India has successfully conducted a test of its Agni-5 ballistic missile, reaffirming its status as a nuclear-capable state with long-range strike capability. The missile, which has an estimated range of over 5,000 kilometers, enhances India's strategic deterrence posture, particularly against potential adversaries like China. The test was carried out with indigenous technology and underlines India's progress in strengthening its defense sector. It also demonstrates the credibility of India's nuclear doctrine of "credible minimum deterrence" while sending a strong message about self-reliance and preparedness in the face of emerging security challenges.



India-Saudi Arabia Expand Defence Cooperation:

India and Saudi Arabia concluded the 7th Joint Committee meeting on Defence Cooperation, aiming to enhance collaborations in training, industrial partnerships, and military exercises. Co-chaired by officials from both nations, the meeting reviewed past progress and explored new areas such as cybersecurity and disaster management. India showcased its defence manufacturing capabilities under the 'Make in India' initiative, proposing joint production opportunities. The expanded partnership reflects growing strategic ties, as evidenced by the recent establishment of a Ministerial Committee on Defence Cooperation.

Tata Motors Announces €3.8 Billion Acquisition of Iveco Group:-


Tata Motors plans to acquire the European commercial vehicle company Iveco Group for €3.8 billion. The all-cash offer aims to create a global powerhouse in the commercial vehicle industry, combining complementary capabilities and a shared commitment to sustainable mobility. The acquisition, pending regulatory approvals, will enhance Tata Motors' market presence and innovation in zero-emission transport. This strategic move underscores Tata Motors' ambition to expand its global footprint and leverage synergies in the commercial vehicle sector.



India's Forex Reserves Increase by \$2.7 Billion:-

India's foreign exchange reserves rose by \$2.7 billion, reaching \$698.19 billion as of July 25. The increase was driven by foreign currency assets and gold reserves, which grew by \$1.31 billion and \$1.2 billion, respectively. The Reserve Bank of India's interventions aimed at

maintaining market stability contributed to this growth. The rise in reserves reflects India's strong economic fundamentals and its ability to manage liquidity and exchange rate volatility effectively.



India's Chip Market Poised for \$100 Billion Growth by 2030:-

India's semiconductor market is projected to reach \$100-110 billion by 2030, driven by digitalization and government initiatives. The India Semiconductor Mission aims to boost domestic production and global integration. Recent developments, including new semiconductor units and startup investments, highlight India's emergence as a key player in the global chip industry.



RBI Keeps Repo Rate Unchanged at 5.5% Amid Easing Inflation:-

The Reserve Bank of India has decided to maintain the repo rate at 5.5% during its August Monetary Policy

Committee meeting, citing favourable economic indicators and easing inflation. The decision follows a detailed assessment of macroeconomic developments, with retail inflation reaching its lowest level in over six years. The RBI remains optimistic about domestic growth prospects, supported by a positive monsoon and upcoming festival season. The central bank's decision signals confidence in India's economic stability amid global uncertainties.



Trump's Tariff Hike on Indian Imports Sparks Economic Concerns:-

US President Donald Trump has announced an additional 25% tariff on Indian imports, raising concerns about its potential impact on India's GDP growth. Economists estimate a possible 0.2-0.4% reduction in growth, with sectors like garments, precious stones, and electronics expected to be affected. The tariff increase, linked to India's oil imports from Russia, has sparked fears of a competitive disadvantage and potential job losses. The situation underscores the complexities of international trade relations and their economic implications.



Centre Releases 3 Lakh Tonnes of Onion Stock to Stabilize Prices:-

The Indian government announced the release of 3 lakh tonnes of onion buffer stock from September to ensure price stability during the monsoon. This move, under the Ministry of Consumer Affairs, comes as essential vegetable prices remain controlled due to high production levels in 2024-25. Despite a temporary spike in tomato prices due to heavy rainfall, the buffer stock release aims to mitigate short-term price volatility. The National Cooperative Consumers' Federation of India has also been active in procuring and selling tomatoes at controlled prices across Delhi. This initiative reflects the government's commitment to managing food inflation and supporting consumers during seasonal fluctuations.



Cabinet Approves ₹30,000 Crore Compensation for PSU Oil Firms :-

The Union Cabinet approved a ₹30,000 crore compensation for public sector Oil Marketing Companies (OMCs) to offset losses from selling domestic LPG at regulated prices. This package supports IOCL, BPCL, and HPCL, ensuring uninterrupted LPG supplies despite elevated international prices. The compensation will be disbursed in 12 installments, aiding the companies in meeting operational needs and maintaining consumer welfare. This decision reflects the government's focus on shielding consumers from global energy market volatility while supporting PSU financial health.



Cabinet Approves Continuation of LPG Subsidy for PMUY:-

The Union Cabinet sanctioned the continuation of a targeted LPG subsidy for Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana (PMUY) beneficiaries for the fiscal year 2025-26, involving an expenditure of ₹12,000 crore. The subsidy supports up to nine refills per year, making LPG more affordable for economically disadvantaged households. This initiative aims to alleviate the impact of global LPG price fluctuations on consumers, promoting clean cooking fuel access. The decision underscores the government's commitment to energy security and consumer welfare.



India's Tribal Empowerment Budget Triples in a Decade

India's spending on tribal development has nearly tripled over the past decade, reflecting a commitment to inclusivity and empowerment. The budget for tribal affairs has grown significantly, with increased allocations across key sectors such as education, health, and livelihoods. Initiatives like the PM Janjatiya Unnat Gram Abhiyan aim to bridge developmental gaps in tribal-majority regions. This comprehensive approach aligns with the United Nations' goals for indigenous peoples, highlighting India's proactive stance on tribal welfare.



India Imposes Port Restriction on Jute Goods from Bangladesh:-

The Indian government has restricted the import of certain jute-based goods from Bangladesh, allowing entry only via the Nhava Sheva Seaport in Maharashtra. This decision, enforced under the Foreign Trade (Development Regulation) Act, 1992, aims to address quality control and trade balance concerns. Previously, these imports were allowed through land ports along the India-Bangladesh border. The move could protect domestic industries from competitive pricing pressures, impacting Indo-Bangladesh trade relations, especially in the sensitive jute sector.



India Achieves 100 GW Solar PV Milestone, PM Modi Applauds Clean Energy Push:-

India has reached a significant milestone in its solar energy journey, achieving 100 GW in solar PV module manufacturing capacity under the Approved List of Models and Manufacturers (ALMM). This marks a substantial increase from just 2.3 GW in 2014 and aligns with the national vision of Atmanirbhar Bharat. Prime Minister Narendra Modi celebrated this achievement, emphasizing its role in promoting self-reliance and clean

energy. The milestone is attributed to the success of initiatives like the Production Linked Incentive (PLI) Scheme for High-Efficiency Solar Modules, reinforcing India's commitment to achieving 500 GW of non-fossil fuel capacity by 2030 and playing a vital part in global decarbonization efforts.



OpenAl Launches Affordable ChatGPT Subscription Plan in India:-

OpenAI has introduced ChatGPT Go, a new subscription plan priced at ₹399 per month, exclusively for the Indian market. This affordable plan aims to increase OpenAI's presence in its second-largest market by user base. The plan offers users the ability to send more messages and generate more images compared to the free version, with faster response times. India, with its nearly one billion internet users, represents a significant opportunity for OpenAI to expand its user base. This strategic move aligns with CEO Sam Altman's vision to create a low-cost AI ecosystem in India, potentially making it OpenAI's largest market.



India Eyes Export Diversification Amid US Tariff Hike:-

In response to the US increasing tariffs on Indian goods to 50%, India is exploring export diversification to

mitigate impacts on its MSMEs. The Crisil report highlights the importance of leveraging the India-UK FTA and potential EU trade deals. MSMEs, contributing 45% to India's exports, face challenges, especially in textiles, gems, jewellery, and seafood sectors. The report advises strategic market expansion and highlights the supportive role of the India-UK FTA in enhancing competitiveness against countries like Bangladesh and Vietnam. This development emphasizes the need for adaptive trade strategies to maintain economic stability amid global tariff shifts.



E-commerce Sector Leads Refund Grievances, Says NCH

The e-commerce sector recorded the highest number of refund-related grievances in July 2025, with 3,594 cases resulting in refunds worth Rs 1.34 crore. The National Consumer Helpline's technological transformation has enhanced its efficiency, successfully facilitating refunds across multiple sectors. The helpline's role in safeguarding consumer rights and promoting fair trade practices underscores the government's commitment to consumer protection.



India Suspends Postal Services to US Amid New Customs Duty Rules :-

India's Department of Posts announced a temporary suspension of most postal services to the United States following a US executive order introducing new customs duties. The order eliminates the duty-free exemption for goods valued up to USD 800, requiring all postal items to be subject to customs duties. The suspension, effective August 25, applies to all postal articles except letters, documents, and gift items valued up to USD 100. The Department is engaging with stakeholders to resolve the issues and restore full postal services to the US as soon as possible.



Delhi Metro Implements First Fare Hike in Eight Years :-

The Delhi Metro Rail Corporation has revised fares for the first time in eight years, effective from August 25. The fare hike ranges from ₹1 to ₹4, with the Airport Express Line seeing an increase of up to ₹5. The adjustments aim to ensure operational sustainability. Despite some public backlash, DMRC emphasizes the necessity of the hike to maintain service standards.



PLI Scheme Boosts India's Manufacturing and Job Growth:-

India's Production Linked Incentive (PLI) Scheme has attracted ₹1.76 lakh crore in investments and created over 12 lakh jobs across 14 sectors. The scheme aims to increase manufacturing's GDP share to 25%, with

significant growth seen in electronics, pharmaceuticals, and automotive sectors. The PLI scheme is a cornerstone of India's industrial transformation under the Atmanirbhar Bharat initiative.



Suzuki to Invest Rs 70,000 Crore in India's Auto Market

Suzuki Motor Corporation has announced a substantial investment of Rs 70,000 crore in India over the next five to six years to expand production and launch new car models. The investment will also focus on enhancing Suzuki's position in India's rapidly growing automobile market. This commitment was marked by the launch of Maruti Suzuki's first electric SUV, the e-Vitara, which will be manufactured at the Hansalpur plant in Gujarat and exported to over 100 countries. Trump Imposes 50% Tariff on Brazilian Goods, Excludes Key Sectors:-

US President Trump has imposed a 50% tariff on most Brazilian goods, citing a 'witch hunt' against former President Bolsonaro. The tariffs exclude sectors like aircraft and energy. The move follows tensions over Bolsonaro's trial and aims to influence Brazilian politics. Brazil's government has condemned the sanctions, signaling potential retaliation. Despite exemptions, industries like beef and coffee face significant impacts. The tariffs reflect ongoing diplomatic and trade challenges between the US and Brazil.



Trump Imposes 25% Tariff on Indian Goods, Citing High Trade Barriers:-

US President Trump announced a 25% tariff on Indian imports, citing high tariffs and trade barriers. The move aims to pressure India in ongoing trade negotiations. India's government expressed commitment to securing a fair trade deal, emphasizing national interests. The tariff announcement underscores the complexities of Indo-US trade relations, with potential impacts on sectors like textiles and agriculture. The Indian government has responded to US President Trump's recent trade statement, emphasizing its commitment to protecting national interests. Ongoing negotiations aim for a fair bilateral trade agreement.



Pakistan Jails Over 100 Members of Imran Khan's Party for Riots:-

A Pakistani anti-terrorism court sentenced over 100 members of former Prime Minister Imran Khan's party to prison terms for their involvement in the 2023 riots targeting military sites. Sentences range from one to ten years, affecting senior officials and parliamentarians. The government accuses Khan of inciting the protests, which he denies as politically motivated. This ruling is part of a broader crackdown on Khan's party, impacting its parliamentary strength. The PTI party plans to challenge the verdict and organize new protests demanding Khan's release.



CBI Secures Deportation of Fugitive Udit Khullar from UAE:-

The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) successfully deported Udit Khullar, wanted for a Rs 4.55 crore bank fraud, from the UAE. Khullar's deportation was facilitated through INTERPOL cooperation, highlighting international collaboration in combating financial crimes. The case involved fraudulent bank loans obtained with forged documents. The CBI's efforts underscore India's commitment to addressing financial

fraud and strengthening global law enforcement partnerships.



