Tamil Nadu Scientist Award:


- → Dr. R. Arthur James, Professor and Chair of the Department of Marine Science at Bharathidasan University (BDU), has been honoured with the prestigious Tamil Nadu Scientist Award (TANSA) 2022 in the field of Environmental Science.
- → The award, instituted by the Tamil Nadu State Council for Science and Technology (TANSA), is one of the highest recognitions for scientists in the state. It highlights exceptional contributions made by individuals in various fields of science and research.



International Day of Older Persons:

- → Every year on 1st October, the world observes the International Day of Older Persons, as designated by the United Nations General Assembly in 1990 (resolution 45/106). The day aims to highlight the importance of older persons in society and the need to protect their rights, dignity, and well-being.
- → In 2025, the theme is "Older Persons Driving Local and Global Action: Our Aspirations, Our Well-Being and Our Rights", emphasizing that older persons are not just passive recipients of care but active drivers of social, economic, and cultural progress.

IPS officers:

- → In a major leadership reshuffle among India's Central Armed Police Forces (CAPFs), two senior IPS officers of the 1993 batch have taken charge of key paramilitary organisations.
- → Praveer Ranjan has been appointed as the Director General (DG) of the Central Industrial Security Force (CISF), while Praveen Kumar has been appointed as the Director General of the Indo-Tibetan Border Police (ITBP). The CISF plays a critical role in securing vital national assets, including:

Airports, ports, and metro systems.

Public Sector Undertakings (PSUs).

Nuclear plants and other high-security installations.



Andhra Pradesh Tourism Department:

- → The Andhra Pradesh Tourism Department has won the prestigious Global Tourism Award 2025, recognizing its outstanding initiatives in positioning Andhra Pradesh as one of India's most promising tourist destinations.
- → The award was received by tourism consultant Nishitha Goyal on behalf of the department at a ceremony held in New Delhi. This achievement highlights the state's efforts in sustainable tourism development, heritage conservation, and promoting cultural experiences to both domestic and international travelers.




NCRB:

- → The National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB) report for 2023 has revealed alarming figures for Manipur, making it the state with the highest number of violent crimes and rioting cases in the entire Northeast region.
- → The sharp rise in crime was largely attributed to the ethnic conflict that broke out in May 2023 between the Meiteis of Imphal Valley and the tribal Kuki communities from the adjoining hill districts. The prolonged violence has claimed more than 260 lives and displaced thousands, pushing the state into a law-and-order crisis.



Mahi Banswara;

- → The foundation stone for the Mahi Banswara Rajasthan Atomic Power Project(MBRAPP) was laid by the Prime Minister.
- → The project involves an investment of around ₹42,000 crore and will feature four indigenous 700 megawatt pressurised heavy water reactors (IPHWR-700). MBRAPP is being developed under India's fleet mode strategy to construct ten identical 700-megawatt nuclear reactors across the country.
- → Prime Minister also inaugurated the RSDCL Nokh Solar Park in Phalodi, Rajasthan. It has a total capacity of 925 megawatt, including 735 megawatts developed by NTPC. The solar park will enhance renewable energy generation and contribute to a reduction in carbon emissions.



RCI:

- → The central government has appointed Lok Sabha MP Kanwar Singh Tanwar and Rajya Sabha MP Dr. Jashvantsinh Parmar as members of the Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI). Their appointments were made under the Rehabilitation Council of India Act, 1992.
- → They will serve a two-year term from the date of notification or until successors are appointed, whichever is longer.




100% tariff:

- → US President announced a 100% tariff on imported "branded and patented pharmaceutical products. India, Belgium, Italy, and China also export drugs to the US but largely in the generic space. India, often called Pharmacy of the World, is one of the largest pharma exporters in the world with a global market share of 5.71%.
- → The US is India's largest pharma market, accounting for around 35% of exports worth \$10 billion (FY25). India also has the highest number of US Food and Drug Administration (USFDA) compliant companies with plants outside of the USA. India ranks 3rd worldwide by volume and 11th by value in pharmaceutical production and India contributes to 60% of global vaccines.



Child marriage:

- → The prevalence of child marriage in Andhra Pradesh declined from 33% (NFHS4) to 29.3% (NFHS-5), and in Rajasthan from 35.4% to 25.4%. Odisha scaled up its "Child Marriage Free Village" initiative, with over 12,400 villages declared child marriage-free by January 2022.
- → Despite progress, about 1.5 million girls under 18 still marry yearly in India; 16% of girls aged 15–19 is currently married. The UNICEF-UNFPA Global Programme integrates education, health, child protection, and sanitation to address root causes at scale.

Bathukamma Festival:

→ In a grand display of culture and devotion, Telangana's Bathukamma Festival made history by achieving two Guinness World Records — one for the largest floral arrangement and the other for the most synchronized female dance participants.

→ These accolades highlight not only the festival's cultural richness but also the collective spirit of its celebration. Bathukamma, meaning "Mother Goddess Come Alive," is a vibrant floral festival celebrated predominantly in Telangana. It marks a spiritual tribute to Goddess Gauri, symbolizing feminine energy, fertility, and prosperity.



Elon Musk:

- → Tesla CEO Elon Musk has officially become the first person in history to achieve a net worth of \$500.1 billion, according to Forbes' Real-Time Billionaires tracker (October 2025). This milestone makes him not just the world's richest individual, but also puts him \$150 billion ahead of Larry Ellison, co-founder of Oracle, who is the second-richest person globally.
- → Musk had earlier become the first person to cross \$400 billion in December, 2024. His wealth surge is tied primarily to the performance of his companies: Tesla, SpaceX, and xAI.



Air India and Airbus:

- → Air India and Airbus have launched a joint venture pilot training centre at the Air India Aviation Training Academy in Gurugram, Haryana, with an investment of over ₹1,000 crore to house 10 full-flight simulators, including India's first A350 simulators.
- → Beyond pilot training, Air India is also establishing South Asia's largest Flying Training Organisation (FTO) in Amravati, Maharashtra, and a Basic Maintenance Training Organisation (BMTO) in Bengaluru, which will support future fleets and create a skilled workforce of engineers and technicians.

Kondareddypally:

- → Kondareddypally in Nagarkurnool district, Telangana has become the second fully solar-powered village in India, covering 514 houses and 11 government buildings under the state's green energy mission.
- → 480 houses are equipped with 3 KW rooftop solar panels, while schools and government buildings use 60 KW solar units, generating 360 units of power per month per house, ensuring uninterrupted electricity and eliminating bills.



PM Dhan Dhaanya Krishi Yojana

- → Kishtwar district in Jammu & Kashmir has been selected as an aspirational agricultural district under the PM Dhan Dhaanya Krishi Yojana, aiming to boost agriculture in remote areas.
- → The initiative is part of the government's plan to develop 100 Aspirational Agricultural Districts over six years, announced in the Union Budget 2025-26. Aspirational districts were identified based on low crop productivity, low cropping intensity, and limited short-term credit disbursement, encouraging Agri-Entrepreneurs and enhancing agricultural development.
- → The Pradhan Mantri Dhan-Dhaanya Krishi Yojana (PMDDKY) is a comprehensive agricultural development initiative approved by the Union Cabinet on July 16, 2025. It aims to transform 100 underperforming agricultural districts across India through the convergence of 36 existing schemes from 11 central ministries, focusing exclusively on agriculture and allied sectors.

Central Tissue Bank:

- → India's first Central Tissue Bank was launched at the Maulana Azad Institute of Dental Sciences (MAIDS) in Delhi. It will provide tissue and bone grafts directly to patients, removing the need to buy these from external sources.
- → Alongside, the Delhi Dental Council (DDC) launched a cashless "V-Office", making it the first state dental council to implement a virtual office system.




Beddome's cat skink:

- → For the first time, recorded the presence of Beddome's cat skink (Ristella beddomii) at the Aralam and Kottiyoor Wildlife sanctuaries in Kerala.
- → The survey also reconfirmed the presence of the Kottiyoor Day Gecko (Cnemaspis Kottiyoorensis) after decades of being unreported.
- → It is a critically endangered species earlier discovered in 2014. Six previously unrecorded agamid lizards, four skinks and five geckos were documented recently.



Mukhi:

- → Mukhi, an India-born female cheetah, will become the first to reach adulthood at Kuno National Park. Project Cheetah began in September 2022 with the release of eight Namibian cheetahs.
- → India currently hosts 27 cheetahs, including 16 born in the country. Kuno's cub survival rate is over 61%, above the global average of 40%.



Deen Dayal Lado Lakshmi Yojana:

- → The Haryana government launched Deen Dayal Lado Lakshmi Yojana 2025. It will provide ₹2,100 per month to eligible women through direct bank transfer.
- → Women can apply online using the official Lado Lakshmi Yojana mobile app. Eligibility is fixed as Women aged 23–60 years, with family income below ₹1 lakh, and a minimum of 15 years of Haryana residency.

Kanniyakumari Nannari:

- → Kanniyakumari Nannari has been proposed for a Geographical Indication tag. Kanniyakumari district is known for Nannari, a herb valued for its cooling properties and traditional use for treating mouth ulcers.
- → The root of this Nannari is thicker, more aromatic, and deeper in colour than regular Nannari and is sun-dried, cleaned, and stored for medicinal and culinary use.
- → The Kani tribe of the Southern Western Ghats has traditionally used Hemidesmus indicus in Siddha and Ayurvedic medicine as a blood purifier, body coolant, and digestive aid.

Milk:

- → India remains the world's top milk producer, contributing about 25 per cent of the global milk supply. Milk output grew by 63.56 per cent in 10 years, from 146.3 to 239.3 million tonnes by 2023–24. Per capita milk availability rose by 48 per cent to 471 grams per day, above the global average.
- → Dairy forms 5 per cent of India's GDP (gross domestic product), employing over 8 crore farmers. Shreeja Milk Producer Organisation won the Dairy Innovation Award in Chicago for women's empowerment. In 2024–25, 565.55 lakh artificial inseminations (AI) were carried out nationwide.



NISAR:

- → NASA and ISRO's joint NISAR satellite was launched from Sriharikota, India. First radar images captured in August show Maine's Mount Desert Island and farmland in North Dakota. NASA's L-band radar detected forests, buildings, and crop fields; ISRO's S-band radar will observe vegetation.
- → The satellite reached its 464-mile orbit in September and will begin full science operations in November 2025.



National Crime Records Bureau:


- → The National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB) reported that 1,77,335 cases of crimes against children were registered in 2023. It was marking a 9.2% rise from 1,62,449 in 2022.
- → The national crime rate against children increased to 39.9 per one lakh child population in 2023, up from 36.6 in 2022. Kidnapping and abduction made up 45% of the cases (79,884). Offences under the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act accounted for 38.2% (67,694).
- → Madhya Pradesh (22,393 cases), Maharashtra (22,390), and Uttar Pradesh (18,852) reported the highest case volumes. Assam had the highest rate at 84.2 per one lakh children.




UPSC:

- → UPSC Celebrates 100 Years of Upholding Merit-Based Recruitment. UPSC was established in October 1926, following the Lee Commission's recommendations (1924), and became Federal Public Service Commission in 1935.
- → Post-Independence, the UPSC was reconstituted under the Constitution of India (1950), acquiring constitutional status under Articles 315-323.



- → Gandhi Jayanti is a national holiday in India, celebrated annually on 2 October to honour the birth of Mahatma Gandhi, one of the key leaders of the Indian independence movement and a pioneer of the philosophy and strategy of nonviolence.
- → It is one of the three national holidays in India. In 2007, the United Nations General Assembly declared this day as the International Day of Non-Violence.
- → Referred to as the "National Father" by Subhas Chandra Bose, Gandhi's principles of nonviolent resistance played a crucial role in India's successful struggle for independence from British colonial rule.

Viksit Bharat Buildathon 2025:


- → The Viksit Bharat Buildathon 2025 is being touted as India's largest school-level innovation challenge, launched to inspire students to ideate and build solutions aligned with national development goals.
- → It seeks to embed a culture of creativity, design thinking, and problem-solving among young learners across the country. The Buildathon was launched on 23 September 2025 by the Ministry of Education, in collaboration with Atal Innovation Mission (AIM), NITI Aayog, and AICTE.
- → It aims to engage students from Classes VI to XII across India. Over 1.5 lakh schools are expected to participate, involving over one crore students. The initiative aligns with India's vision of Viksit Bharat @ 2047, emphasizing self-reliance, innovation, and inclusive prosperity.



World Cerebral Palsy Day:

→ World Cerebral Palsy Day (WCPD) is observed every year on October 6 to raise awareness about cerebral palsy (CP) — one of the most common physical disabilities in childhood. The day promotes inclusion, equality, and empowerment for those affected by CP and their families.

→ The 2025 observance carries the theme "Unique and United", reflecting the dual spirit of individual strength and collective solidarity in the global CP community. It underscores the importance of recognizing diversity while standing together for inclusion, accessibility, and dignity.



World Habitat Day:

- → Every first Monday of October, the world comes together to mark World Habitat Day, a moment to reflect on the state of human settlements and the right of every person to adequate shelter. In 2025, it falls on 6 October, and is being observed under the theme "Urban Crisis Response."
- → The focus is on addressing urgent urban challenges such as climate change, conflict, inequality, and the need for resilient, inclusive cities. This day also kicks off Urban October, a month-long campaign concluding with World Cities Day on 31 October, spotlighting sustainable urban futures.



PM SETU:

- → Prime Minister Narendra Modi launched the PM SETU Scheme (Prime Minister's Skill Enhancement and Technical Upgradation) on 4 October 2025 at the Skills Convocation held at Vigyan Bhawan, New Delhi.
- → With a budget outlay of ₹60,000 crore, the PM SETU scheme is a landmark initiative designed to modernize and make 1,000 Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs) across the country industry-ready, thereby bridging the skill gap and boosting employability.
- → This transformative mission aligns with India's vision of "Viksit Bharat @2047", focusing on creating a skilled, innovation-driven workforce to meet the evolving needs of global industries.



BWF World Junior Championships:

- → After a gap of 17 years, the BWF World Junior Championships return to India, marking a major milestone for Indian badminton.
- → The prestigious tournament, featuring the world's best young shuttlers, is being held in Guwahati, Assam, from October 6 to 19, 2025. This is the second time India is hosting the event—the first being in Pune in 2008—and it reaffirms the country's growing role as a global badminton hub.



Konkan 2025:

- → Exercise Konkan 2025, a joint maritime exercise between the Indian Navy and the Royal Navy of the United Kingdom, commenced on 5 October 2025 off India's western coast.
- → Marking over two decades of sustained collaboration, this edition of the exercise stands out for its enhanced scale and complexity, involving aircraft carriers, warships, submarines, and advanced air assets from both sides.



Akshar:

- → On October 4, 2025, the Indian Coast Guard Ship (ICGS) Akshar was officially commissioned at Karaikal, Puducherry, marking a significant milestone in India's journey towards maritime self-reliance.
- → Designed and built by Goa Shipyard Limited (GSL), this vessel represents the growing indigenous capabilities of India's defence sector under the umbrella of the 'Aatmanirbhar Bharat' and 'Make in India' initiatives.

NATPOLREX-X:

- → The Indian Coast Guard (ICG) is set to conduct the 10th National Level Pollution Response Exercise (NATPOLREX-X) off the Chennai coast, Tamil Nadu, beginning tomorrow.
- → The National Level Pollution Response Exercise (NATPOLREX) is a biennial exercise organized by the Indian Coast Guard, which functions as the Central Coordinating Authority for oil spill response in Indian waters under the National Oil Spill Disaster Contingency Plan (NOSDCP).



NAMO VAN:


- → In a significant step toward strengthening India's green infrastructure, Union Minister for Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Shri Bhupender Yadav, inaugurated Rajasthan's first Namo Biodiversity Park—also called 'NAMO VAN'—at Pratap Bandh, Alwar, on 5 October 2025.
- → The inauguration was marked by a symbolic tree plantation ceremony and attended by Shri Sanjay Sharma, Cabinet Minister, Government of Rajasthan. The park represents a milestone in the state's commitment to biodiversity preservation, climate resilience, and community participation in environmental conservation.