Trump Orders Nuclear Submarines Moved Amid Russia Tensions:-

US President Donald Trump ordered the repositioning of two nuclear submarines following provocative statements from former Russian President Dmitry Medvedev. The move, seen as a rhetorical escalation, underscores heightened US-Russia tensions amid ongoing conflicts in Ukraine. Security analysts noted the strategic importance of nuclear deterrence, while emphasizing the risks of nuclear saber-rattling. The situation highlights the complexities of international diplomacy and security in the nuclear age.



Volcanic Eruption in Russia's Far East Triggers Aviation Alert :-

Russia's Klyuchevskoy Volcano has intensified its eruptive activity, prompting authorities to raise the aviation alert level to red. The volcano, located in the Kamchatka Peninsula, poses a significant threat to international and low-flying aircraft due to potential ash explosions. The eruption follows a recent massive earthquake in the region, leading to concerns about

mudflows and transportation disruptions. The situation highlights the challenges of managing natural disasters and ensuring safety in affected areas.



Tesla Focuses Al Chip Development on Inference Technology:-

Tesla CEO Elon Musk announced a strategic shift to focus on developing inference chips for AI, following reports of disbanding the Dojo supercomputer team. The decision aims to streamline Tesla's AI chip design efforts, optimizing resources for the production of next-generation chips. Australia to Recognize Palestinian State at UN Assembly :-

Australia announced its decision to recognize a Palestinian state during the upcoming United Nations General Assembly, aligning with similar moves by other Western nations. Prime Minister Anthony Albanese emphasized the importance of a two-state solution to end the ongoing conflict. Australia seeks commitments

from the Palestinian Authority for governance reforms, excluding Hamas from any future state. This diplomatic shift aims to support peace efforts in the Middle East, amidst criticism of Israel's expansion policies in Palestinian territories.



Myanmar Announces General Election Phase One for December 28:-

Myanmar will hold the first phase of its general election on December 28, 2025, amid ongoing conflict and international scrutiny. Critics have dismissed the election as a means for the military to consolidate power following the 2021 coup. With 55 political parties registered, the election is expected to be dominated by military-backed candidates. This development underscores the ongoing political turmoil in Myanmar and the international community's concerns over democratic processes and human rights in the country.



Nationwide Protests in Israel Over Gaza War and Hostage Crisis:-

On August 18, 2025, massive protests erupted across Israel, demanding a ceasefire in Gaza and the release of hostages held by Hamas. The demonstrations, among the largest since the conflict began, reflect public

discontent with Prime Minister Netanyahu's military strategies. Protesters, including families of hostages, clashed with police, highlighting the intense domestic pressure to resolve the ongoing conflict. The situation underscores the complex geopolitical dynamics in the region and the urgent need for diplomatic solutions.



Bolivia Faces Historic Election Defeat for Ruling Party:-Bolivia's presidential election on August 18, 2025, saw the ruling Movement for Socialism (MAS) party facing its worst defeat in decades. Centrist senator Rodrigo Paz led with 32.18% of the vote, while MAS candidate Eduardo del Castillo garnered only 3.16%. The results signal a demand for political change amid economic challenges and high inflation. The upcoming runoff in October marks a pivotal moment for Bolivia's political landscape, with potential shifts in governance and policy direction.



Dubai Launches 'One Freezone Passport' to Simplify Business Licensing:-

Dubai has introduced the 'One Freezone Passport,' a unified licensing system allowing companies to operate across all free zones in the emirate under a single license. This initiative aims to reduce costs and simplify operations for investors and entrepreneurs. The reform

supports the Dubai Economic Agenda D33, which targets doubling the emirate's GDP by 2033. By removing administrative barriers, the 'One Freezone Passport' enhances Dubai's business-friendly environment and positions it as a competitive global business hub. The system is expected to attract more foreign direct investment and facilitate business expansion across sectors.



Hurricane Erin Threatens the Bahamas with Dangerous Seas :-

Hurricane Erin, a dangerous Category 4 storm, is approaching the Bahamas, posing a threat of rough seas and prompting evacuation orders in parts of North Carolina. The storm is likely to maintain its force as a major hurricane, with maximum sustained winds of 130 mph. While Erin is not on track to make direct landfall, its size and intensity are causing significant concern. Authorities have warned that the seas could become extremely rough and dangerous during the storm. The situation is being closely monitored, and residents are advised to take necessary precautions to ensure their safety.



PM Modi to Visit Japan and China for Bilateral and Multilateral Engagements:-

Prime Minister Narendra Modi will visit Japan and China from August 29 to September 1, attending the India-Japan Annual Summit and the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) Summit. Discussions will cover strategic partnerships, regional security, and economic cooperation. Modi's visit aims to strengthen India's diplomatic ties and enhance collaboration on global issues, reflecting India's active role in regional and international affairs.



Vietnam Prepares for Impact as Typhoon Kajiki Approaches:-

Vietnam is taking extensive precautions as Typhoon Kajiki nears its coast, with gusts up to 166 km/h. India and Japan to Enhance Strategic Ties during PM Modi's Visit:-



Musk's Legal Battle with OpenAl Over Meta Documents Continues:-

Elon Musk's lawyers seek to prevent OpenAI from accessing Meta documents related to a \$97.4 billion bid. OpenAI claims Musk attempted to involve Mark Zuckerberg in the bid. The legal tussle escalates with OpenAI seeking document disclosures, while Musk's team argues against the relevance of these requests. The case highlights tensions in the tech industry over AI development and ownership.



India Pivots Toward China and Russia Amid Looming U.S. Tariffs:-

Amid escalating trade tensions with the United States, India has intensified diplomatic engagement with both China and Russia. This comes after Washington announced hefty tariffs on Indian exports due to New Delhi's continued imports of Russian oil. India is attempting to balance relations by diversifying trade partners and strengthening ties within the BRICS framework. The development highlights India's strategic approach of multipolar diplomacy, where it seeks to safeguard economic interests while avoiding excessive dependence on any single global power.



India Issues Humanitarian Flood Warning to Pakistan:-

India has issued an urgent flood warning to Pakistan amid heavy monsoon rains, marking the first official bilateral contact in several months. The warning was transmitted through diplomatic channels to alert Pakistani authorities about potential flooding risks due to rising river levels. This gesture underscores the importance of humanitarian cooperation between the two countries, even during periods of political strain. It also reflects India's broader disaster-management responsibilities as an upstream country in South Asia, highlighting how natural calamities can create opportunities for dialogue in otherwise tense bilateral relations.



South Korea's Former First Lady Indicted for Bribery :-

Kim Keon Hee, spouse of South Korea's ousted President Yoon Suk Yeol, faces bribery charges amid broader investigations into the couple's alleged misconduct. Both are detained, with Yoon on trial for insurrection. The indictment adds to Kim's history of controversies, impacting her husband's political party. The unfolding legal proceedings highlight the challenges facing South Korea's political landscape amidst these high-profile cases, with potential implications for future governance reforms.



UN Security Council Extends Lebanon Peacekeeping Mission:

The UN Security Council has extended the UNIFIL peacekeeping mission in Lebanon until 2026, marking its final term. Established in 1978, UNIFIL patrols Lebanon's

border with Israel. This decision aligns with plans for Lebanon to assume sole security responsibility. The extension underscores ongoing regional tensions and the need for stabilized governance in southern Lebanon. The mission's conclusion will require careful transitions to ensure continued peace and security in the area.



Missile Attacks in Ukraine Kill 23, EU HQ Damaged :-

Russia launched missile and drone strikes in Ukraine, resulting in 23 deaths and damage to EU headquarters in Kyiv. The attack, one of the largest since the 2022 invasion, undermines peace efforts led by former US President Donald Trump. Ukrainian President Zelenskiy calls for new sanctions against Russia. The strikes highlight the tense geopolitical climate and the ongoing humanitarian impact, with global diplomatic efforts continuing to seek resolution.

Delhi CM Rekha Gupta Attacked During Public Hearing



ECI Receives 1.4 Lakh Voter Claims in Bihar SIR:-

The Election Commission of India (ECI) has received approximately 1.4 lakh voter claims under Bihar's Special Intensive Revision (SIR). Of these, 14,374 claims have been resolved. The CPI(ML) Liberation party has submitted 10 objections, while other political parties have shown limited engagement. A month-long opportunity remains for voters to file claims and objections. The EC urges eligible voters to ensure their names are correctly listed to maintain robust electoral rolls.



Deadly Landslide Near Vaishno Devi Shrine Kills 32 Pilgrims:-

A massive landslide near the Vaishno Devi shrine in Jammu and Kashmir has claimed the lives of at least 32 pilgrims and injured many others. The incident occurred amid heavy rains, leading to large-scale rescue and relief operations by the National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) and local authorities. The tragedy has raised concerns about environmental degradation,

construction activities in sensitive Himalayan zones, and the need for stricter disaster-risk management strategies in pilgrimage areas.



Relief Operations Continue as Water Recedes in J Floods

Jammu division rivers have receded below danger levels, allowing ongoing relief operations to progress. The Army, NDRF, and local agencies continue efforts to assist flood-affected residents. Educational institutions remain closed, and major highways and rail routes face disruptions due to landslides. The Shri Mata Vaishno Devi pilgrimage is temporarily suspended. Despite challenges, the region anticipates erratic weather until early September, emphasizing the need for continued vigilance and support.

All Accused Acquitted in 2008 Malegaon Blast Case by NIA Court :-

A special NIA court acquitted seven individuals, including BJP MP Sadhvi Pragya Thakur, in the 2008 Malegaon blast case. The verdict, citing lack of evidence, comes after 17 years of legal proceedings. The blast had occurred during Ramzan, killing six and injuring over 100. The case saw extensive investigation, with 323 witnesses examined, but 34 turned hostile. Initially probed by Maharashtra ATS, the case was later handled by NIA, which dropped charges against several accused.



Cabinet Approves ₹11,169 Crore for Railway Multitracking Projects:-

The Indian Cabinet approved four railway multitracking projects totaling ₹11,169 crore, expanding the network by 574 km across six states. These projects aim to alleviate congestion and improve operational efficiency, supporting both freight and passenger services. The initiative aligns with the PM Gati Shakti National Master Plan, emphasizing multi-modal connectivity. The projects are expected to boost economic activity, generate employment, and contribute to India's climate goals by reducing oil imports and CO2 emissions.



Prime Minister Modi to Unveil ₹2,200 Crore Development Projects in Varanasi:-

Prime Minister Narendra Modi will inaugurate and lay the foundation for projects worth ₹2,200 crore in Varanasi on August 2. Prime Minister Narendra Modi is set to inaugurate two significant highway projects in Delhi, valued at approximately ₹11,000 crore, on August 17, 2025. The projects include the Delhi section of the Dwarka Expressway and the Alipur-Dichaon Kalan stretch of Urban Extension Road-II. Mines and Minerals Amendment Bill 2025 Passed to Boost Production :-

The Rajya Sabha has passed the Mines and Minerals Amendment Bill, 2025, promoting sustainable mining and aligning with the National Critical Mineral Mission. The bill enhances transparency, allows mineral trading through exchanges, and facilitates the extraction of deep-seated minerals. INDIA Bloc VP Candidate B Sudershan Reddy Files Nomination:-

B Sudershan Reddy, former Supreme Court Judge and INDIA bloc's Vice-Presidential nominee, filed his nomination in the presence of senior Congress leaders, including Sonia Gandhi and Rahul Gandhi. Reddy emphasized his commitment to constitutional values and parliamentary democracy. The election, scheduled for September 9, 2025, comes after the Vice President's post became vacant. Reddy's candidature is seen as a reaffirmation of the opposition's commitment to protect democratic institutions.



Supreme Court Modifies Stray Dog Policy in Delhi-NCR

The Supreme Court of India has modified its earlier order mandating the confinement of stray dogs in shelters, now allowing their return to original habitats post-sterilization and vaccination, except for rabid or aggressive dogs. This decision aims to balance public safety with animal welfare. The court has directed the Municipal Corporation of Delhi to establish dedicated feeding areas for strays. This ruling comes amid ongoing debates about humane treatment and management of stray dogs across the country.



Key Projects in Kolkata Inaugurated:-

Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated multiple infrastructure projects in Kolkata, including the extension of the Metro Rail network and the Kona Expressway. The findings, due by September 12, will be crucial in determining the facility's adherence to legal and ethical standards.



Ayurveda Day to Be Observed Annually on September 23:-

The Indian government announced that Ayurveda Day will now be celebrated annually on September 23. This change aims to provide a fixed date for global recognition of Ayurveda. The 2025 theme, 'Ayurveda for People Planet,' emphasizes the system's holistic approach to

health and environmental harmony. The initiative seeks to advance Ayurveda's global reach and impact.