AVAS:

- → The Ministry of Road Transport and Highways has proposed making Acoustic Vehicle Alerting System (AVAS) mandatory for all electric cars, buses, and trucks from October 1, 2027 to enhance road safety.
- → All new electric passenger and goods vehicle models manufactured after October 2026 must be equipped with AVAS, which emits an artificial sound to alert pedestrians and other road
- → Countries like the U.S., Japan, and some EU nations have already mandated AVAS in hybrid vehicles, aligning India with global road safety standards.



Jindal Steel:

- → Jindal Steel becomes India's first large, diversified enterprise and integrated steel manufacturer to be recognised as an Awarding Body by NCVET, granting it PAN-India authority in the Large Indian Enterprise/MNC category.
- → National Council for Vocational Education and Training (NCVET) was established by the Government of India in 2018 under the Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MSDE).
- → It acts as the regulatory body for all vocational education and training programs. It regulates, promotes, and standardizes vocational programs, ensuring they are industry-aligned and nationally recognized.



World Teachers Day:

- → World Teachers' Day is celebrated every year on 5th October to honor the contributions of teachers and educators worldwide.
- → The day was established by UNESCO in 1994 to commemorate the signing of the 1966 ILO/UNESCO Recommendation concerning the Status of Teachers.
- → It aims to raise awareness about the crucial role of teachers in providing quality education and shaping future generations.

Samagra Shiksha Abhiyan:

- → The Union government has released ₹538.39 crore under the Right to Education (Right to Free and Compulsory Education Act) entitlements through the Samagra Shiksha Abhiyan (Integrated School Education Programme).
- → The amount includes ₹362 crore for 2024-25 and ₹175.59 crore as the first instalment for 2025-26. 25% of seats in entry-level classes in private schools must be reserved for children from marginalised groups under the Right to Education Act.
- → Earlier this year, the Madras High Court directed the Union government to consider delinking RTE reimbursements from the Samagra Shiksha scheme. After this, the Tamilnadu State government filed a Special Leave Petition (SLP) before the Supreme Court, seeking a binding direction to the Union government to release its share of funds.

NCRB;

- → The National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB) released the 'Crime in India 2023' report showing sharp rises in caste-based crimes in metropolitan cities.
- → Jaipur reported a 35% increase in crimes against Scheduled Castes (SCs) from 361 in 2021 to 489 in 2023, and a 47% rise against Scheduled Tribes (STs) from 155 to 228. Bengaluru recorded 285 crimes against SCs in 2023, up from 166 in 2021, and 15 crimes against STs, ranking fifth among metros.
- → Jaipur had the second-highest SC cases and the highest ST cases among metropolitan cities in 2023. Lucknow recorded 517 crimes against SCs in 2023, a 93% rise since 2021. Also, Jaipur (1,231), Lucknow (1,205), Kanpur (804), and Bengaluru (682) having the highest cumulative cases over three years.

Tiruvannamalai SP:

- → Tiruvannamalai SP (Superintendent of Police) issued a dismissal order for two constables attached to Tiruvannamalai East Police Station.
- → On the instructions of Inspector-General of Police, North Zone, the SP dismissed the constables by invoking provisions under Article 311 of the Constitution.
- → It deals with the "Dismissal, removal or reduction in rank of persons employed in civil capacities under the Union or a State".
- → While the Article says no disciplinary action could be taken without conducting an inquiry against the accused employee, and he/she be given a reasonable opportunity of being heard in respect of the charges. But the SP issued the order under Clause 2(b) of Article 311 of the Constitution.
- → It states that the dismissal from service is justified when the competent authority "empowered to dismiss or remove a person or to reduce him in rank is satisfied that for some reason, to be recorded by that authority in writing, it is not reasonably practicable to hold such inquiry".
- → Simply, Article 311 does not require any departmental inquiry for dismissal of the service. Under this, the government is empowered to terminate an employee without recourse to the normal procedure if it is satisfied that his or her retention in public service is prejudicial to the security of the state.
- → The first dismissal of a police official under Article 311 was reported in Madurai. Here an Inspector was removed without an inquiry on April 11, 2023 after being arrested for grabbing ₹10 lakh from a businessman.
- → The accused officer's plea challenging her removal from service was dismissed by the Madurai Bench of the Madras High Court.

TET:

- → Tamil Nadu became one of the first States to seek a review of a Supreme Court judgment on TET. It gave school teachers two choices to qualify for Teaching Eligibility Test (TET) in two years or be retired compulsorily.
- → On September 1, 2025, a two-judge Bench of Justices Dipankar Datta and Manmohan invoked the court's extraordinary powers under Article 142 of the Constitution. It has directed that teachers across the country with more than five years of service left must pass the TET in two years.
- → The Right to Education (RTE) Act of 2009 was implemented from 2010. It required teachers to clear TET. The Bench only gave teachers with less than five years to retirement the option to not take TET.
- → It is applicable to all teachers employed in government, aided, unaided and private schools mentioned under the Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education (RTE) Act, 2009. It requires in-service teachers from Classes 1-8 in non-minority schools across the country to clear the Teachers' Eligibility Test (TET) in two years or be "compulsorily retired".

Integrated Child Development Services:

- → The Integrated Child Development Services (ICDS) scheme was launched on 2 October 1975 by then Prime Minister Indira Gandhi. As of 2025, ICDS has been renamed and merged into Mission Saksham Anganwadi and POSHAN 2.0.
- → India has 13.96 lakh (1.396 million) anganwadi centres serving over 7.65 crore(76.5 million) children. ICDS provides early childhood care, education, nutrition, and health services for children under six.

- → At the World Social Security Forum (WSSF) 2025 held in Kuala Lumpur, Union Minister Dr. Mansukh Mandaviya highlighted India's remarkable journey in expanding social security coverage.
- → He stated that over the last decade, India's coverage rose from 19 percent in 2015 to 64.3 percent in 2025, reaching over 940 million citizens an achievement officially recognised by the International Labour Organization (ILO).
- → In recognition of this transformation, India was awarded the International Social Security Association (ISSA) Award 2025 for "Outstanding Achievement in Social Security." The award was presented at the forum attended by more than 1,200 policymakers and professionals from 163 countries.




Shyamji Krishna Varma:

- → On 4 October 2024, India commemorated the 96th birth anniversary of Shyamji Krishna Varma, an eminent revolutionary, patriot, lawyer, and journalist who played a pivotal role in shaping India's freedom struggle from abroad. Varma became the first President of the Bombay Arya Samaj, actively promoting social and political reforms in India.
- → He used platforms like Arya Samaj and India House to blend cultural revival with political activism, creating a strong foundation for revolutionary movements. His writings strongly advocated swaraj (self-rule) long before it became mainstream in Indian politics.



- → This will support the growth of civil and para-public markets while meeting the Indian armed forces' needs for a light multi-role helicopter, especially for operations in the Himalayan region.
- → The facility will also produce a military version, the H125M, with a high degree of indigenous components and technology.
- → The first delivery of the 'Made in India' H125 is expected by early 2027, with plans to export helicopters across South Asia. This marks TASL as the first private company in India to manufacture helicopters and complements their existing Airbus assembly line for the C295 military aircraft in Gujarat.

National Crime Records Bureau:

- → The 2023 National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB) report shows a 3.2 percent rise in suicides due to illnesses, increasing from 31,484 in 2022 to 32,503 in 2023. Illness was the second leading cause of suicide in India in 2023.
- → It is accounting for 19 percent of total suicides, after family problems which accounted for 32 percent. Suicides due to mental illness were highest under the illness category at 13,978 cases. Suicides due to cancer rose by 14 percent from 1,251 in 2022 to 1,428 in 2023.
- → Tamil Nadu reported the highest number of suicides due to illness at 21 percent of the national total. It is followed by Maharashtra at 12 percent and Karnataka at 10 percent.






Indian Army:

- → Software Defined Radios (SDRs) are communication systems where traditional hardware components (mixers, modulators, filters) are replaced or augmented by software-based modules.