Defence Minister Unveils Joint Doctrine for Multi Domain Operations and Technology Roadmap 2025:-

Defence Minister Rajnath Singh has released India's first Joint Doctrine for Multi Domain Operations (MDO) along with the Technology Perspective and Capability Roadmap 2025. The doctrine emphasizes integrating capabilities across land, air, sea, cyber, space, and the cognitive domain to prepare India for modern hybrid warfare. The roadmap outlines the adoption of artificial intelligence, drones, space assets, and advanced communication networks for future wars. This reflects a shift in India's defense policy from traditional combat readiness to technologically driven warfare

preparedness, strengthening coordination among the Army, Navy, and Air Force.



Goldman Sachs Appointed as Transaction Advisor for Government's PSU Bank Stake Sale:-

The Government of India has appointed Goldman Sachs as the sole transaction advisor for its plan to divest up to 5% stake in four public sector banks. This move is part of the larger disinvestment program aimed at generating revenue and increasing efficiency in the banking sector. Malayalam actor and mimicry star Kalabhavan Navas passes away at 51:-

Kalabhavan Navas, a prominent figure in Malayalam entertainment, has passed away at the age of 51. Known for his exceptional mimicry skills and comic timing, Navas began his career at the famed Kalabhavan troupe and later carved out a significant space in film and television. He was widely respected for his impersonations and contributions to stage shows and reality programs, becoming a beloved performer across Kerala. His death marks a major loss to the mimicry and comedy arts community, as he had played a crucial role in popularizing the genre during the 1990s and 2000s.



Acclaimed academician Vasanthi Devi passes away at 87:-

Renowned academician and social reformer Dr. Vasanthi Devi has passed away at the age of 87, leaving behind a rich legacy in education and public service. A former Vice-Chancellor of Manonmaniam Sundaranar University in Tamil Nadu, she was known for her advocacy of women's education, progressive values, and inclusivity in academia. 
Veteran actress Nazima, known for Arzoo, passes away at 77:-

EU Climate Goals Threatened by Ailing Forests, Scientists Warn:-

European forests, crucial for carbon absorption, are under threat from increased logging, wildfires, and pests. A study reveals a significant decline in CO2 absorption by forests, jeopardizing the EU's net-zero emissions target by 2050. The findings highlight the urgent need for sustainable forest management practices. The situation poses a challenge for EU governments negotiating new climate targets, emphasizing the complexity of balancing environmental and economic policies.



DGCA Audit Highlights Findings Across Indian Airlines:

The DGCA's latest audit report revealed operational and safety compliance findings among Indian airlines, with Alliance Air and Air India under scrutiny. The audit categorized findings into two severity levels, highlighting areas for improvement. The DGCA emphasized that these findings reflect the complexity of airline operations rather than safety lapses. The report underscores the importance of regulatory oversight in maintaining aviation safety standards.



Yamuna River Pollution Levels Remain Concerning Despite Progress:-

The Ministry of Jal Shakti reported significant advancements in efforts to clean the Yamuna River in Delhi, but pollution levels continue to exceed permissible limits. The Central Pollution Control Board monitors key locations monthly, revealing that many sewage treatment plants are non-compliant. Despite infrastructure upgrades under the Namami Gange Programme, the river's water quality remains dire, with high Biochemical Oxygen Demand and Faecal Coliform levels. Continued efforts and stricter enforcement are essential to address this critical environmental issue.



India's GST Collections Rise 7.5% in July :-

India's Goods and Services Tax (GST) collections increased by 7.5% in July, reaching Rs 1.96 lakh crore. This rise reflects strong economic activity, driven by higher revenue from domestic transactions and imports. Despite a slower growth pace compared to recent months, GST collections have remained robust, contributing to fiscal stability. The consistent performance underscores the resilience of India's economy and its ongoing recovery post-pandemic.



India's Economy Gains Momentum with Inflation Easing and Export Surge:-

India's economy is witnessing robust growth as inflation eases and exports surge, strengthening its global trade position. CPI inflation dropped to 2.10% in June 2025, driven by lower food prices. Meanwhile, India's exports reached \$210.31 billion in the first quarter of FY 2025-26, reducing the trade deficit by 9.4%. Government initiatives like the Make in India program and infrastructure development are bolstering domestic manufacturing and export competitiveness, positioning India as a significant player in the global economy.



RBI Retains India's GDP Growth Forecast at 6.5% for FY 2025-26:-

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has maintained its GDP growth forecast for India at 6.5% for the financial year 2025-26, citing strong rural demand and government infrastructure spending as key factors. RBI Governor Sanjay Malhotra highlighted the positive impact of a favourable monsoon and lower inflation on the economy. Despite global uncertainties and geopolitical tensions, India's domestic growth remains stable,

supported by robust government capital expenditure and buoyant services and construction sectors.



WHO Applauds India's Study on Nutrition's Impact on TB Outcomes:-

The World Health Organization has recognized a study by the Indian Council of Medical Research on the role of nutrition in improving tuberculosis outcomes. Conducted in Jharkhand, the study provides evidence that enhanced nutrition can prevent TB cases and reduce mortality. WHO calls for increased research and innovation in the South-East Asia Region, which bears a high TB burden. The findings support global efforts to combat TB, emphasizing the need for new tools and equitable access to innovations to achieve the WHO's End TB Strategy goals.



Goldman Sachs Cuts India's Growth Forecast on US Tariff Worries:-

Goldman Sachs has revised India's GDP growth forecast downward for the fiscal year 2025-26, citing concerns over potential U.S. trade tariffs on developing nations, including India. The firm now predicts a growth rate slightly below its earlier estimate, highlighting that uncertainties in global trade, coupled with geopolitical

tensions and protectionist policies, could hamper India's export-driven sectors. The anticipated tariffs may particularly impact technology, textile, and pharmaceutical industries.



World Food Prices Reach Two-Year High, Says FAO:-

The United Nations' Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) reported a rise in global food commodity prices in July, reaching the highest level in over two years. The increase is driven by rising meat and vegetable oil prices, despite declines in cereal, dairy, and sugar prices. The FAO Food Price Index reflects ongoing market dynamics, including strong import demand and supply constraints. The data underscores the need for strategic food security measures in response to global price fluctuations.



Union Minister Highlights Rising Lion Population in India:-

India's Asiatic lion population has reached 891, marking a 32% increase since 2020. Union Environment Minister Bhupender Yadav attributed this success to Prime Minister Narendra Modi's conservation efforts. Celebrating World Lion Day, Yadav emphasized the importance of Project Lion in ensuring the species' survival. The initiative focuses on habitat expansion and

healthcare, reflecting India's commitment to wildlife conservation. The rise in lion numbers is seen as a significant achievement in global wildlife protection.



Inflation Hits 98-Month Low, RBI Rate Cuts Unlikely:-

India's Consumer Price Index (CPI) inflation has reached a 98-month low of 1.55% in July, primarily due to a reduction in food inflation. Despite the decline, further rate cuts by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) this year appear unlikely, given the expected inflation rise to 2.3% in August. The report by State Bank of India highlights the challenges posed by export-oriented sectors and tariffs, which may impact revenue and margins. The bond yield has also risen, indicating market complexities despite low headline inflation.



TRAI Introduces India's First Property Rating for Digital Connectivity:-

The Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI) has launched a Manual for Rating of Properties for Digital Connectivity, establishing a framework to assess buildings' digital readiness. With over 80% of mobile data consumed indoors, this initiative aims to ensure reliable digital access in homes and offices. The manual sets criteria for evaluating connectivity, including fiber readiness and broadband speeds. This move aligns with

India's Digital India vision, recognizing digital connectivity as essential for modern living. It encourages developers to integrate robust digital infrastructure from the design stage, enhancing user experience.



S&P upgrades ratings of 10 financial institutions, including SBI, HDFC Bank:-

Global ratings agency S&P has upgraded the ratings of ten Indian financial institutions, including major players like the State Bank of India (SBI) and HDFC Bank. The upgrade comes on the back of India's improved sovereign rating outlook, strong economic performance, and the resilience of its banking sector. Better capitalization, asset quality, and profitability of top banks have also contributed to this positive revision. The move is expected to boost investor confidence, improve access to international capital markets, and lower borrowing costs for these institutions, strengthening their ability to finance growth in India's economy.



India Upgrades Sovereign Credit Rating to 'BBB':-

S Global has upgraded India's long-term sovereign credit rating to 'BBB' from 'BBB-' and the short-term rating to 'A-2' from 'A-3', citing strong economic fundamentals

and effective monetary policies. This marks the first upgrade since 2007 and reflects confidence in India's ability to sustain growth, manage inflation, and invest in infrastructure. The improved rating is expected to reduce borrowing costs and attract foreign capital, boosting infrastructure development and economic growth.



India Surpasses Japan in Solar Energy Production:-

India has overtaken Japan to become the third-largest solar panel producer, generating 108,494 GWh as per IRENA. This milestone reflects India's commitment to renewable energy, with a current capacity of 119.02 GW and a goal of 500 GW by 2030. Key initiatives like the PM Surya Ghar: Muft Bijli Yojana and solar park developments underscore the country's strategic push towards sustainability. This achievement signifies India's growing leadership in clean energy, contributing to global climate goals and enhancing energy security.



Indian BPO Export Growth Outpaces IT Services:-

A report by Kotak Institutional Equities reveals that Indian BPO services' export growth has outpaced IT services, driven by global clients' focus on cost optimization. The BPO sector, contributing 20% of overall outsourced spends, has grown at a CAGR of 7.8% over FY2015-25. Indian BPO providers are gaining market share with leaner cost structures and outcome-based models. The report highlights opportunities in data annotation and generative AI, while also noting revenue deflation risks for larger incumbents. The trend is expected to sustain in FY2026, despite macroeconomic uncertainties affecting the broader IT sector.



US Tariffs on Indian Goods Expected to Impact American Economy :-

Recent US tariffs on Indian goods could reduce US GDP by 40-50 bps, according to SBI Research. These tariffs are expected to drive inflation above the 2% target until 2026. The move affects sectors like electronics and autos. The Federal Reserve is addressing these inflationary pressures, which are impacting US growth and causing concern among economists about consumer budget pressures.

Over ₹11 Lakh Crore Disbursed to Women SHGs: Shivraj Singh :-

Union Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan announced that over ₹11 lakh crore has been disbursed to women self-help groups (SHGs) under the Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana. The initiative empowers rural women, fostering financial inclusion and self-reliance. With a repayment rate exceeding 98%, the program reflects the success of government efforts. Chouhan highlighted the role of 'Bank Sakhis' in facilitating financial literacy and enhancing SHG-bank linkages.


services like sanitation and drinking water supply. This funding initiative underscores the government's commitment to empowering rural communities and improving the quality of life through strategic investments in local development projects.

incentives for project costs and commercialization efforts. Since its launch, 278 academic institutions and 72 startups have participated.



SpaceX Launches Crew-11 Mission to ISS with International Astronauts:-



The space agency is collaborating with the U.S. Department of Energy and private partners to develop this compact, reliable reactor capable of operating in harsh lunar environments. Unlike solar panels, a nuclear system can provide continuous power during the Moon's 14-day-long nights.



National Seismological Network Expands to 168 Observatories:-

India's National Centre for Seismology has expanded its network to 168 seismic observatories, enhancing the country's earthquake monitoring capabilities. This expansion, facilitated by the Ministry of Earth Sciences, aims to provide real-time data reporting and improve seismic microzonation efforts across various cities. The initiative is part of a broader strategy to enhance disaster preparedness and ensure timely response to seismic activities. The network's growth underscores the importance of scientific infrastructure in mitigating natural disaster risks.




China completes landing and takeoff test for crewed moon lander:-

China has successfully conducted a crucial landing and takeoff test for its crewed lunar lander "Lanyue", marking a significant milestone in its space ambitions. The test was part of preparations for a future manned lunar mission expected in the early 2030s. The prototype module underwent autonomous landing and vertical takeoff at a simulated moon-like environment within a testing facility. This development signals China's increasing technological readiness to join the ranks of nations capable of human moon landings, following the U.S. and former USSR.



Delhi Assembly Becomes India's First Legislature to Run Entirely on Solar Power:-

The Delhi Legislative Assembly has achieved a historic milestone by becoming the first legislative building in India to operate entirely on solar energy. The transformation includes the installation of rooftop solar panels with a generation capacity sufficient to meet the assembly's entire electricity demand. This initiative supports the capital's broader push toward renewable energy and climate resilience. The move is expected to reduce the assembly's carbon footprint significantly and serve as a model for other public institutions.



Bose Institute Discovers 'Pseudo-Intelligence' in Immune Protein:-

Researchers at the Bose Institute discovered that the TAK1 kinase protein, crucial for immune response, exhibits intelligence-like behavior. This protein's intricate atomic interactions allow it to process signals contextually. The study combines biochemistry and machine learning, extending the understanding of molecular behavior. TAK1's ability to sense modifications and trigger responses makes it a potential target for drug

development, offering new therapeutic avenues and deepening insights into protein functions.



Scientists Discover Ancient Wallacean Hominid Artefacts in Indonesia:-

Archaeologists have uncovered stone tools in Sulawesi, Indonesia, suggesting human presence in the Wallacea region 1.5 million years ago. This discovery challenges previous theories of early human migration, indicating that Homo Erectus may have reached Sulawesi much earlier than believed. The artefacts, dated using radioactive tracing, provide new insights into prehistoric human dispersal across islands between Asia and Australia. This finding could reshape our understanding of ancient human migration patterns and capabilities.



China Hosts 'Robot Olympics' Showcasing Al and Robotics Advances:-

China hosted the World Humanoid Robot Games, featuring 280 teams from 16 countries competing in sports and robot-specific challenges. The event highlighted China's advances in AI and robotics, with robots tackling tasks from sports to material handling. The games provide valuable data for developing practical robotic applications, reflecting China's investment in

robotics amid global tech competition. The event underscores China's commitment to leading in AI and robotics as it grapples with an ageing population and technological rivalry.



Study Links Loss of Smell to Early Alzheimer's Detection

New research from DZNE and LMU in Germany suggests that the brain's immune response may explain why a fading sense of smell is an early indicator of Alzheimer's disease. The study found that immune cells attack neuronal fibers linked to odor perception. These insights could help develop methods for early diagnosis and intervention, potentially allowing for comprehensive testing before cognitive decline begins.



Dubai International Airport Launches AI-Powered Immigration Corridor:

Dubai International Airport has unveiled an Al-powered passenger corridor that allows travellers to clear immigration in seconds without presenting documents. This innovative system represents a major advancement in smart travel technology, combining speed, security, and convenience. The Al corridor enables up to 10 passengers to pass through simultaneously using facial

recognition and pre-registered biometric data. Initially rolled out in Terminal 3's First and Business Class lounges, this initiative is part of Dubai's vision of a frictionless travel experience. The AI corridor sets a new global benchmark for biometric border systems, positioning Dubai as a leader in smart travel innovation.



Rapid Antarctic Ice Loss May Be Climate Tipping Point: Scientists:-

A study in Nature highlights rapid changes in the Antarctic environment due to global warming, warning of a tipping point in Earth's climate system. Researchers found a significant decline in sea-ice extent, exacerbating global warming by reducing the planet's ability to reflect solar radiation. The changes threaten local wildlife, including emperor penguins and krill, and may weaken the Antarctic Overturning Circulation, affecting global weather patterns. The study underscores the need to curtail carbon emissions to mitigate further irreversible impacts.



OpenAl to Open First India Office Supporting IndiaAl Mission:-

OpenAI, the creator of ChatGPT, has announced plans to establish its first office in India, reflecting its

commitment to the IndiaAI mission. This move is set to enhance collaboration with the Indian government and support the growing AI ecosystem in the country. OpenAI aims to leverage India's tech talent and developer community to advance AI innovation, with the office expected to bolster OpenAI's services to its significant user base in India, including educators, developers, and professionals.



ISRO Completes Successful Air Drop Test for Gaganyaan Mission:-

The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) has conducted a successful Integrated Air Drop Test for the Gaganyaan human spaceflight mission. The test at Satish Dhawan Space Centre demonstrated the parachute-based deceleration system crucial for safe crew module landing. The collaboration involved the Indian Air Force, DRDO, Navy, and Coast Guard, marking a significant step toward India's first manned space mission.



SpaceX Postpones Starship Launch Due to Weather Conditions:-

SpaceX has delayed the 10th launch of its Starship rocket due to unfavorable weather conditions in Texas. The launch, crucial for SpaceX's Mars mission plans, aims to test the reusable design of the Starship system. Despite technical setbacks, SpaceX continues to advance its development efforts, with the goal of utilizing the rocket for NASA's moon missions and the Starlink satellite

internet business. The delay underscores the challenges of space exploration and the importance of addressing technical and environmental factors in achieving successful launches.

The World Championship of Legends semifinal between India and Pakistan was canceled after India refused to play, citing public sentiment following a terror attack. The decision follows India's earlier forfeit in the group stage. Public anger over the Pahalgam attack has heightened calls to sever sporting ties with Pakistan. The WCL organizers respected both teams' positions, advancing Pakistan to the final. The incident underscores the geopolitical tensions impacting sports diplomacy.



Magnus Carlsen Wins First-Ever Chess Esports World Cup:-

World chess champion Magnus Carlsen has added another title to his illustrious career by winning the inaugural Chess Esports World Cup. This event blended traditional chess with modern digital competition formats, showcasing how esports and classical board games can converge. Carlsen's victory underscores his adaptability beyond classical and rapid formats, solidifying his dominance even in online, fast-paced arenas. The tournament featured global players and was streamed to massive online audiences, highlighting the growing popularity of chess as a spectator e-sport.



South Africa crush Pakistan to win WCL 2025 title :-

South Africa has decisively defeated Pakistan to clinch the 2025 World Cricket League (WCL) title, marking a major triumph for the team in the international cricketing landscape. 
India and South Korea Boost Strategic Partnership:-


Amit Shah Highlights National Security and Development at Kerala Conclave :-

About RBI's Digital Payments Index (DPI):



- Launched by: Reserve Bank of India (RBI) in January 2021
- Purpose: Measures the extent of digital payment adoption across India
- Base Period: March 2018 (Index value = 100)
- Release Frequency: Semi-annually (with a 4-month lag)
- Objective: Track usage, infrastructure, and growth in digital payments
- Key Parameters (with Weightage): These evaluate infrastructure readiness, transaction volume, user adoption, and innovation.
 - 1. Payment Enablers 25%
 - Payment Infrastructure Demand Side 10%

- 3. Payment Infrastructure Supply Side 15%
- 4. Payment Performance 45%
- 5. Consumer Centricity 5%

Growth Highlight:

- RBI-DPI Growth Trends: From 100 in March 2018 to 493.22 in March 2025, the DPI increased by almost five times, indicating India's quick adoption of digital payments.

- Collaborators: British Asian Trust, HSBC India, Michael & Susan Dell Foundation
- Target: Train and place 50,000 youth over 4 years, with 62% women participation
- How it Works:



- Risk Investors: Provide upfront capital to training providers
- Training Providers: Deliver skill training and ensure job placements
- Outcome Funders: Repay investors only if job outcomes are achieved
- Evaluators: Independently assess outcomes via CATI surveys and document verification

Key Features:

- Outcome-Focused Approach: Measures success by certification, placement, and 3-month retention, not just enrolment

New Income Tax Bill, 2025



Why in the News?

Parliament has passed the Income-tax Bill, 2025, replacing the 1961 law with a leaner, simpler version free of redundant provisions and archaic language, effective April 1, 2026.

About New Income Tax Bill, 2025:



- Purpose: Replaces the Income Tax Act, 1961
 after more than 60 years to simplify the law,
 remove redundant provisions, and modernise
 tax administration.
- **Effective Date**: Comes into effect from April 1, 2026.
- **Structural Changes**: Sections reduced from 819 to 536; chapters from 47 to 23.
- Conciseness: Word count cut from 5.12 lakh to 2.6 lakh, with 39 tables and 40 formulas for clarity.
- **New Concept**: Introduces "tax year" defined as April 1 to March 31.

Key Features:

- Refunds: By lifting the previous restriction, refund claims on late returns are restored.
- Clarity of Tax Collected at Source (TCS): Remittances for financial institution-funded schooling under the Liberalized Remittance Scheme (LRS) have no TCS.
- Corporate Tax: Fixes mistakes in the intercorporate dividend deduction for businesses that choose to pay lower taxes.
- Aligning the provisions for Limited Liability Partnerships (LLPs) with current rates is known as Alternate Minimum Tax (AMT) Alignment.
- Zero Tax Withheld at the Source (TDS)
 Certificate: Enables nil-TDS certificate holders
 who are not liable to pay taxes.
- Transfer Pricing: Provides clarification on transfer pricing clauses, loss set-off, and compliance with Section 79 regarding "beneficial owner."
- NPO stands for non-profit organization. Benefit: Extends the exemption beyond anonymous donations to 5% of total donations.
- After municipal taxes, the 30% standard deduction for house property income is clarified.
- Search concept: Maintains the concept of "virtual digital space" to encompass social media accounts, email, and cloud storage.
- Data Handling: Personal digital data found during searches will be handled according to Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs).

Minimum Public Shareholding (MPS)




Why in the News?

SEBI has released a consultation paper proposing changes in Minimum Public Shareholding (MPS) and Minimum Public Offer (MPO) norms for listed companies.

What is Minimum Public Offer (MPO)?

- Meaning: When a company launches an Initial Public Offer (IPO), it must sell a minimum number of shares to the public.
- Analogy: Like a new shop ensuring enough goods are displayed for customers otherwise trading is thin and controlled by a few.

What is Minimum Public Shareholding (MPS)?



 Concept: A company is like a cake. Promoters (founders/owners) usually keep most of it, but SEBI mandates at least 25% must be shared/sold with the public.

Purpose:

- o Broader ownership and participation.
- o Fairer prices by reducing manipulation.
- o Greater accountability of companies.

What SEBI is proposing?

 Flexibility: Large companies find it difficult to release big chunks of shares at once; rules will be eased.

Extended Timelines:

- Companies valued at ₹50,000-1,00,000 crore now get up to 10 years (instead of 5) to meet 25% MPS.
- They must reach 15% in 5 years first, then 25% in 10 years.

 Reduced Burden: For very large companies, the initial Minimum Public Offer (MPO) will be lowered.

Significance of the Move:

• Market Stability: Selling too many shares too quickly is like flooding the market — prices may fall even if the company is strong.

Benefits:

- More big companies will list in India.
- Investors can enter gradually without sudden shocks.
- Encourages fund-raising while maintaining fair trading.

Bird Deaths in Thar Desert

Why in the News?

A new study by the Wildlife Institute of India (WII) reveals that wind farms in the Thar Desert, Rajasthan, have the highest recorded bird mortality rates globally.

Bird Mortality at Wind Farms: Key Findings

- Study Specifics: conducted in Jaisalmer, Rajasthan, over 3,000 square kilometers, encompassing 272 bird species, including the highly endangered Great Indian Bustard, and 90 wind turbines.
- 124 bird carcasses were discovered within 150 meters of the turbines.
- Estimated annual mortality, adjusted for scavenger interference and detection gaps, is 4,464 birds per 1,000 square kilometers.
- Control Sites: 28 locations between 500 and 2,000 meters from turbines had no corpses, proving that turbines were the direct cause.

• Reasons:

 Policy Gap: Onshore wind projects in India do not require Environmental Impact Assessments (EIAs), which weakens ecological safeguards.

India's Wind Energy Growth:

- Present Situation: India increased wind power by 82% year over year in the first half of 2025, adding 3.5 GW.
- The current total installed capacity is 51.3 GW.
- At 150 meters above the ground, the unrealized potential is estimated to be 1163.9 GW (National Institute of Wind Energy).

Comparison with Past Studies:

- **2019 Studies**: Recorded just 0.47 bird deaths per turbine/year in Kutch and Davangere.
- Thar Desert Rate: 1.24 bird deaths per turbine/month — significantly higher.
- Contributing Factors:
 - High bird density in Thar.
 - Location along Central Asian Flyway.
 - Collisions with turbine-linked power lines included in this study.

Proposed Mitigation Measures:

- Technological:
 - Paint one turbine blade for visibility.
 - Shut down turbines during peak migration or high-risk periods.

Planning-Based:

 Selecting a site carefully is seen to be the most important stage.

- AVISTEP (Avian Sensitivity technology for Energy Planning), a technology that maps avian sensitivity throughout India, is used.
- Zones are ranked from low to very high sensitivity by AVISTEP, which is meant to serve as a guide for site avoidance.