National Unity Day:




Carbon:

- → Russia, China, and the United States led global carbon sequestration on forest land, recording annual removals of 1,150 Mt CO₂, 840 Mt CO₂, and 410 Mt CO₂, respectively, in 2021–25. Countries like Brazil (1,420 Mt CO₂), the Democratic Republic of Congo (160 Mt CO₂), and Peru (130 Mt CO₂) recorded the largest emissions due to net forest conversion.
- → Collectively, the top ten countries accounted for more than 70 per cent of global deforestation during this period. India ranked fourth globally in forest carbon sequestration, removing an average of 150 Mt CO₂ per year between 2021 and 2025.



Indian Army:

→ The Indian Army has taken a significant step in modernising its air defence capabilities with the launch of SAKSHAM, an indigenous Counter Unmanned Aerial System (UAS) Grid.

→ Designed to detect, track, identify, and neutralise enemy drones in real time, SAKSHAM represents a major advancement in integrated battlefield management and aligns with India's Atmanirbhar Bharat initiative.

Tobacco Free Youth Campaign:

- → The Government will launch Tobacco Free Youth Campaign 3.0 (TFYC 3.0) to promote a tobacco-free learning environment and protect the health of students nationwide, jointly led by the Ministry of Education and the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare.
- → Tobacco use remains a major public health challenge in India, claiming over 13 lakh lives annually, with 8.4% of students aged 13–15 years using tobacco and an average initiation age of 10 years, highlighting the need for youth-focused interventions.



NCRB:

- → Kolkata has been ranked India's safest city for the fourth consecutive year according to the NCRB 2023 data, recording the lowest rate of cognizable crimes at 83.9 per lakh population among 19 major metropolitan cities.
- → The total number of cognizable crimes in Kolkata declined from 14,591 in 2021 to 11,843 in 2023, showing a consistent decrease over the years.
- → Crimes against women also declined, with 1,746 cases in 2023 and a rate of 25.7 per lakh population, making it among the lowest after Chennai (17.3) and Coimbatore (22.7).
- → Kochi emerged as the most crime-prone city, followed by Delhi and Surat, while serious crimes in Kolkata, including adult and minor rape cases, placed the city 10th among 19 metros.

Kolkata: Kolkata has again emerged as the safest city in the country, recording the lowest number of cognisable offences per lakh people, according to the latest National Crime Records Bureau report (for 2023).

Kolkata recorded 83.9 cognisable offences per lakh people, the lowest among the 19 cities with more than 20 lakh population listed by NCRB,

Surat (1,377.1). At the other end of the table, Hyderabad is the second best (332.3), followed by Pune (337.1) and Mumbai (355.4).

The average rate of cognisable offences in the 19 cities in 2023 was 822 according to the report released earlier this week

This was the fourth year in a row that Kolkata achieved the distinction of being India's safest city. The 2023 crime rate was lower than the rates in the previous two years —86.5 in 2022 and 103.5 in 2021. In fact, the city's crime graph has been steadily dropping siare 2016, when 159.6 cognisable of ences were recorded er lakh beople.

The NCRR report also showed that the total number of cognisable cases in the city can't down for the second uccessive year — to 11,843 from 12,213 in 2022 and 14,591 in 2021.


Elephants:

- → Tamil Nadu recorded 3,170 wild elephants in May 2025, an increase of 107 from the 2024 count of 3,063. The synchronised survey covered 8,989.63 square kilometres across 26 forest divisions using both direct and indirect methods.
- → The Nilgiri Elephant Reserve reported the highest population with 2,419 elephants (Block Count) and 3,163 elephants (Dung Count). Adults made up 44 % of the population, and the sex ratio was recorded at 1 male to 1.77 females.



Archaeological Survey of India:

- → The Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) documented 10 Chola-era inscriptions from the Vedapureeswarar Shiva temple at Therizhandbur in Mayiladuthurai district. Two inscriptions, dated to the 34th and 44th regnal years of Kulottunga Chola I.
- → It records a grant of five gold coins to Brahmins for lighting lamps in the temple. Inscriptions from the reign of Kulottunga Chola III record donations for Tirumanjanam and fines for defaulters, while one from Rajaraja II's period mentions donations for lighting the Nundavilakku.



United Nations General Assembly:

- → India addressed the 80th United Nations General Assembly session in New York, stressing the urgent need for UN reforms. India highlighted that the UNSC reflects outdated 1945 power structures and lacks fair representation.
- → It demanded permanent membership for G4 nations—India, Brazil, Germany, and Japan—and a greater voice for the Global South. India criticised the misuse of veto power by the permanent five members in blocking global consensus on key issues.

Election Commission of India:

- → The Election Commission of India (Election Commission of India) announced the schedule for the Bihar Legislative Assembly election on October 6, 2025.
- → The Model Code of Conduct (Model Code of Conduct) came into immediate effect across Bihar with the announcement. The Code is also applicable to the Central Government in matters related to Bihar's policies and announcements. Public funds must not be used for political advertisements during the election period. Political parties must inform the police in advance about meetings and processions for proper security and traffic arrangements.
- → Ministers are prohibited from combining official duties with election campaigning or using government resources for the same. Regulation of meetings, processions, polling and maintenance of law and order must be carried out fairly.

- → The Indian peacekeepers in Abyei were honoured for their dedicated service by the Acting Head of Mission of the UN Interim Security Force for Abyei (UNISFA). The Abyei Area is a border area between South Sudan and Sudan.
- → It has been granted "special administrative status" by the 2004 Protocol on the Resolution of the Abyei Conflict (Abyei Protocol) in the Comprehensive Peace Agreement (CPA).
- → Since the 1950s, India has sent over 2,90,000 peacekeepers to more than 50 missions worldwide. Now, over 5,000 Indian troops serve in nine of the eleven active missions, dedicated to upholding global peace and security.

→ The feat was achieved during the second Test match against the West Indies at the Arun Jaitley Stadium in Delhi on October 10, 2025. This milestone solidifies Bumrah's legacy as one of India's finest modern pacers.



Srikrishna Museum:

- → In a major boost to heritage tourism and cultural education, the Srikrishna Museum in Kurukshetra is set to expand with a new fourth block, adding to its rich legacy dedicated to Lord Krishna and the Mahabharata.
- → The initiative by the Kurukshetra Development Board (KDB) aims to reinvigorate the museum experience, attract more tourists, and highlight the spiritual and historical landscape of 48-kos Kurukshetra.



Delhi government:


- → The Delhi government has launched a collateral-free loan scheme to support small businesses and women entrepreneurs, aiming to enhance the city's economic growth and improve access to credit without requiring personal or business assets as security.
- → Under the initiative, loans up to ₹10 crore are available for small and women-led enterprises, with higher coverage for women entrepreneurs, Agniveer-promoted MSMEs, and micro units, supporting sectors like manufacturing, services, retail, and education.



International Day of the Girl Child


- → The International Day of the Girl Child is observed annually on 11 October to highlight the challenges faced by girls and promote their empowerment and human rights.
- → Theme 2025 The girl I am, the change I lead: Girls on the frontlines of crisis The day was first declared by the United Nations in 2011, following a resolution adopted by the UN General Assembly.

Nagamalai hillock:

- → Nagamalai hillock in Erode district has been notified as Tamil Nadu's fourth Biodiversity Heritage Site.
- → It is designated under the Biological Diversity Act, 2002. The site spans 32.22 hectares and supports diverse habitats, including deep waters, shallow margins, mudflats, and rocky outcrops.
- → The site holds archaeological significance with Iron Age cairn circles, ancient rock shelters, and a 400-year-old stone carving of Lord Anjaneya.
- → The other three Biodiversity Heritage Sites in Tamil Nadu are Arittapatti in Madurai, Kasampatty in Dindigul, and Elathur Lake in Erode.



Cotton:

- → The area under cotton cultivation in Tamil Nadu, especially in the delta region, is expected to decline this year. Farmers who harvested cotton in July (aadi pattam) received only last year's minimum support price (MSP).
- → The Cotton Corporation of India (CCI) has not procured cotton in Tamil Nadu since 2019 under the MSP scheme. In Andhra Pradesh, the state government provides transport support, but no such support exists in Tamil Nadu. There are at least 15,000 cotton growers in the delta region with average land holdings of three to four acres.