India's Lion Population rises to 891



Why in the News?

In 2025, India reported a 32.2% rise in its Asiatic lion population, from 674 in 2020 to 891 in 2025, as per the 16th Lion Population Estimation.

World Lion Day is observed **annually** on **August 10** to promote awareness and action for the conservation of lions worldwide.

About Asiatic Lion:



- Scientific Name: Panthera leo leo subspecies found only in India.
- Historical Range: Once across West Asia & Middle East; now extinct outside India.

- **Physical Trait**: Slightly smaller than African lions; has a unique belly fold.
- **Current Range**: Gir National Park & surrounding Saurashtra areas, Gujarat.
- Past Range in India: Extended to West Bengal and central India (Rewa, Madhya Pradesh).
- Conservation Status:
 - o IUCN Endangered
 - CITES Appendix I
 - Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972Schedule I

2025 Census Highlights:

- Population: 891 lions (+32.2% from 2020).
- Decadal Growth: +70.36% since 2015 (from 523 lions).
- Adult Females: 330 (+26.9% from 2020).
- Satellite Populations: 497 lions in 9 locations new groups in Barda WLS, Jetpur, Babra-Jasdan.
- **Corridor Records**: 22 lions sighted for the first time.

Saltwater Crocodile Population Survey in Sundarhans



Why in the News?

A 2025 survey by the West Bengal Forest Department shows an increase in saltwater crocodile population in the Sundarbans Biosphere Reserve (SBR).

About Saltwater Crocodile (Crocodylus porosus):



- Largest living reptile and the largest of all crocodilians.
- Males grow much larger than females; females usually 2.5–3 m in length.
- Habitat: mangrove forests, swamps, rivers, and coastal waters; tolerant of varying salinity.
- Distribution in India: Odisha, West Bengal (Sundarbans), Andaman & Nicobar Islands.

- Behaviour: Apex predator, feeds on carcasses and diverse prey; communicates through barks, hisses, growls, chirps.
- Conservation Status:
 - o IUCN Red List: Least Concern.
 - CITES: Appendix I (except populations of Australia, Indonesia, PNG → Appendix II).
 - Wildlife Protection Act (1972): Schedule
 I.
- Conservation Efforts: Bhagabatpur Crocodile Project (1976, West Bengal) – breeding and conservation programme; 577 crocodiles released till 2022.

Other Crocodile Species in India:

- Gharial: Critically Endangered; survives in only 2% of former range; Found in small stretches of Chambal and a few other rivers.
- Mugger/Marsh Crocodile: Vulnerable; found in freshwater lakes, rivers, marshes.

National Cooperation Policy (NCP), 2025



Why in the News?

The National Cooperation Policy (NCP) 2025 recently unveiled by Union Home and Cooperation Minister Amit Shah has drawn criticisms from SKM (Samyukt Kisan Morcha).

Also in news:

- A ₹2,000 crore Central Sector Scheme to support the National Cooperative Development Corporation (NCDC) from 2025–2026 to 2028–2029 has also been approved by the Union Cabinet.
- NCDC was established in 1963 as a statutory Corporation under Ministry of Agriculture & Farmers Welfare.

About Cooperatives in India:

 What is it: A cooperative is a voluntary, autonomous association of individuals who unite to meet common economic, social, or cultural needs through a jointly-owned and democratically-controlled enterprise.

• Key Principles:

- One member, one vote: Equal say in governance, regardless of financial contribution.
- Based on collective benefit, democratic control, and mutual aid.

Historical Evolution:

- 1904 & 1912: Cooperative Acts laid the foundation for the cooperative movement in India.
- Post-independence: Emphasis on rural credit, dairy, and agriculture cooperatives (e.g., Amul).
- Key Institutions: NABARD (National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development), NCDC (National Cooperative Development Corporation).

Constitutional & Legal Backing:

- 97th Constitutional Amendment (2011):
 - Article 19(1)(c): Right to form cooperative societies.
 - Article 43B: Directive
 Principle promoting
 cooperative societies.
 - Part IXB (Articles 243ZH to 243ZT): Provides governance framework.
- MSCS Act, 2002: Governs multi-state cooperatives (under Central Registrar).

- 2 lakh new Primary Agricultural Credit
 Societies (PACS) in 5 years
- Scheme convergence: e.g., PM Matsya Sampada Yojana, NPDD
- Inclusive focus: Women, Dalits, Adivasis, youth
- Sector expansion: Into 25+ areas dairy, fisheries, exports, technology
- Education: First cooperative university—Tribhuvan Sahkari University
- Export support: Through National Cooperative Exports Limited (NCEL)
- Digital thrust: Emphasis on digitisation and platform integration

Issues with NCP, 2025:

State Health Regulatory Excellence Index (SHRESTH)



Why in the News?

The Union Health Ministry has launched the State Health Regulatory Excellence Index (SHRESTH), a first-of-its-kind national framework to benchmark and strengthen state drug regulatory systems.

About State Health Regulatory Excellence Index (SHRESTH):

- The goal of the Union Health Ministry's nationwide project is to improve and benchmark state drug regulation frameworks.
- Central Drugs Standard Control Organization (CDSCO) was the developer.
- Goal: Using an open, data-driven framework, benchmark and enhance the performance of


- drug regulatory agencies at the state level throughout India.
- Method: Serves as a virtual gap assessment tool for maturity certification and employs an open, data-driven architecture.



Key Features:

- State Categories: Distribution-focused states/UTs are evaluated on 23 indices, whereas manufacturing states are evaluated on 27 indices.
- Themes for the evaluation include infrastructure, licensing, human resources, surveillance, and responsiveness.
- Data Submission: Scores are shared on the first of the next month after monthly metric data is provided by the 25th.
- Performance Benchmarking: Rankings promote the adoption of best practices and crosslearning.
- Building Capacity: Regulatory audits, cooperative trainings, and workshops to fortify state systems.
- Digital Integration: Dashboards like Not of Standard Quality (NSQ) enable real-time monitoring.
- Global Standards: Building on WHO Maturity Level-3 vaccination status, this supports India's objective of meeting WHO-equivalent medication quality standards.

Animal Birth Control (ABC) Program



Why in the News?

The Supreme Court has recently called returning sterilised stray dogs to the streets under the Animal Birth Control (ABC) Program as "unreasonable and absurd" and ordered they be moved to shelters.

About Animal Birth Control (ABC) Program:

- The goal is to eliminate rabies and manage stray dog populations in a humane and scientifically supported manner.
- The Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act of 1960 established the Animal Birth Control (Dogs) Rules of 2001, which were later amended to become the Animal Birth Control Rules of 2023.
- Development: The World Health Organization (WHO) provided assistance in its creation.
- The "Catch-sterilise-vaccinate-release" concept is the main approach; it forbids culling or relocation.
- Implementation: Under the direction of panchayats, municipalities, and municipal corporations.
- Authorization: Programs may only be carried out by organizations approved by the Animal Welfare Board of India (AWBI).
- Animal Birth Control Rules, 2023:



- Implemented in accordance with the directives of the Supreme Court in Writ Petition No. 691 of 2009.
- gives local organizations (panchayats, companies, and municipalities) the authority to carry out ABC programs for stray dog sterilization and vaccination.
- prohibits moving stray dogs in an attempt to restrict their numbers; instead, they must be sterile and brought back to their original site.
- ABC programs can only be carried out by organizations that have been approved by the Animal Welfare Board of India (AWBI).

Key Features:

- Sterilization Goal: Within a single reproductive cycle (around six months), at least 70% of stray dogs in a given area should be found.
- Focus: 70:30 female-to-male sterilization of females.
- Rabies Control: All sterile dogs must receive the ABC-ARV rabies vaccine.
- Infrastructure: Needed are kennels, veterinary clinics, cars, and clean shelters.
- Recordkeeping: Thorough documentation of capture, operation, immunization, and release.
- Monitoring: Local and state bodies deal with complaints and make sure that regulations are followed.

 Legal Protection: The Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (PCA) Act of 1960 forbids the mass transfer or death of animals.

Supreme Court interventions in Civil— Criminal overlap Cases



Why in the News?

In August 2025, the Supreme Court intervened twice to prevent the misuse of criminal proceedings in essentially civil disputes.

About Civil and Criminal Cases:

- Civil lawsuits, which are primarily controlled by the Code of Civil Procedure, 1908 (CPC), involve disagreements between people or organizations. Resolving rights and obligations is the goal, typically accomplished by injunctions or damages recompense. Examples include disagreements over property, violations of contracts, divorce, child custody, and money recovery.
- Crimes against society or the state are the subject of criminal trials. Punishment and deterrence are the goals. The state prosecutor started it. Stealing, cheating, assault, and murder are a few examples.
- Burden of proof:
 - Civil cases: Decided on a preponderance of probabilities (more likely than not).
 - o **Criminal cases:** Guilt must be proven *beyond reasonable doubt*.
- Dual Cases: Certain actions may result in both criminal and civil liability. Prior to engaging in a business or personal relationship, dual proceedings require evidence of criminal intent.

 Schedules: According to data from the National Judicial Data Grid (2025), many criminal cases are resolved in less than a year, whereas civil cases take an average of 4.91 years.

Recent Supreme Court Actions:



- Rajasthan plywood dispute case (Aug 13, 2025): SC held there was no criminal breach of trust in a simple sale transaction. Denial of prearrest bail by the High Court was overturned.
- Allahabad HC case (Aug 4, 2025): SC criticised a
 judge for allowing criminal proceedings in a
 business transaction dispute, calling it a
 "mockery of justice". The judge was temporarily
 barred from handling criminal cases, later
 reinstated after CJI intervention.
 - The SC clarified that civil disputes cannot be turned into criminal prosecutions unless fraud or criminal intent is clearly shown.

"Anna-Chakra" Supply Chain Optimisation Tool for Public Distribution System

Why in the News?

The Union Minister of State for the Ministry of Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution has provided crucial information regarding the Anna-Chakra Tool to the Parliament.

About Anna-Chakra:



- Purpose: Digital tool to optimise supply chain of the Public Distribution System (PDS).
- Developed by: World Food Programme (WFP) and Foundation for Innovation and Technology Transfer (IIT-Delhi).
- Implementation: Adopted in 30 States/UTs, except Manipur.
- Coverage: Supports 4.37 lakh Fair Price
 Shops and 6,700 warehouses.
- Savings: Reduces logistics/fuel costs, saving about ₹250 crore annually.
- Environmental Impact: Route optimisation reduces travel distance by 15–50%, cutting CO₂ emissions.

Public Distribution System (PDS) in India:

- Objective: Provides subsidised food grains to poor households, ensuring food security.
- History: Originated in inter-war years; expanded after 1960s food shortages.
- Reforms: Revamped PDS (1992) extended coverage to rural and poverty-prone areas.
- Structure:
 - Centre (FCI) procurement, storage, transportation, bulk allocation.

- States distribute food grains to families via Fair Price Shops.
- Coverage: Serves ~800 million people through 5 lakh+ Fair Price Shops.
- Items Distributed: Wheat, rice, sugar, kerosene; some states add pulses and oils.
- **Significance**: Shields poor households from food price shocks and economic distress.

'Creamy Layer' condition in OBC Quota



Why in the News?

The government is considering measures to ensure uniform application of the 'creamy layer' condition in OBC reservations across central and state government jobs, public sector enterprises, universities, and autonomous bodies.

About the Concept of Creamy Layer:



- Origin: Emerged from Indra Sawhney vs Union of India (1992); excluded affluent Other Backward Class (OBC) groups from reservations.
- 1993 DOPT Rules: Defined creamy layer children of Group A/Class I officers, earlypromoted officials, Group B parents, senior

armed forces, high constitutional functionaries, professionals, traders, and large landowners.

- Income Criteria:
 - Ceiling: ₹1 lakh in 1993, revised to ₹8 lakh in 2017.
 - Exclusions: Salary and agricultural income not counted.

2004 Clarification & Implementation Issues:

- Clarification: DoPT directed separate assessment of salary and other income (except agriculture).
- Rule: If either exceeded limit (₹2.5 lakh then) for 3 consecutive years → creamy layer.
- **Problem**: Poor enforcement (2004–14) due to political sensitivities; stricter checks after 2014.
- Impact: Between CSE 2015–23, over 100 OBC caste certificates rejected under new interpretations.

Equivalence Efforts:

- Consultations: Involved Social Justice, Education, Law, Labour Ministries, DoPT, NITI Aayog, NCBC.
- Goal: Standardise creamy layer rules across universities, Public Sector Undertakings (PSUs), and autonomous bodies.
- Proposal: Retrospective relief suggested by Home Minister Amit Shah and NCBC.

Key Proposals Under Consideration:

- University Teachers: Salaries start at Group Aequivalent → children to be creamy layer.
- Autonomous Bodies: Posts aligned with central pay scales.
- Non-Teaching Staff: Categorisation based on equivalence with government jobs.
- PSU Executives: Already included since 2017; those ≤₹8 lakh excluded.
- Aided Institutions: Staff categorised based on parity with govt. employees.

Likely Beneficiaries:

• **Lower Govt. Staff**: Children of employees earning just above ₹8 lakh gain most.

- Correction of Anomalies: Ensures parity between teachers and aided staff.
- State PSU Issues: Fixes cases like fuel pump attendants in PSUs being declared creamy layer.
- **Private Sector**: No change; creamy layer based only on income/wealth criteria.

Census 2027 and Urban Area Definition



Why in the News?

The Registrar General of India (RGI) has announced that the same definition of "urban area" used in Census 2011 will be retained in Census 2027 to ensure comparability of data and analysis of urbanisation trends.

Background and Urbanisation Trends:

- Census 2011 Data: India's population was 121 crore 68.8% rural (83.3 crore) and 31.2% urban (37.7 crore).
- **Trend**: Urban share grew from 17.3% in 1951 to 31% in 2011, showing rapid urbanisation.
- Units: 6,40,867 villages and 15,870 urban units recorded in 2011.

Definition of Urban Area:



- Statutory Towns: Include municipal corporations, nagar palikas, town panchayats, cantonment boards, and notified town area committees.
- Census Town Criteria:
 - Minimum population of 5000;
 - Population Density ≥ 400 persons per sq. km;
 - Workforce: ≥ 75% of male workers in non-agricultural activities.
- District HQs: Headquarters not legally notified as towns will be Census Towns only if they meet criteria.
- Exclusions: Plantations and orchards outside statutory towns will not be treated as "forests" under this definition.

Special Features of Census 2027:

- Caste Data: For the first time, caste enumeration included (approved April 2024).
- Worker Classification: Male agricultural workers (cultivators, labourers, livestock, forestry,

- fishing, hunting, plantations) excluded when calculating non-agricultural engagement.
- Error Correction: Grouping multiple villages into one Census Town discontinued; identification now at village level.

Preparatory Work and Timelines:

- Jurisdiction Updates: All changes in villages/towns/wards updated till 31 December 2025.
- Boundary Freeze: Administrative boundaries fixed on 1 January 2026.
- Village Review: Villages with 4,000+ population in 2011 re-examined to meet 5,000 threshold by 2027.
- Phases:
 - Houselisting & Housing Census (HLO) –
 April 2026.
 - Population Enumeration (PE) –
 February 2027.

History

Piprahwa Relics of Buddha



Why in the News?

The Union Culture Ministry has successfully retrieved the sacred 'Piprahwa' Buddhist relics, which were set to be auctioned in Hong Kong.

About the Piprahwa Relics:



- Discovery: Unearthed in 1898 by William Claxton Peppe, a British engineer, at Piprahwa (Siddharthnagar, Uttar Pradesh), near the Nepal border.
- Historical Significance: Identified as ancient Kapilavastu, capital of the Shakya republic, where Prince Siddhartha (Buddha) lived before renunciation.

- Findings at the Site: A buried stupa yielded a large stone coffer containing:
 - Bone fragments believed to be Buddha's relics
 - Caskets made of soapstone and crystal
 - A sandstone coffer
 - Over 1,800 ornaments: pearls, rubies, sapphires, gold sheets

• Legal Custody:

- The British Crown claimed the relics under the Indian Treasure Trove Act, 1878.
- Most artifacts were transferred to the Indian Museum, Kolkata.

Stupas with Buddha's Relics:

- A Brahmin by the name of Drona oversaw the dispersal of the Buddha's cremated remains, which were split among eight kingdoms upon his death (Mahaparinirvana).
- In order to preserve their portion of the relics, each recipient constructed a stupa, establishing significant pilgrimage destinations and the first places of worship for Buddhists.
- Rajagriha, Vaishali, Kapilavastu, Allakappa, Ramagrama, Vethadipa, Pava, Kushinagar, and Pippalivana were the locations of the nine stupas.
- Relics from these stupas were dispersed to thousands of other stupas around the empire by Emperor Ashoka in the third century BCE.
- Because it is thought to have remained intact and still contain the original relics, the stupa at Ramagrama is special.
- A hemispherical mound (anda), a square railing (harmika), a central pillar (yashti) with umbrellas (chatra), and a circumambulatory road (pradakshinapatha) were all common features of early Buddhist stupas.

Red Fort as the Venue for Independence Day



Why in the News?

On August 15, 2025, Prime Minister delivered the longest **Independence Day speech (103 minutes)** from the Red Fort, continuing a tradition started by Jawaharlal Nehru in 1947.

The fort's choice as the venue reflects its historic role as Delhi's seat of power and symbol of sovereignty.

About the Red Fort:

- Construction: Constructed in 1648 as the palace fort of Shahjahanabad, the new capital of the Mughal emperor Shah Jahan.
- Material: Royal pavilions and apartments surrounded by enormous walls of red sandstone.
- The Nahr-i-Behisht, also known as the "Stream of Paradise," was a continuous water channel that was contained within this water feature.
- Architectural Value: A superb illustration of Mughal architecture that combines Indian workmanship with Islamic customs.
- In 2007, it was designated as a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Historical Significance of Delhi and Red Fort:

- Delhi's role: Babur considered Delhi to be the "capital of all Hindustan," and it served as the seat of power for almost a millennium.
- Shahjahanabad: The Red Fort is at the heart of this 1648-opened city.
- Delhi remained central even after the fall of the Mughals, and the East India Company produced coins bearing the emperor's name as a symbol of sovereignty.

1857 Revolt and British Authority:

- Revolt Center: Sepoys in Delhi proclaimed Bahadur Shah Zafar as their leader.
- Following the fall of Delhi, Zafar was banished and Mughal empire came to an end.
- Fort Damage: About 80% of the inside of Red Fort was destroyed when the British turned it into a military post.
- Imperial Authority: Before the capital moved from Calcutta to Delhi in 1911, the Delhi Durbars (1877, 1903, 1911) established British rule.

Significance of Red Fort for Independence Day:

- Nationalist fervor was sparked by the 1946 INA Trials, which were held in Red Fort.
- 1947 Ceremony: On August 15, 1947, Jawaharlal Nehru delivered the inaugural Independence Day speech and raised the national flag.
- Tradition: Ever since, each prime minister has raised the flag and spoken to the country from the ramparts.
- Symbolism: Previously marked by colonial power, the location is now reclaimed as a representation of Indian independence.

British Conquest of Sindh



Why in the News?

The British conquest of Sindh in the 1840s was a key step in colonial expansion, reminding us that regions like Sindh, Punjab, and Bengal came under British rule long before the 1947 partition of India and Pakistan.

British Conquest of Sindh:

- Following the battles of Dubbo and Miani, the British seized Sindh in 1843.
- Hosh Muhammad Sheedi, a general in the Talpur army and a Siddi of African descent, commanded the fight.
- In northwest India, his disobedience represented the first significant armed opposition to British expansion.

Political Background in Sindh:

- Mian Yar Muhammad Kalhoro founded the Kalhora Dynasty (1701–1779), which the Mughals acknowledged and which reigned over northern and central Sindh. prosperous time, but internal conflicts made it weaker.
- The Baloch Talpurs toppled Kalhoras during the Talpur Dynasty (1779–1843), consolidating Sindh under clan authority at Hyderabad and Khairpur.
- In terms of geopolitics, Sindh was situated at the intersection of the British, French, and Russian rivalries (The Great Game). Russia's expansion through Afghanistan and Iran alarmed Britain.
- British Entry: After storming Manora Fort, the East India Company forced treaties on the Talpurs and took Karachi in 1839.

British Advance and the Fall of Sindh:



- Mir Nasir Khan Talpur, near Hyderabad, was vanquished by the British, led by Sir Charles Napier, in the Battle of Miani (17 February 1843).
- On March 24, 1843, Hosh Muhammad Sheedi formed an alliance with Mir Sher Muhammad

Talpur of Mirpur Khas in the Battle of Dubbo. "Marvesoon par Sindh na desoon" (I may die but will not give up Sindh) was Sheedi's war cry. He died while in action.

- British Annexation: Sindh was incorporated into the Bombay Presidency following Dubbo. The Talpur era came to an end.
- Aftermath: All of northwest India came under British control after Punjab was acquired in 1849, within ten years.

Legacy of Hosh Muhammad Sheedi:

- Of African-Siddi heritage, she was born into the Talpur kings' household.
- Indian and British chroniclers both praised valor.
- became a Sindhi folk hero who is revered by both Muslims and Hindus.
- His legacy emphasizes the Siddi community's resistance to colonialism and is fundamental to Sindh's cultural memory.

Women Revolutionaries of Bengal



Pritilata Waddedar:

- Early Years: born in Chittagong on May 5, 1911.
 one of the first female Bengali leaders of a militant armed group.
- Education: Became a teacher after earning a philosophy degree from Bethune College in Kolkata.
- Inspiration: Joined Deepali Sangha after being influenced by women's action and revolutionary literature.
- Role: Gathered jail intelligence by assuming the identities of relatives, collected bomb cases, and distributed leaflets.

 Legacy: Known as a daring martyr, she left a suicide note outlining her reasons.

Kalpana Datta:

- Early Years: Born in Sripur, Chittagong, in 1913; attended Bethune College before becoming a member of the Chhatri Sangha.
- Activities: Arrested a week prior to the European Club attack; carried out reconnaissance before the attack.
- Later Role: In 1939, after being sentenced to life in prison, he participated in a bombing attempt to rescue Surya Sen.
- After gaining release, he became a leader of the Communist Party and prioritized social engagement.

Bina Das:

- Early Life: Kamala Das Gupta provided a handgun for the attempted assassination of Governor Stanley Jackson in 1932 when he was 21 years old.
- Networks: A member of covert student revolutionary groups.
- Court Statement: Well-known for her fervent appeal for resistance in front of the Calcutta High Court.

Begum Rokeya Sakhawat Hossain:

- Early Life: Pioneer of women's rights and education; born on December 9, 1880.
- Writings: envisioned a feminist utopia in "Sultana's Dream" (1908).
- Institutions: established the Muslim Women's Association in 1916 and the first Muslim girls' school in Kolkata.
- Activism: Promoted education, contested purdah, and led women's conferences.

Kamala Das Gupta:

- Early Life: Born in Dhaka, I earned my master's degree in history from Kolkata. Gandhian at first, he later joined Jugantar.
- Role: Arrested several times; provided resources, guns, and sanctuary.

- Connection: Provided a gun to Bina Das during her attempted murder.
- Legacy: Oversaw refugee relief and vocational training; authored "Rakter Akshare" and "Swadhinata Sangrame Nari."

Nanibala Devi:

- Early Life: Spied for intelligence in prisons while posing as the wife of a rebel.
- End: Though impoverished, he served as a symbol of bravery and tenacity.

Labanya Prabha Ghosh:

- Early Life: Born in Purulia on August 14, 1897.
- Contribution: Aided in the founding of Shilpashram, a gathering place for revolutionary figures like C.R. Das and Subhas Bose.

- Political Role: Edited and authored nationalist publications; was Purulia's first female MLA.
- Later Activism: Started campaigns for poor people's justice and land rights.

Matangini Hazra ("Gandhi Buri"):

- Early Life: Poor and widowed at a young age, she was born in Hogla village, Midnapore, in 1870.
- Freedom Struggle: Participated in the Salt Satyagraha, opposed the Chowkidari tax, and was detained for producing salt.
- Repression: Serving the sick during epidemics; being beaten and imprisoned.
- Martyrdom: Held the tricolor to his death and was killed by police bullets while leading the Quit India rally in 1942.

Gaza War Impact on IMEC



Why in the News?

India's National Security Council Secretariat recently hosted envoys from the US, UAE, Saudi Arabia, France, Italy, Germany, Israel, Jordan, and the EU to review progress on the India–Middle East–Europe Economic Corridor (IMEC).