Tamil Nadu:

- → Tamil Nadu is preparing an infrastructure roadmap to become India's hub for the low-altitude economy (LAE) focused on drones and advanced air mobility. LAE covers aerial operations up to 3,000 metres. It includes manned and unmanned systems powered by evolving drone technologies.
- → The state has set up India's first drone testing centre at SIPCOT Vallam Vadagal. It is also developing BVLOS (beyond visual line of sight) facilities at Chettinad Airport. Tamil Nadu will unveil its master plan at the LAE Forum 2025, detailing vertiports, drone corridors, training pipelines, and regulatory frameworks.

Government of India:

- → The Government of India will map all drinking water pipelines under the Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM) on the PM Gati Shakti platform. The PM Gati Shakti platform is a Geographic Information System (GIS)-based digital infrastructure planning tool.
- → It is developed by Bhaskaracharya National Institute for Space Applications and Geoinformatics (BISAG-N). The platform will allow geo-tagging of water supply assets, unique scheme-level IDs, and household-level monitoring under JJM.



RBI:

→ RBI brought Central and State Co-operative Banks under the Reserve Bank - Integrated Ombudsman Scheme, 2021 (RB-IOS, 2021) on 8 October 2025. The decision was made under Section 35A of the Banking Regulation Act, 1949.

- RB-IOS, 2021, provides customers of regulated entities with a speedy, cost effective, and alternative grievance redress mechanism. The scheme originally covered all Commercial Banks, Regional Rural Banks, Scheduled and Non-Scheduled Primary (Urban) Co-operative Banks with deposits of ₹50 crore or more.
- → It also included Non-Banking Financial Companies (excluding Housing Finance Companies) with assets of ₹100 crore or more and a customer interface.



NITI Aayog:

- → NITI Aayog released the fourth edition of Trade Watch Quarterly, assessing India's trade in Q4 FY 2024-25. India's total trade reached \$441 billion, growing 2.2% year-on-year in Q4 FY 2024-25.
- → North America was India's largest export market, growing 25% and making up 25% of exports; EU, GCC, and ASEAN exports slowed.
- → UAE became India's second-largest import source, surpassing Russia, aided by gold inflows under CEPA. Imports from China rose on electronics demand. India's leather and footwear sector employs 4.4 million people, contributes 1.8% of the \$296 billion global market.



Lucknow:

- → Lucknow Municipal Corporation (LMC) and Humane World for Animals India have signed a MoU. They will set up India's first dedicated Animal Birth Control (ABC) training centre in Lucknow.
- → The centre will train veterinarians, para-veterinarians, animal handlers and animal welfare organisations. It will serve as a national hub for capacity building in street dog sterilisation and related welfare work.



Mera Hou Chongba festival:


→ The annual Mera Hou Chongba festival was held at Kangla Fort in Imphal, Manipur. The festival celebrates the cultural diversity of Manipur's indigenous communities.

→ The festival unites communities from both the hills and the valleys of Manipur. Mera Hou Chongba is celebrated to promote peace and unity among different groups in the state.



Madras High Court:

- → The Madras High Court ordered the Tamil Nadu government to constitute the Tamil Nadu Heritage Commission (TNHC) within four weeks. The court noted the commission was still not formed despite the TNHC Act being brought into force on March 12, 2024, after a 12-year delay.
- → The commission is meant to protect heritage buildings not covered under national or state archaeological laws. The court also directed the Hindu Religious and Charitable Endowments(HR&CE) department to halt ongoing temple construction activities.



Buddha:

- → The Government of India has announced the first-ever public exposition of Lord Buddha's sacred relics in Kalmykia, Russia.
- → A Memorandum of Understanding is set to be signed between the Central Spiritual Administration of Buddhists and the International Buddhist Confederation (IBC), formalizing cooperation in spiritual education, cultural exchanges, and preservation of Buddhist heritage.

Bharat – National Service Scheme:

- → On October 6, 2025, the President of India, Smt. Droupadi Murmu, presented the My Bharat National Service Scheme (NSS) Awards for the year 2022-23 at Rashtrapati Bhavan.
- → This ceremony honoured students, programme officers, and institutions for their exceptional contributions in voluntary service and nation-building. The National Service Scheme (NSS) was launched in 1969, during Mahatma Gandhi's birth centenary, to encourage youth participation in community service and personality building.
- → Its motto is "Not Me, But You" reflecting selfless service orientation. NSS operates across schools, colleges, and universities. Each unit typically adopts a village or slum area and carries out regular activities (120 hours/year) and a 7-day special camp during its two-year cycle.
- → The My Bharat NSS Award was instituted in 1993-94 by the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports. Its objective is to recognise outstanding contributions by NSS volunteers, programme officers, units, and universities in the domain of social service and community development.



Nobel Prize:

- → The Nobel Prize in Physics 2025 has been awarded to John Clarke, Michel H. Devoret, and John M. Martinis for their groundbreaking discovery of macroscopic quantum mechanical tunnelling and energy quantisation in an electric circuit.
- → Their work proved that quantum phenomena can occur even in large-scale systems, bridging the gap between the quantum and classical worlds and paving the way for advanced technologies like quantum computing, cryptography, and sensors.




World Cotton Day:

- → World Cotton Day, celebrated annually on October 7, is a global observance that recognizes the economic and social significance of cotton, particularly for least-developed countries (LDCs). It underscores cotton's critical role in employment, trade, and sustainable development across five continents.
- → First launched in 2019, the day is now officially recognized by the United Nations and serves as a platform to promote inclusive trade policies, sustainable cotton production, and equitable participation of developing nations in the global cotton value chain.



Valmiki Jayanti: 🔌

- → Valmiki Jayanti, also known as Pargat Diwas, marks the birth anniversary of Maharishi Valmiki, the revered sage who authored the ancient epic Ramayana. In 2025, this significant spiritual and cultural occasion will be celebrated on October 7 across India with devotional programs, processions, and community service initiatives.
- → Valmiki Jayanti is not just a celebration of a historical figure but a reminder of social harmony, righteousness, and the power of transformation. It is observed especially by followers of Sant Valmiki traditions, and in many states, processions known as Shobha Yatras are held with devotional songs and enactments from the Ramayana.



Department of Drinking Water & Sanitation:

- → The Department of Drinking Water & Sanitation (DDWS) has signed a Memorandum of Agreement (MoA) with BISAG-N (Bhaskaracharya National Institute for Space Applications and Geo-informatics) to develop a GIS-integrated decision support platform.
- → This collaboration will digitally transform the way Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM) and Swachh Bharat Mission (Grameen) [SBM(G)] are planned, monitored, and evaluated across rural India.



Andhra Pradesh CM:

- → Andhra Pradesh CM N. Chandrababu Naidu launched the 'Auto Driverla Sevalo' scheme, providing ₹15,000 annual financial assistance to over 2.9 lakh auto, cab, and maxi cab drivers affected by the state's Stree Shakti free bus travel initiative.
- → For the financial year 2025–26, the state government will disburse ₹436 crore directly into beneficiaries' bank accounts, reaffirming its commitment to driver welfare and livelihood support.
- Naidu announced plans to convert all public transport vehicles to electric, assured no harassment of drivers, and highlighted ongoing road repairs worth ₹3,400 crore to improve conditions across 23,000 km of roads.



Kronotsky:

- → Kronotsky volcano on Russia's Kamchatka Peninsula erupted, sending an ash plume 9.2 km above sea level and stretching about 85 km to the south and southeast.
- → A red aviation alert has been issued due to the high hazard posed to both local and international air traffic, according to the Kamchatka Volcanic Eruption Response Team.



NITI Aayog:

- → NITI Aayog introduced its first Tax Policy Working Paper titled "Enhancing Tax Certainty in Permanent Establishment and Profit Attribution for Foreign Investors in India". It aims to boost transparency and predictability in tax regulations.
- → The paper addresses long-standing issues faced by foreign investors related to Permanent Establishment (PE) rules, profit attribution, and dispute resolution to improve India's investment climate.
- → It proposes an optional, industry specific Presumptive Taxation Scheme for foreign companies to reduce litigation, simplify compliance, and enhance administrative efficiency.