About IMEC Project:



- A component of the Partnership for Global Infrastructure and Investment (PGII), which aims to improve connectivity in underdeveloped nations.
- At the G20 New Delhi Summit on September 10, 2023, an MOU was inked.
- Participants include the US, Saudi Arabia, France, Germany, Italy, India, the UAE, and the European Union.
- Goal: To increase transportation efficiency, lower prices, generate employment, reduce greenhouse gas emissions, and fortify economic unity, Asia, the Middle East, and Europe should be integrated.

Structure:

- East Corridor: India to Arabian Gulf.
- Northern Corridor: Gulf region to Europe.

Key Ports:

- India Mundra, Kandla, Jawaharlal Nehru Port (Mumbai).
- Middle East Fujairah, Jebel Ali, Abu Dhabi, Dammam, Ras Al Khair.
- o Israel Haifa.
- Europe Piraeus, Messina, Marseille.

• Infrastructure includes: Railway links, ship-torail hubs, roads, electricity cables, hydrogen pipelines, and high-speed data cables.

Impact of Gaza War:

- Work that is derailed: Stakeholder discussions were disrupted by conflict in late 2023, which also halted construction on the western portion (Middle East–Europe).
- Normalization between Saudi Arabia and Israel has halted, while Jordan-Israel relations are at an all-time low.
- Unified operational planning is hampered by regional rivalries, such as the trade rivalry between Saudi Arabia and the Ukraine.

Significance:

- Economic: India's biggest trading partner is the EU; the corridor promises cheaper, quicker, and emission-free trade.
- Strategic: Establishes India as a link between Europe and the Middle East and enhances its standing in West Asia.
- Energy and Technology: Possibilities for data cable connections, electricity, and clean hydrogen pipelines.
- Resilience: Offers a substitute for Red Sea shipping lanes that are susceptible to interruptions.

Nominations to J&K Assembly



Why in the News?

The Union Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) informed the J&K High Court that the Lieutenant-Governor (L-G) can nominate five members to the J&K Legislative Assembly without the aid and advice of the elected government.

About Nominations in State Assemblies:

- Election Mode: Single-member constituencies are the primary source of direct elections for members.
- Smaller States/UTs like Sikkim, Goa, Mizoram, and Puducherry have fewer members with parliamentary approval; the assembly size ranges from 60 to 500.
- Anglo-Indian Nomination: The 104th Constitutional Amendment Act, 2019 eliminated

- the practice of governors nominating one Anglo-Indian member if they were underrepresented (effective January 2020).
- Nominated members have the same rights and responsibilities as elected members, with the exception of issues requiring a direct election mandate.
- Prevalence: Only under specific constitutional or legal restrictions are most states permitted to have nominated members.
- Parliamentary Nomination Abolition: The 104th Amendment also eliminated Anglo-Indian nominations in the State Assemblies (1) and Lok Sabha (2).
- Legislative Council Distinction: In Vidhan Parishads, the governors appoint one-sixth of the members from the fields of social service, science, literature, art, and cooperatives.

Exceptions for Jammu & Kashmir:

- Special Provision: Under J&K Reorganisation Act, 2019 (amended 2023), the Lieutenant-Governor can nominate:
 - o **Women**: 2 women if under-represented.
 - Migrants: 2 Kashmiri migrants (including 1 woman).

- PoJK Community: 1 member from Pakistan-occupied J&K community.
- Seat Structure: Nominated members are in addition to elected members; Assembly = 114 elected + nominated (24 PoJK seats vacant).

Legal Basis in J&K:

- Statutory Provision: Sections 15, 15A, 15B of J&K Reorganisation Act, 2019 (amended 2023) grant L-G nomination powers.
- MHA Clarification:
 - Nature of Power: Statutory function at L-G's discretion, without elected government's aid/advice.
 - Precedent: Similar powers under Union Territories Act, 1963 (e.g., Puducherry).
 - Counting Rule: Nominated members are part of sanctioned Assembly strength.
- Purpose: To ensure representation for displaced communities, marginalized groups, and women.

Section 152 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS)



Why in the News?

The Supreme Court has raised a key question—whether the "potentiality of abuse" of Section 152 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS), which punishes acts endangering the sovereignty, unity, and integrity of India, could be a ground to declare the provision unconstitutional.

About Section 152 BNS:



- **Deals with**: Acts endangering sovereignty, unity, and integrity of India.
- Origin: Introduced in the Bharatiya Nyaya
 Sanhita, 2023, effective 1 July 2024, replacing Section 124A IPC (sedition).
- **Scope**: Criminalises purposeful or knowing acts that:
 - Excite secession, armed rebellion, or subversive activities.
 - Encourage separatist feelings.
 - Endanger sovereignty, unity, or integrity of India.
- Means Covered: Words (spoken/written), signs, visible representation, electronic communication, financial means, or any other method.
- Punishment: Life imprisonment or imprisonment up to 7 years + fine.
- Nature of Offence: Cognizable, non-bailable, triable by Court of Session.
- Exception Clause: Lawful criticism of government measures to seek change—without inciting rebellion/secession—is not an offence.
- Key Difference from Section 124A IPC: Focus shifted from "disaffection against Government" to direct threats against the nation's unity and sovereignty, with explicit recognition of digitalera methods.

Issues with Section 152 BNS:

 Possibility of Abuse: General and arbitrary phrases such as "endangering sovereignty" can be abused to disparage journalism, activism, and political dissent.

- Vagueness: Concepts that lack definitions, such as "sovereignty" in speech, lead to ambiguity and allow for arbitrary interpretation by authority.
- Comparable to the Sedition Law: Although it has been reworded, its fundamental impact is similar to that of Section 124A IPC, which is being challenged as unconstitutional for restricting free speech.
- Effect of Chilling on Free Expression: Risk of selfcensorship among people, activists, and journalists because they are afraid of being prosecuted.
- High Punishment and Cognizability: Severe punishments and warrantless arrests increase the likelihood of harassment prior to judicial review.
- Digital Surveillance Issues: Investigative reach into private digital activities may be expanded by explicit covering of financial resources and electronic communication.
- Judicial Burden: To strike a balance between state security and freedom of speech under Article 19(1)(a), courts will have to interpret the legislation several times.

When can Courts order a Recount of Votes?



Why in the News?

The Supreme Court for the very first time has recounted EVM votes on its premises and overturned a Haryana sarpanch election result.

Legal Framework for Challenging Election Results:

- Parliamentary, Assembly, State Council elections: Validity can be challenged by filing an election petition in the High Court of the state where the election was held.
- Local government elections: Petitions must be filed at district-level civil courts.
- Eligibility to file: Only a candidate or elector related to the election can file.
- Timeframe: Petition must be filed within 45 days of result declaration.
- Petition requirements:
 - Must contain concise statement of material facts.
 - Allegations of "corrupt practices" must include names of individuals, dates, and locations.

Judicial Approach:

- SC considers corrupt practices as quasicriminal, requiring high standard of proof.
- Vague or ambiguous petitions are dismissed.

• Legal Basis:

- Representation of the People Act, 1951.
- State Panchayat Raj Acts.

Grounds for Invalidating an Election:



Courts can void an election on:

- Bribery or undue influence, e.g., hiding criminal antecedents or promoting enmity.
- Candidate disqualified/unqualified on the election date.
- Improper rejection of nomination paper.

- Improper acceptance of nomination or improper reception/rejection of votes, if shown to materially affect results.
- Non-compliance with Constitution or election laws/rules, if it materially impacted the outcome.


When can Courts order Recount of Votes?

- A recount is a possible judicial remedy but not granted lightly.
- Seen as affecting vote secrecy, which is vital to free and fair elections.
- Courts order recounts only if:
 - Petitioner presents specific material facts.
 - Evidence shows a prima facie case of probable counting error.
 - Recount is deemed necessary for justice.
- Normally conducted at election location.
- Exception: Panipat case, where SC recounted votes in its own premises.

Can Courts declare a new Winner?

- Rare, but courts can declare a new winner if:
 - Evidence shows petitioner (or another candidate) actually had majority of valid votes.
 - Or petitioner proves they would have won but for votes gained through corrupt practices.
- Requires concrete, quantifiable evidence of tainted votes.
- Example: In Feb 2024 Chandigarh mayoral election, SC declared a new winner after:
 - Presiding officer wrongly invalidated 8 paper ballots.
 - All votes had been cast for the losing candidate.
 - SC restored them as valid, making the losing candidate the winner.


Office of the Chief Election Commissioner (CEC)



Why in the News?

The Opposition (INDIA bloc) is considering moving a motion of removal of the Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) in Parliament.

About Election Commission of India (ECI):



- Establishment: On January 25, 1950 (National Voters Day), a permanent constitutional body was established.
- Articles 324–329 of Part XV of the Constitution serve as the constitutional foundation.
- Mandate: Holds elections for the President and Vice President positions, the State Legislative Assemblies, the Lok Sabha, and the Rajya Sabha.
- Structure: consists of two Election Commissioners and the Chief Election Commissioner (CEC), and has operated as a three-member body since 1993.
- Status of CEC: CECs enjoy the same benefits, status, and pay as Supreme Court of India judges.

Appointment to ECI:

Law: The 1921 Act was superseded by the 2023
 Chief Election Commissioner and Other Election

- Commissioners (Appointment, Conditions of Service, and Term of Office) Act.
- The Indian President is the appointing authority.
- The Prime Minister (Chairperson), the Leader of the Opposition in the Lok Sabha, and a Union Cabinet Minister chosen by the Prime Minister comprise the selection committee.
- Eligibility: Must have worked for the Indian government as a secretary-level official with a track record of honesty and election administration.

 Tenure: six years or until the age of sixty-five, whichever comes first.

Removal:

- CEC: Removed due to proven misconduct or incapacity, similar to a Supreme Court judge (Article 324(5)). requires a presidential decree and a motion approved by a two-thirds majority in both houses of parliament.
- Only on the Chief Election Commissioner's recommendation were the other election commissioners removed.


Tsunami Waves triggered by quakes in Kamchatka Peninsula

Why in the News?

An 8.8 magnitude earthquake hit off Russia's Kamchatka Peninsula, triggering 16-foot tsunamis that reached Hawaii and northern California in the US.



About Earthquakes:

- **Overview:** Sudden ground shaking caused by **release of stored energy** in Earth's crust due to tectonic stress.
- Cause: Occurs when tectonic plates slip at fault lines where stress had built up due to friction.
- Seismic Waves: Energy travels as:
 - Primary Waves (P-waves): Fastest, compressional.
 - Secondary Waves (S-waves): Slower, shear motion.

Key Terms:

- Focus (Hypocenter): Underground origin point.
- Epicenter: Surface point directly above the focus.

Measurement:

- Magnitude: Energy released (Richter Scale, logarithmic).
- Intensity: Observed ground shaking (varies by location).
- Seismograph: Records seismic wave activity.

How Earthquakes Trigger Tsunamis?

- Underwater Epicenter: Must occur beneath oceans to displace water.
- **Shallow Depth:** Quakes at <70 km transfer energy more efficiently to water surface.

- Reverse Faulting: One tectonic plate pushes over another, vertically shifting the seafloor.
- Rapid Displacement: Sudden seafloor uplift/downthrust generates massive water waves.
- High Magnitude: Quakes >7.0 (especially >8.0) likely to trigger tsunamis.

About the Kamchatka Region:

- **Overview:** Russian Far East; borders the North Pacific Ocean.
- **Tectonic Zone:** Sits on the Kuril-Kamchatka Trench—**Pacific Plate subducting under Okhotsk Plate** at ~86 mm/year.
- **Seismic Hotspot:** Historical major quakes in 1841, 1923, 1952, 2006, and 2020.
- Ring of Fire: Part of the 40,000 km Pacific Ring of Fire, known for quakes and volcanoes.
- 2025 Earthquake:
 - Depth:3 km (shallow)
 - Impact: Triggered tsunami waves up to 16 ft—one of the strongest earthquakes since 1900.

Human Outer Planet Exploration (HOPE)



Why in the News?

India has taken a significant step towards interplanetary human missions with the launch of the Human Outer Planet Exploration (HOPE) analogue station at Tso Kar, Ladakh.


About HOPE (Human Outer Planet Exploration):

- Purpose: Simulates Moon and Mars conditions to prepare for future human missions.
- Developer: Built by Protoplanet (Bengaluru); partially funded by ISRO.
- Location: Tso Kar, Ladakh (14,500 ft) chosen for its lunar/Martian-like terrain.
- Features: Enables isolation research, tech trials, and crew training; 1 of 33 such stations globally.
- First Mission (2025): Two scientists (Rahul Mogalapalli, Yaman Akot) conducted a 10-day simulation focusing on resilience and mental health.
- Significance:
 - Boosts India's human spaceflight readiness.
 - Supports goals like Bharatiya Antariksh
 Station (2035) and Moon mission
 (2040).

India's Astronomical Assets in Ladakh:

- Location: Indian Astronomical Observatory (IAO), at Mt. Saraswati (4,500 m), Hanle; run by Indian Institute of Astrophysics.
- Key Instruments:
 - Himalayan Chandra Telescope (optical/infrared)
 - HAGAR (gamma rays, with Tata Institute of Fundamental Research)
 - MACE (Cherenkov telescope, with Bhabha Atomic Research Centre)

Al-designed Proteins to generate Immune Cells



Why in the News?

Harvard Scientists have recently used AI to design synthetic proteins that activate T Cells, offering a new path for cancer treatment and vaccine development.

What are T Cells?

- They are a type of white blood cell that play a central role in the immune system.
- Types of T Cells:
 - Helper T cells (CD4+): Activate and direct other immune cells.
 - Killer T cells (CD8+): Destroy infected or cancerous cells.
 - Memory T cells: "Remember" past invaders for faster response in the future.

About the Study:

- Created soluble proteins that trigger "Notch Signaling," a crucial immunological route, using artificial intelligence (AI).
- These artificial molecular activators were created with the use of cutting-edge Al-powered protein design methods.
- These proteins function both in the lab and inside the body (in vivo), in contrast to previous lab-only techniques.
- The generation of T lymphocytes from human progenitor cells was significantly increased as a result.

What is Notch Signalling?

- Signaling network that runs from cell to cell and directs cell growth.
- Essential for producing T lymphocytes, which combat cancer and infections.
- Previously, there was no trustworthy therapeutic activator.

Key Benefits Offered:

- Mass T Cell Generation: Meets clinical needs for CAR T Cell Therapy.
- Vaccine Support: Boosted Memory T cells in mice, improving long-term immunity.
- **Cancer Therapy**: Helps fight immunesuppressive tumour environments.
- **Scalable & Soluble**: Works in humans, not just in lab dishes.
- Al in Medicine: Shows Al's growing role in designing immune therapies.

Why in the News?

The World Health Organization (WHO) has reclassified hepatitis D virus (HDV) as carcinogenic, following the International Agency for Research on Cancer (IARC) assessment based on data from The Lancet Oncology.

About Hepatitis D:



- What is it: Hepatitis D is a serious liver infection caused by the hepatitis D virus (HDV).
- Cause: Hepatitis D virus (HDV), an incomplete virus needing hepatitis B virus (HBV) for replication.
- Infection Types:
 - Co-infection HDV + HBV at the same time.
 - Superinfection HDV infects someone already with HBV.
- Transmission: Parenteral exposure (injections, transfusions), mother-to-child, sexual contact.
- Diagnosis: Blood tests for HDV antibodies and HDV-RNA.
- Prevention: HBV vaccination, safe blood practices, safe sex, screening, avoid needle sharing.

Why Hepatitis D is Carcinogenic?

- Damages the liver more severely than HBV by itself.
- Compared to HBV-only cases, the risk of liver cancer is increased two to six times when HBV and HDV co-infection occurs.
- Within 15 years, up to 75% develop cirrhosis.
- can result in cancer even in the absence of cirrhosis because of HDV-induced damage and HBV DNA integration.

Hepatitis

- Definition: Liver inflammation from viruses, alcohol, toxins, drugs, autoimmune disorders, or metabolic issues.
- Viral Types:
 - A Fecal-oral; acute; vaccine available.
 - B Blood/body fluids; chronic risk; vaccine available.
 - C Blood-to-blood; often chronic; no vaccine; treatable with antivirals.
 - **D** Discussed above.
 - **E** Fecal-oral; usually acute.

- Chronic B, C, D: Major drivers of cirrhosis and liver cancer.
- Prevention: Vaccination (A, B), safe injections, screened blood, safe sex, good hygiene.

MSS+ Technology in Road Construction



Why in the News?

The CSIR–Central Road Research Institute, New Delhi, has developed MSS+ (Modified Mix Seal Surfacing Plus) technology for eco-friendly, durable, and low-cost road surfacing.

About MSS+ Technology:

- Developer: Central Road Research Institute (CSIR-CRRI), New Delhi, a division of the Council of Scientific & Industrial Research.
- 2021 was the year of development (in partnership with J.M.V.D. Industries).
- Pilot Project: In 2022, Uttar Pradesh's first road was constructed close to Lucknow; in 2025, it will be used for 202 km of roads under the Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana (PMGSY).
- Composition: Mineral additive, customized modified bitumen emulsion, and crushed natural aggregate.
- Preparation: Mix made at ambient temperature, eliminating heating of aggregate or bitumen.
- Laying: utilizing standard asphalt pavers with a thickness of 25–30 mm.

Benefits Offered:



- Eco-Friendly: Carbon emissions are greatly reduced because there is no thermal process.
- Sturdy: Offers improved skid resistance, a robust wearing course, and stops water intrusion.
- Cost-effective: Lower building expenses result from a reduced energy requirement.


India Semiconductor Mission (ISM)

About India Semiconductor Mission (ISM):



- Overview: Under the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY), it was established in 2021.
- Goal: Establish an ecosystem for the sustainable production of semiconductors and displays in India.
- From chip design to fabrication, assembly, testing, packaging, and display manufacture, the scope of support encompasses the full value chain.
- Administrative Role: Receives and assesses applications for Semicon India Program schemes and interacts with industry participants to draw in capital.

Key Components:

- Semiconductor Fabs Scheme: Financial assistance for the establishment of semiconductor wafer manufacturing facilities in India.
- Display Fabs Scheme: Rewards for producing AMOLED and TFT LCD panels.
- Advanced semiconductor technologies and packaging facilities are supported by the Compound Semiconductors, Silicon Photonics, Sensors Fab, and ATMP/OSAT Scheme.
- CDAC administers the Design Linked Incentive (DLI) Scheme, which offers incentives and infrastructure support for design initiatives related to ICs, SoCs, chipsets, and semiconductors. Startup assistance is also provided.

- Semi-Conductor Laboratory (SCL) in Mohali is being modernized and upgraded as a brownfield factory.
- Complete Coverage: Contains design assistance, packaging, R&D, and manufacturing.

MIT Research of Ionic Liquids (ILs)




Why in the News?

MIT-led research suggests life may not need liquid water; ionic liquids (salts that stay liquid below 100°C) could support life on rocky super-Earths with volcanic activity and little water.

About Ionic Liquids (ILs):

- Overview: Liquid salts made completely of ions that are below 100°C.
- It is thermally stable, non-flammable, nonvolatile, and may be adjusted to be either hydrophilic or hydrophobic.
- Structure: ILs are made up of ions and ion pairs, as opposed to water, which is made up of neutral molecules.
- Excellent electrolytes with wide electrochemical windows are used in electrochemistry.
- **Applications** include biotechnology, electrochemistry, synthesis, catalysis, extraction, and as environmentally friendly substitutes for volatile solvents.

Breakthrough Findings of MIT Study:




- Life Without Water: Tests revealed that life could be able to endure by employing ILs as solvents rather than water.
- Natural Formation: ILs can spontaneously develop when sulfuric acid and nitrogen compounds are combined.
- Exoplanet Link: Rocky super-Earths with thin atmospheres and volcanic activity may harbor such ILs.
- Research Origin: Studying Venus, where sulfuric acid clouds combine with organic molecules to create ILs, led to this discovery.
- Relevance to Biology: ILs can help metabolism by giving biomolecules stable habitats.

Significance of the Study:

- Habitability Expansion: Broadens habitability definition beyond water-based models.
- **Biosignatures**: Suggests new chemical markers for exoplanet life detection.
- Venus Missions: Strengthens rationale for Venus's exploration targeting IL-based chemistry.
- Wider Habitable Zones: Implies more planets could host life than previously thought.

Scientists turn E. Coli Bacteria into a Bio-Sensor



Why in the News?

Researchers from UK and China have developed a bioelectronic device where genetically engineered E. Coli bacteria act as self-powered chemical bio-sensor.

About Escherichia coli (E. coli) Bacteria:

- Overview: Warm-blooded animals' lower intestine is home to this rod-shaped, gramnegative bacterium.
- Belongs to the family Enterobacteriaceae. Academ
- The majority of strains are not harmful, but some (like E. coli O157:H7) can lead to serious foodborne disease, diarrhea, and kidney problems.
- Gut Role: Supports the production of vitamin K₂ and preserves the equilibrium of the gut flora.
- Transmission: Outbreaks are caused by pathogenic strains spreading by tainted food, water, or direct contact.
- Diagnostic Significance: One of the most important markers of fecal pollution is its presence in water.

Bio-Sensors Generated Using E. coli



- Innovation: Genetically engineered *E. coli* used as **self-powered chemical biosensors**.
- Mechanism: Detect compounds, process signals, and produce electrical outputs compatible with low-cost electronics.

Modules:

- Sensing Module: Detects target molecules.
- Processing Module: Amplifies or modifies signals.
- Output Module: Produces phenazines measurable via electrochemistry.


Applications:

- Detected arabinose (plant sugar) within
 2 hours.
- Detected mercury ions in water at trace levels (below WHO safety limits) within 3 hours.
- Demonstrated an "AND" logic gate, producing signals only when two molecules were present together.

• Significance:

- Cheaper, programmable, and robust alternative to enzyme-based biosensors.
- Potential in environmental monitoring, water safety, medical diagnostics, and bioelectronics.



About Primary Amoebic Meningoencephalitis (PAM):



- Cause: The "brain-eating amoeba," Naegleria fowleri, is the cause of this uncommon and typically lethal sickness.
- Habitat: Does well in freshwater temperatures up to 46°C (115°F).
- Entry: Enters through the nose while swimming or engaging in other water sports, and then makes its way to the brain via the olfactory nerve.
- Impact: Causes extreme swelling and destroys brain tissue.

- Transmission: Not spread from one person to another.
- Fever, headache, nausea, vomiting, stiff neck, disorientation, seizures, hallucinations, coma, and death are some of the symptoms.
- Progression: The majority of cases end in death between 1–18 days following the onset of symptoms, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

Diagnosis and Treatment:

- Diagnosis:
 - Very difficult due to rarity.
 - Confirmed by Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) test of cerebrospinal fluid (CSF).
 - Frequently misdiagnosed as bacterial or viral meningitis.
- Treatment:
 - No single therapy effectively established.
 - o Managed per CDC guidelines using drug combinations such as: Medical interventions typically involve combination of drugs, including amphotericin В, azithromycin, fluconazole, rifampin, miltefosine, and dexamethasone.

About Appointment of High Court Judges:

- Article 217 of the Indian Constitution serves as the foundation.
- The President of India appoints the Chief Justice of India (CJI), the Governor of the State in question, and the Chief Justice of the relevant High Court after consulting with them.

- Collegium System: The Chief Justice of the High Court initiates the proposal, which is then sent via the Chief Minister and the Governor before being decided by the CJI and the two seniormost Supreme Court members.
- Chief Justice Posting Policy: To maintain impartiality, chief justices are chosen from outside the state.
- Transfers: To preserve judicial independence, transfers are decided by the CJI and the Supreme Court's seniormost judges.

Removal Process:

- Reasons: Demonstrated incompetence or misconduct.
- Procedure: The Judges (Inquiry) Act of 1968's Articles 124(4) and 217, as well as Section 3(2), provide for the impeachment process.
- Motion signed by at least 50 Rajya Sabha MPs or 100 Lok Sabha MPs is the first step.
- Investigation: The charges are looked into by a three-member commission that includes a

- Supreme Court judge, a High Court Chief Justice, and a renowned jurist.
- Casting a ballot Removing someone requires a two-thirds majority in both Houses of Parliament.
- Internal Mechanism: In extreme circumstances, CJI may recommend resignation and start internal investigations.

Other Notable Cases:

- Justice V. Ramaswami (1993): Faced impeachment for financial misconduct; motion failed in Lok Sabha.
- Justice Soumitra Sen (2011): Resigned after Rajya Sabha voted for removal over fund misappropriation.
- Justice K. Veeraswamy: Corruption case remained unresolved until his death.
- Justice Shamit Mukherjee (2003), Justice Nirmal Yadav (2008), Justice S.N. Shukla (2017): Faced criminal charges for corruption after in-house inquiries.