Mud Volcano:

→ India's only mud volcano at Baratang in the Andaman and Nicobar Islands erupted on October 2, 2025. The volcano had remained dormant since its last major eruption in 2005.

→ Mud volcanoes are formed by gases like methane pushing mud to the surface, unlike lavabased volcanoes. This event is separate from recent minor eruptions at Barren Island, which is India's only active lava volcano.




Uttarakhand:

- → Uttarakhand Governor has approved the Uttarakhand Minority Education Bill, 2025, which mandates that all Madrasas must gain recognition from the Uttarakhand Minority Education Authority and affiliate with the Uttarakhand School Education Board.
- → Uttarakhand is the first state in India to abolish the Madrasa Board and integrate minority educational institutions into the mainstream system.



NCSI:

- → The Ministry of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying is set to launch the National Camel Sustainability Initiative (NCSI) to address the decline in India's camel population.
- → India is facing a rapid decline in its camel population, particularly in the camel-rearing states of Rajasthan and Gujarat. Nearly 90% of India's camels are concentrated in Rajasthan and Gujarat.


International Day for Disaster Risk Reduction:

- → These initiatives aim to enhance crop productivity, promote self-reliance in pulses, and uplift 100 underperforming districts across the country.

Instead of multiple, often steep penalties leading to disputes and court cases, this scheme offers a simplified, uniform penal rate and covers ongoing, pending, and future cases under specified categories.

- → The exercise will continue until October 26 and is designed to improve operational synergy and deepen tactical interoperability between the two armies, particularly in complex urban warfare environments.




Semiconductor Innovation Museum:

- → The museum is the first of its kind in India, aiming to bolster public engagement and industry collaboration in the semiconductor and electronics ecosystem.



Karnataka State Cabinet:

- → Karnataka State Cabinet approved the Karnataka Menstrual Leave Policy-2025, granting one day of paid leave per month for women employees across both government and private sectors, making Karnataka the first state in India to cover all sectors.
- → The policy follows recommendations from a Labour Department committee advocating paid menstrual leave and is applicable to all sectors employing women, aiming to support employee well-being and inclusion.



Indian Army:


- → The Indian Army has initiated procurement of the indigenously developed 'Saksham' Counter-Unmanned Aerial System (CUAS) Grid System, designed to detect, track, identify, and neutralise hostile drones and unmanned aerial systems in real time across the Tactical Battlefield Space (TBS).
- → Developed in collaboration with Bharat Electronics Limited (BEL), Saksham integrates Aldriven analytics, CUAS sensors, weapons systems, and the Army Data Network (ADN) to create a real-time Recognised UAS Picture (RUASP) for commanders, enabling automated decision support and 3D battlefield visualisation.



World Migratory Bird Day:

- → World Migratory Bird Day (WMBD) is observed on 11 October every year to raise awareness about the conservation of migratory birds and their habitats. Theme 2025 Shared Spaces: Creating Bird-Friendly Cities and Communities.
- → The day highlights the threats migratory birds face, including habitat loss, climate change, hunting, and pollution, emphasising the need for global cooperation.

Arulmigu Ekambaranathar:

- → The Arulmigu Ekambaranathar Temple in Kanchipuram, Tamil Nadu, will hold its consecration ceremony on December 8, 2025, after a 17-year gap, as announced by the state's Hindu Religious and Charitable Endowments Minister P.K. Sekar Babu.
- → Due to 34 extensive renovation works costing around ₹28 crore, the consecration was delayed beyond the traditional 12-year cycle; restoration was carried out under strict preservation guidelines.
- → In Turkey's Denizli region, archaeologists unearthed a 2,700-year-old temple dedicated to the 'Mother Goddess', featuring a monumental structure, ritual cave, and twin stone statues reflecting Phrygian spiritual and artistic traditions.

Jharkhand:

- → Jharkhand, formed in 2000, is rich in natural resources with vast iron ore reserves, strong steel and heavy engineering industries, and 29% forest cover, one of the highest in India.
- → As a tribal-dominated state, Jharkhand's economy also relies heavily on agriculture and allied sectors, providing livelihood to a large share of its population.
- → The recent GST reforms have introduced significant tax rate reductions across key industries, unlocking Jharkhand's economic growth potential and boosting industrial competitiveness.
- → Jharkhand contributes 20–25% of India's steel output, hosting major hubs like Jamshedpur (Tata Steel) and Bokaro (SAIL), supporting over 1 lakh workers and a strong MSME and vendor network in metal and engineering sectors.



Gurugram:

- → Gurugram becomes the first city in India to launch a QR code-based kiosk for digital payment of traffic challans, simplifying and speeding up the process.
- → The kiosk, set up at Ambience Mall, was developed jointly by Gurugram Police and the Gurugram Metropolitan Development Authority under a CSR initiative.
- → Drivers can check and pay outstanding challans by entering their vehicle number and scanning a QR code; however, court-pending or 90+ days overdue challans cannot be paid through it.

India and EFTA:

- → India and EFTA (Switzerland, Norway, Iceland, and Liechtenstein) signed the Trade and Economic Partnership Agreement (TEPA) on 10 March 2024, which came into effect on 1 October 2025, marking India's first FTA with developed European nations.
- → EFTA is the intergovernmental organisation of Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway and Switzerland. It was set up in 1960 by its then 7 Member States for promotion of free trade and economic integration between its members.
- → EFTA is 1 important economic block out of the 3 (other 2 EU & UK) in Europe. TEPA (Trade and Economic Partnership Agreement) is a modern and ambitious agreement which, for the first time in any Free Trade Agreement (FTA) signed by India, includes binding commitments on investment and job creation.



Tamil Nadu government:

- → The Tamil Nadu government has issued guidelines to identify and rename places with castebased or discriminatory names.
- → The move follows the Chief Minister's Assembly announcement to remove the term "Colony" from official records. Names like Adidravidar Colony, Harijan Colony, Vannankulam, Parayar Street, and Chakkiliar Salai are to be renamed with neutral alternatives.
- → Approvals from Grama Sabha and Area Sabha are required before changes; valid reasons must be recorded if names are retained.
- → Final decisions will be taken by the State government as per the Tamil Nadu Panchayats Act, 1994, and the Tamil Nadu Urban Local Bodies Act, 1998. Similar steps are directed for removing caste names from revenue villages under the Revenue and Disaster Management Department.

Vidiyal Payanam:

- → Tamil Nadu has extended the 'Vidiyal Payanam' free bus travel scheme to persons with disabilities in hilly regions from 2025–26. Beneficiaries must have 40 percent or more benchmark disabilities under 21 categories defined in the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016.
- → About 1,100 persons with disabilities and their escorts can travel in white board buses on fully and partially ghat routes.
- → The scheme allows travel up to 35 km in served areas and 40 km in unserved areas operated by State Transport Undertakings. A subsidy of ₹88.65 lakh has been sanctioned by the Welfare of Differently Abled Persons Department to implement the expansion.

China:

- → China launched the world's first dual-tower solar-thermal power plant in the Gobi Desert. It uses 27,000 mirrors called heliostats to concentrate sunlight onto two 200 meter towers. The towers generate heat up to 570 degrees Celsius to produce steam that drives turbines.
- → This system allows electricity generation even after sunset or during cloudy weather. The dual-tower design increases efficiency by about 25 percent compared to single-tower plants.



Armenia:

- → Armenia has become the newest State Member of the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN), announced at the IUCN World Conservation Congress in Abu Dhabi.
- → The membership enhances Armenia's access to global expertise, innovative tools, and international partnerships. Armenia is preparing to host COP17 of the Convention on Biological Diversity in 2026.



- → Taftan volcano shows signs of awakening after 710,000 years. The Taftan volcano is located in southeastern Iran near the city of Khash.
- → It is a 3,940-metre-high stratovolcano formed by the subduction of the Arabian plate beneath the Eurasian plate.
- → Between July 2023 and May 2024, satellite data detected a 9-centimetre ground uplift near its summit. This uplift indicates increasing underground gas or magma pressure beneath the volcano.

IUCN World Conservation Congress 2025:

- → In a historic step for biodiversity conservation, India will unveil its first-ever Red List of Endangered Species at the IUCN World Conservation Congress 2025, to be held in Abu Dhabi, UAE from October 9–15, 2025.
- → The Red List, tailored for India's unique biodiversity, will highlight species at risk and strengthen national conservation priorities. India's delegation to the Congress will be led by Kirti Vardhan Singh, Union Minister of State for Environment, Forests, and Climate Change, and External Affairs.



International Solar Alliance:

- → India is set to host the 8th Session of the International Solar Alliance (ISA) Assembly from October 27 to 30, 2025, at Bharat Mandapam in New Delhi.
- → The summit aims to bring together leaders, policymakers, and stakeholders from across the globe to strengthen international cooperation on solar energy adoption, policy alignment, and infrastructure development.
- → The International Solar Alliance is an intergovernmental treaty-based organization that was launched by India and France at COP21 in Paris in 2015. Currently, the ISA has 124 member and signatory countries, making it one of the most expansive renewable energy coalitions in the world.



Indian Air Force Day:

- → Indian Air Force Day 2025 is celebrated on October 8, marking the 93rd anniversary of the founding of the Indian Air Force (IAF) in 1932. Each year, the day serves to honor the courage and commitment of IAF personnel while showcasing India's growing air power through air shows, parades, and exhibitions across air bases nationwide.
- → The 2025 celebrations emphasize the IAF's focus on modernization and operational readiness, blending heritage with cutting-edge technological capabilities.



Narcotics Control Bureau:

- → In a major step toward enhancing India's fight against narcotics and cyber-enabled drug crimes, the Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) and the Rashtriya Raksha University (RRU) have signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to collaborate in research, training, and capacity building.
- → The agreement, signed in New Delhi, focuses on integrating academic research, technological innovation, and field-level enforcement to combat the growing threat of drug trafficking through digital and cyber platforms.



Defence Research and Development Organisation:

- → On 6 October 2025, the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO), along with the Integrated Defence Staff (IDS) and the Tri-Services, released Indian Radio Software Architecture (IRSA) version 1.0 at a national workshop in New Delhi.
- → This marks a significant leap towards interoperable, indigenous, and future-ready Software Defined Radios (SDRs) for India's military.
- → IRSA 1.0 is the country's first standardized software architecture for SDRs, offering a common framework for radio communication across all defence services. It defines unified APIs, interfaces, and execution environments to ensure waveform portability, certification, and interoperability critical for modern warfare.



Odisha:

- → Odisha to set up a digital library named Gyana Yagnya Mandap in Puri to preserve rare records, manuscripts, and temple chronicles of Jagannath Temple.
- → The upcoming facility, named Gyana Yagnya Mandap, will be built on the site of the old Raghunandan Library and aims to make sacred documents and manuscripts digitally accessible to both devotees and researchers.



Sonipat:

- → In a significant step toward promoting green transportation and reducing carbon emissions, Union Minister for Road Transport and Highways Nitin Gadkari inaugurated India's first commercial electric truck battery swapping and charging station in Sonipat, Haryana.
- → The facility has been set up at the Delhi International Cargo Terminal Private Limited (DICT) in Panchi Gujran village on the GT Road near Ganaur. This milestone marks a major leap in India's efforts to decarbonize the logistics and transport sector.



Union Home Minister Amit Shah:

- → In a symbolic yet impactful move, Union Home Minister Amit Shah announced on October 8, 2025, that he has shifted his official email to Zoho Mail, a homegrown Indian platform. The decision aligns with the government's ongoing push for Atmanirbhar Bharat (self-reliant India) in the technology sector, particularly amidst escalating trade tensions with the United States.
- → Zoho Mail is part of Zoho Corporation, an Indian tech company headquartered in Chennai, known for its privacy-focused, ad-free suite of productivity tools. The adoption of Zoho by such a senior cabinet minister signals,

A strong government endorsement of indigenous platforms,

A gradual phase-out of foreign software like Google Workspace and Microsoft Office,

A move toward digital sovereignty, especially for sensitive government communication.



World Postal Day:

- → World Postal Day is observed annually on 9 October to celebrate the role of postal services in connecting people and facilitating communication globally. Theme 2025 #Post for People: Local Service.
- → The day commemorates the establishment of the Universal Postal Union (UPU) in 1874, which standardised and improved international mail delivery.
- → World Postal Day aims to raise awareness about the importance of postal networks in social and economic development, especially in remote and rural areas.



Mahout village:

- → Tamil Nadu Chief Minister inaugurated the second mahout village at Kozhikamuthi Elephant Camp in Anamalai Tiger Reserve.
- → The first mahout village in India was established earlier in 2025 at Theppakadu in the Mudumalai Tiger Reserve. A solar-powered microgrid was installed by the State Planning Commission at a cost of ₹3.5 erore.



Nilgiris:

- → Pink Patrol, a women-led police patrol initiative, was launched for the first time in the Nilgiris district to assist women and children in public spaces. It aims to prevent crimes against women and children and make it easier for victims to report offences without hesitation.
- → Ten pink patrol vehicles will operate across Udhagamandalam, Coonoor, Kotagiri, and Gudalur. The patrols will focus on safeguarding girl students from harassment during school and college opening and closing hours.



Kaziranga National Park:

- → A pair of painted storks was spotted at Kaziranga National Park, Assam. This is a rare sighting, with previous records in 2004, 2005, and 2022 during migratory bird censuses.
- → Kaziranga is a UNESCO World Heritage Site known for its rich wetlands and diverse migratory waterfowl.



National Wildlife Week 2025:

- → National Wildlife Week 2025 is observed from 2 to 8 October across India. It was first conceptualised in 1952 to raise awareness about wildlife conservation and ecological balance.
- → The theme of 2025 is "Sewa Parv", focusing on service and responsibility towards nature.

India Justice Report:

- → The India Justice Report 2025 highlights significant challenges in India's justice system, including access, delays, and accountability. India's judiciary currently has over 4.57 crore pending cases, which causes significant delays in delivering justice.
- → Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) includes arbitration, conciliation, mediation, and judicial settlement through Lok Adalats.
- → Article 39A of the Indian Constitution mandates equal justice and free legal aid, providing the constitutional basis for ADR. Section 89 of the Code of Civil Procedure, 1908, recognises and supports the use of ADR processes to resolve civil disputes.
- → The Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996, as amended in 2021, requires disputes to be resolved within a maximum period of 180 days. Lok Adalats, governed by the Legal Services Authorities Act, 1987, provide decisions that are final and binding, with no option for appeal. States such as Andhra Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh, and Bihar have the highest number of pending cases.

- → India's first cooperative multi-feed Compressed Biogas (CBG) plant was inaugurated in Kopargaon, Ahilyanagar, Maharashtra.
- → The plant is set up at the Maharshi Shankarrao Kolhe Sahakari Sakhar Karkhana. This is marked a first for India's cooperative sugar sector and was supported by the National Cooperative Development Corporation (NCDC).

Unified Payments Interface:

- → Telangana has the highest per capita Unified Payments Interface (UPI) transaction intensity among all Indian states. Karnataka, Andhra Pradesh, Delhi, and Maharashtra also show high UPI usage intensity, driven by urban centers and economic hubs.
- → The rise of UPI is linked to the decline in cash demand, evidenced by a steady fall in ATM cash withdrawals as a percentage of GDP. Currency in circulation (CIC) has a share of 11.2 per cent of GDP in 2024-25.
- → UPI crossed 20 billion monthly transactions for the first time in August 2025. UPI usage concentrated in 10 states, with 80% of transaction volumes. Intensity remains high in Telangana, Andhra, Delhi and Maharashtra.

- → The CEIR (Central Equipment Identity Register) portal is a government-backed system that allows citizens to report lost or stolen phones using their device's IMEI (International Mobile Equipment Identity) number.
- → The CEIR portal was initially launched in September 2022 as a pilot in Karnataka, Maharashtra, Delhi, and northeastern states, and was extended to Telangana in April 2023.

IIT Madras:

- → IIT Madras-incubated Muse Wearables partnered with NPCI (National Payments Corporation of India) to launch India's first wearable payments ecosystem. The system enables users to make payments using the smart ring 'Ring One' by tapping on any NFC (Near Field Communication)-enabled POS (Point of Sale) terminal.
- → No phone, card, or wallet is needed for transactions, and payments work only when the ring is worn. Muse Wallet uses RuPay to convert any RuPay card into a token stored in a Secure Element (SE) chip inside the ring.
- → The SE chip ensures hardware-level security, isolating card data from the phone or apps. The platform is aimed at simplifying secure digital payments, especially for users in tier 2 and tier 3 cities.

Female labour force:

- → Female labour force participation in India rose from 23 percent in 2017–18 to approximately 42 percent in 2023–24. According to World Bank data, India recorded the highest increase in women's workforce participation among BRICS nations over the past decade.
- → The rise is attributed to policy measures improving access to skills, credit, and formal employment for women. Government initiatives include 730 days of child care leave, 180 days of maternity leave, and same-station postings for spouses in government service.
- → Women are exempted from fees for competitive examinations to encourage greater representation in government jobs. One Stop Centres provide integrated support for women facing violence, offering legal, medical, counselling, and shelter services.

- → NITI Aayog released a report titled "India's Blue Economy: Strategy for Harnessing Deep-Sea and Offshore Fisheries". The report outlines a framework to expand deep-sea fisheries within India's Exclusive Economic Zone (EEZ) of over 2 million sq. km.

Integrated Alert System:

- → Integrated Alert System (SACHET) is India's disaster early warning platform by the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA).
- → It provides real-time geo-targeted alerts using multiple channels like SMS, cell broadcast, mobile app, TV, radio, and social media. The system was developed by the Centre for Development of Telematics (C-DOT) under the Department of Telecom.
- → SACHET is operational across all Indian states and union territories, sending alerts to citizens in affected areas. The SACHET app offers disaster warnings and weather updates from the Indian Meteorological Department (IMD).



Right to Information:

- → The Right to Information (RTI) Act completes 20 years since its implementation in 2005. The Right to Information (RTI) Act was enacted on 12 October 2005 to ensure transparency and accountability in governance.
- → The RTI law emerged from grassroots activism led by the Mazdoor Kisan Shakti Sangathan (MKSS) and public hearings in Rajasthan during the 1990s. The movement

led to several state-level RTI laws before the national law was passed by Parliament on 12 May 2005.

→ The RTI Act recognises the right to information as part of the right to freedom of speech and expression under Article 19 of the Constitution. Over 1.75 million RTI applications were filed in 2023–24, double the number from a decade ago, but with a record 67,615 rejections.



Ministry of Mines:

- → The Ministry of Mines reclassified all limestone as a major mineral. Limestone used in lime kilns is no longer considered a minor mineral under the new classification.
- → The change removes end-use restrictions and allows leaseholders to sell limestone for any purpose. The decision followed recommendations by an inter-ministerial committee chaired by a Member of NITI Aayog.

India and Mongolia:

- → India and Mongolia mark 70 years of diplomatic ties and 10 years of strategic partnership in 2025. A joint postal stamp was released to celebrate shared heritage and civilizational bonds. India is to send Buddhist relics and digitise 1 million ancient manuscripts.
- → A \$1.7 billion Indian credit line supports Mongolia's oil refinery, with over 2,500 Indian professionals involved.
- → A Sanskrit teacher will be deputed to Gandan Monastery to strengthen Buddhist scholarly ties. The Ladakh–Arkhangai MoU will boost regional cultural cooperation between India and Mongolia.

16th Finance Commission:

- → The government has extended the 16th Finance Commission's term till November 30, 2025. The commission was formed on December 31, 2023, with Arvind Panagariya as Chairman. It will recommend tax distribution between the Centre and states for 2026–2031.
- → The original deadline for the report submission was October 31, 2025. It will also review disaster management financing under the Disaster Management Act, 2005.
- → The commission has four members, including economists and senior officials. The 15th Finance Commission had recommended 41% tax devolution to states for 2021–2026.

Wild elephant population:

- → India's wild elephant population is now estimated at 22,446 according to the first DNA-based national count conducted in 2025. This marks an 18 percent decline from the 2017 estimate of 27,312 elephants.
- → The survey was conducted by the Environment Ministry, Project Elephant, and the Wildlife Institute of India. Scientists collected 21,056 dung samples and used DNA fingerprinting to identify 4,065 unique elephants.
- → The survey used the mark-recapture model to estimate the total population between 18,255 and 26,645 elephants.
- → Karnataka has the highest number of elephants at 6,013, followed by Assam with 4,159 and Tamil Nadu with 3,136. The Western Ghats host 11,934 elephants, the highest among regions, followed by the Northeast with 6,559.

- → India's largest artificial intelligence (AI) data hub will be built in Andhra Pradesh. Google's 1-gigawatt (GW) hyperscale data centre in Visakhapatnam will generate ₹10,000 crore for the state.

- → Additional Directors, Additional Collectors, Joint Directors, or Project Directors are appointed as Special Officers for district panchayats.

- → The draft Bill was prepared by the Health and Family Welfare Department and examined by the Law Department and the Minister for Health and Family Welfare.





Chennai:



Ministry of Home Affairs:

- → Since the reorganisation of Jammu & Kashmir in 2019, Ladakh has been functioning as a Union Territory without a legislature. Over the years, discontent has grown among locals, particularly regarding land rights, cultural identity, and political representation.







2025 PN7:

- → Earth has a new space companion a small asteroid named 2025 PN7, recently confirmed by NASA. Though it's not a real moon, it travels around the Sun in almost the same orbit as Earth, making it look like it's following our planet through space.
- → This "quasi-moon", first discovered by astronomers at the University of Hawaii, is estimated to be 18 to 36 metres wide about the height of a small building. While tiny by space standards, its discovery is fascinating for scientists studying how asteroids move near Earth.
- → The asteroid 2025 PN7 is not directly orbiting Earth like our natural moon. Instead, it travels around the Sun on a path that nearly matches Earth's. This unique movement makes it appear as if it's staying close to us, even though it's actually an independent traveler in space.



Rani Channamma:

- → The Government of India will issue a ₹200 commemorative coin marking the 200th anniversary of Rani Channamma's Victory at Kittur (1824–2024) one of the earliest armed resistances against the British East India Company, predating the 1857 revolt.
- → Rani Channamma of Kittur (born 1778, died 1829) fought bravely against the British East India Company after it denied the legitimacy of her adopted son under the Doctrine of Lapse. Her initial victory in 1824 became a symbol of early Indian resistance to colonial rule.

TNFR Act:

- → The Tamil Nadu State Financial Responsibility and Budget Management Act(TNFR Act), 2003, defines total liabilities as "liabilities under the Consolidated Fund of the State and the Public Account of the State".
- → The borrowings made by the corporations/agencies for implementing various Stateplanned programmes are not captured in its financial accounts. These borrowings indirectly add to the liabilities of the State. For State-planned programmes, the principal and the interest are paid by the State government.
- → States, including Tamil Nadu, raise funds through the issue of bonds known as State Development Loans (SDLs). The auction for the bonds is conducted by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI).
- → The bonds are issued for various tenures and States have to repay the principal along with interest on maturity. SDLs form a major part of Tamil Nadu's outstanding liabilities. The Union government fixes the borrowing ceiling for States. The borrowing ceiling is 3% of the projected Gross State Domestic Product (GSDP) for 2025-26.

ORS:

- → The Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) prohibited the use of the term "ORS" (Oral Rehydration Solution) in the branding of beverages. This decision was made to prevent misleading claims regarding the health benefits of certain beverages.
- → The order applies to all beverage manufacturers and marketers across India. Companies found in violation of this directive may face penalties under the Food Safety and Standards Act, 2006.

PUNCH mission;

- → NASA's PUNCH mission (2025) revealed solar wind dynamics. PUNCH stands for Polarimeter to Unify the Corona and Heliosphere. It studies the solar corona and solar wind as a single, connected system.
- → The mission captures detailed images of solar wind, making invisible phenomena visible. Solar wind consists of charged particles emitted from the Sun's outer atmosphere.
- → PUNCH operates during the ongoing solar maximum, a phase of high solar activity. This phase includes increased sunspots, solar flares, and coronal mass ejections. The mission helps improve forecasting of space weather and its effects on Earth.
